### Warrant

STATE OF MAINE

KENNEBEC, SS.

To Ralph Witham, a Constable of the Town of Rome in the County of Kennebec,

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Rome, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town House in said town on Monday, March third, A. D. 1924, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- ARTICLE 1. To choose a moderator to preside over said meeting.
- ART. 2. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- ART. 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of schools for the ensuing year.
- ART. 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs of school buildings.
- ART. 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote for school books.
- ART. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of poor.
- ART. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the payment of the salary of the Superintendent of schools.
- ART. 8 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for tuition of scholars attending High School, for ensuing year.

- ART. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repairs on roads and bridges for ensuing year.
- ART. 10. To see what sum of money the town will raise for breaking snow.
- ART. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay town officers for ensuing year.
- ART. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the payment of miscellaneous orders.
- ART. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the State Aid road, and how much.
- ART. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to complete the road from Elen Foss to the old Foss Hill road, so called.
- ART. 15. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to pay for land damage on the Foss Road, and how much.
- ART. 16. To see if the town will vote to grant the use of the Town Hall to the Grange, for the ensuing year.
- ART. 17. To see what the town wishes to do about letting the Town Hall, the ensuing year.
- ART. 18. To see if the town will vote to accept the Jurors chosen by the Selectmen and Treasurer.
- ART. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for toilet facilities, and how much.
- ART. 20. To see if the town will vote to lay out five per cent. of their taxes on the roads to the non-resident cottages, which they occupy, by automobiles or teams, where they are away from main road, to be expended by road commissioner as he sees fit.
- ART. 21. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire money for any deficiency.

- ART. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for insurance on Town Hall, which expired Jan. 1924. And for schoolhouses. Amount estimated \$125.00.
- ART. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for Patrol work, and how much.
- ART. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for maintenance of State road.
- ART. 25. To see if the town will vote to let breaking snow roads to the lowest bidder, on the following roads, Wm. Mosher to the Meadow Stream bridge, Jamaica Point to Meadow Stream bridge by Lester Brown's, and road by Foss brothers' to Abbie Foster's. Same from March 4, 1924 to next March meeting, also to be broken with triangle or dragon.
- ART. 26. To see if the town will raise a sum of money to pay outstanding orders.
- ART. 27. To see if the town will raise a sum of money for the care of cemeteries, and how much.
- ART. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to repair the road from Barton Richardson's to J. L. Bushey's.
- ART. 29. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to gravel the unfinished piece of State Aid road of 1922.
- ART. 30. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the Town Hall at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the 3d day of March, A. D. 1924.

# Common School Report

To the School Committee and Citizens of Rome:

I herewith submit my sixth annual report of the schools for the year ending Feb. 20, 1924.

This has been a profitable year in many respects, in that in most of the schools there has been an especial interest shown in the work by the teachers — pupils have been in regular attendance and parents and citizens have contributed to the success of the schools.

Quite a little work has been done along social lines and this has had its effect on both teacher and pupils. A community dinner was given at the Dudley school. This was well attended and a good time enjoyed by all. The middle of the fall term a social was held at Bert Mosher's, the program for which was planned by the parents of the district:

The Blaisdell and Whittier schools united in giving an entertainment at Christmas time. A well arranged program was carried out and this event was much appreciated by those in that neighborhood. But one teacher's meeting has been held so far but we hope to carry along a regular program of social work at the beginning of the spring term.

While this work which I have mentioned may seem of small value to some, a little social work mixed into the school work from time to time has a strong tendency to create harmony and good will among the people of a district. A spirit of cooperation on the part of the parents and pupils is a vital factor in the success of any school.

At the end of the fall term the Robbins school was closed, because of whooping cough. This school is small and the absence of a few pupils would bring the average below eight. Therefore in justice to the pupils and to the school I deemed it wise to close the school for five weeks. However, the school will re-open Feb. 14 and all time lost will be made up.

A word in regard to our teaching force. We have been obliged to employ local teachers because of the small wages paid. These local teachers have rendered a valuable service to the town and in most districts there is a splendid spirit of cooperation of the parents.

Your local teachers are in many respects superior to the outside teacher who is generally young and inexperienced.

Nevertheless in some instances it would seem for the best interest of the district to hire a teacher from out of town even though it costs a little more. Small differences often arise among parents and pupils in a district and it is very hard for a local teacher to remain neutral in the matter. To take sides one way or the other brings on trouble which is far reaching in its effect.

I have tried to place my teachers this year so that all friction might be avoided but in this I have not been wholly successful.

The matter of consolidation should be discussed again this year. The Long Pond school which was opened by vote of the town at the last annual meeting has again finished the year with an average below eight pupils. The Kiely children have moved away and the Cox children will move before the beginning of the spring term. This leaves only three Littlefield children as pupils in this district. Provisions must be made to convey these children either to Belgrade Lakes, Mt. Vernon or Rome Corner.

Outside of the Dudley school but two teachers would be needed to handle the pupils in the other four districts, providing a central two room school was erected. Such a building located in the neighborhood of Rome Corner would be well situated for conveyance from these districts.

Taking into consideration the condition of our present school buildings and the fact that new toilets must be installed in all the schools before 1927, it would seem a matter of good business to give this matter of consolidation more than a passing thought.

A two room building large enough to accommodate our pupils should be constructed for about five thousand dollars. And such a building would serve the town for a good many years. The saving made in equipment, repairs, cost of heating, would more than pay the interest on this investment. Such a building completed would settle all questions of standardization and relieve the town of this yearly expense of repair and improvement.

Two teams, one from the Robbins district and one from the Hersom and Blaisdell districts, and possibly a team from back of Long

Pond, would solve the problem of conveyance and these three teams would cost no more than the three teachers discontinued.

You will note that there is a balance in favor of the town on the common school account, but we were obliged to close the Robbins and the Dudley schools short of the required thirty weeks and when this time is made up there will be but a small balance in favor of the town. In making my recommendations for the year I have based my estimate on \$15 per week as wages for the teachers. The matter of installing new toilets must be completed before 1927, thus I have recommended an appropriation for this account. Following are my recommendations:
