To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rome we respectfully submit the following report:

At the close of another year it gives us pleasure to report the several expenditures incidental to maintaining our schools for the past year. We have maintained a school year of thirty-one weeks in all schools with the exception of the Robbins and Blaisdell schools. In the Robbins school a term of nine weeks is about to commence and in the Blaisdell they have two weeks more due. This school was obliged to close on account of the smallpox situation.

It will be noticed that our Belgrade bill seems rather large, but the reason for this is the fact that a school year of thirty-five weeks has been maintained, and as we are in a union with this town we have to pay our proportional amount, which gives our pupils in that town four weeks more than we maintain.

At the last annual meeting we appropriated the sum of two hundred dollars for repairing the schoolhouse at Belgrade, but it was found that on account of the high cost of material it was not advisable to build last year, so equipment was purchased for a temporary building, and we have paid our proportionate part.

The Long Pond school has had new seats and repairs have been made and this is a very neat and comfortable building. The only pressing need here is for blackboards and that holds true of all schoolhouses in town and should be corrected at once, as no teacher can do justice without sufficient blackboard space. New seats have been ordered for the Blaisdell school and are now on the way. These are to be paid for from the Equalization Fund.

At the June examinations seven candidates successfully passed the State examination, and six have entered High School. I feel that we should look with pride upon the work our pupils are doing in High School. They are maintaining a high standard in their work and are completing their work in the allotted time.

We go into a union of towns this next year, and I would respectfully recommend that the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars be appropriated to meet this demand. I would recommend one hundred and fifty dollars for repairs on schoolhouses, two hundred dollars for High School work, fifty dollars for school books, and one thousand dollars for common schools.

In general the teachers have done good work and have given good satisfaction. We have got to pay more for teachers as they can get more in other towns.

We should encourage our pupils to a more faithful attendance at school as the school life is short at the best and an education is an asset that can not be appraised too highly.

I wish to thank all who have assisted me in the year's work, and wish a large measure of success for our schools in the years to come.

# Warrant for Town Meeting

To Ralph Witham, a Constable in the Town of Rome, in the County of Kennebec, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Rome, qualified to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House, in said Town, on the 4th day of March, A. - Article 5.—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the State road, and how much.
- Article 6.—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the maintenance of State road.
- Article 7.—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to pay outstanding orders.
- Article 8.—To see if the Town will vote to raise \$200.00 for the Oliver and Higgins road.
- Article 9.—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to complete the Foss Hill road, and how much.
- Article 10.—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the care of the cemetery.
- Article 11.—To see how the taxes shall be collected, and when payable.
- Article 12.—To see if the Town will vote not to have any shows or dances in the new Town Hall.

- Article 13.—To see if the Town will vote to pay David French the balance due on the Town Hall, and raise money for the same.
- Article 14.—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the improvements on Town Hall lot.
- Article 15.—To see if the Town will vote to accept the bill of Dr. O. B. Head for vaccination, and raise money for the same.
- Article 16.—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for patrol work.
- Article 17.—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the Supervisor of Schools.
- Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$200.00 to be laid out on the Long Pond road leading from the Whittier to the Prescott Corner, so-called.
- Article 19.—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to pay Sanford Blaisdell for Crossing field, and how much.
  - Article 20.—To transact any other business relative to the above that may come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the Town Hall, in said Town of Rome. at nine o'clock in the forenoon, on the day of said meeting, for the purpose of correcting and revising the check list.
