Common School Report

To the Members of the School Committee of Rome:

I hereby submit my seventh annual report of the schools for the year ending Feb. 20, 1925.

In looking back over the year I believe that on the whole very good work has been done in all the schools, and a spirit of harmony and good will has been maintained among teachers, parents and pupils. Whenever signs of friction have appeared, these difficulties have been avoided and we have tried to give the parents and pupils a square deal.

The work in the Dudley School, which was somewhat disorganized at the beginning of the year has been brought up to the standard by Mr. Wilde and this school now is one of the best working schools in town. At the Robbins School, Miss Louise Tibbetts, who took the place left vacant by Mrs. Mueise, has done fine work and I believe has won the hearts of both pupil and parent. Mrs. Frances Watson at the Whittier School and Mrs. LeBaron at the Blaisdell School are both teachers of long experience and training and the town is fortunate in being able to hire such teachers at the price paid. At the Hersom School, Mrs. Lottie Brown and Miss Velma Bacon have accomplished much and although this school is small the same interest has been shown by the teachers.

One thing that is needed in the rural sections today more than anything else is a closer coöperation between the community and the school. The success of the school is often determined by the attitude of the community toward it. If the policy followed by any community is one of destructive criticism and fault finding, we are pretty sure to have a poor term of school, a discouraged teacher and a disloyal class of pupils. On the other hand coöperation on the part of the community and a determination to make the best out of what is at hand will result in a good school and a higher standard of pupils.

In many sections of the state, parents and citizens are forming organizations for the purpose of supporting the teacher and the school.

Wherever we find these agents at work better schools and better school conditions exist. The School and the Home must be cooperative and a spirit of harmony must exist between them.

The responsibility of the school rests quite as much upon the community as upon the teacher and school officials. Adequate buildings, proper sanitation, lighting and heating, teachers' wages, means and kinds of conveyances are community problems. These problems should be carefully considered in the home and provisions made at the annual town meeting to meet the needs of the schools. If this is done many of the difficulties which arise later in the year will be avoided. Sometimes school officials and teachers are negligent in their duties but quite as often the school fails, because the community has failed to do its part.

In the matter of repairs I would suggest that a special appropriation be made for new seats at the Dudley School. Last year considerable work was done on this building, but the wooden benches still remain, relics of the olden days. These seats are so high that none of the small children can reach the floor with their feet and the tops are carved and broken so that it is impossible to use them in the written work. A good adjustable chair and desk costs about \$12 each, thus twenty seats, the number needed will cost approximately \$250.

One or two of the school buildings were painted on the outside this year, and three others are in great need of outside paint. If this work is left longer it means more expense.

A law was passed at the last Legislature which provides that towns must install suitable closets in every school house before 1927. The cost of this installation is about \$300 per school. We now have but two years to do this work and four sets of closets must be completed. Would it not be well to make a substantial beginning on the work this year?

In the matter of text-books and supplies the town raised last year but \$50. This is an average of \$10 per school. Fortunately the state requires us to furnish sufficient text-books, and the parents request that certain supplies be furnished, so I have not hesitated to spend what has actually been needed on this account. It would be better if the town would give some consideration to this matter and raise what is recommended and is necessary for the account. If this is done a year's supply of books and paper can be bought at once and the work of the schools is not interrupted.

The Long Pond School was closed in the spring by vote of the town and the children in this district have been conveyed to Mt. Vernon, by your committee. This is a direct saving to the town and is the best arrangement to be made for the pupils in that district.

In my report I have included a list of the schools and the registration in each, so that the town may judge whether or not other schools should be closed for the coming year.

TEACHERS' WAGES

The average rural wage in Maine is about \$800 per year. This town is paying a little more than half this sum or \$450. We hire many local teachers who work for a low price simply because they are unable to go away from home. There is no question but these teachers are worth much more than they receive. When the local teachers fail in numbers we are not able to fill their places at the local price. Hence we must either pay more than the local price or accept an inexperienced girl for the position. Generally we are forced to do the latter and this is the reason that often times the new teacher is not satisfactory. The only way to remedy this defect is to pay all teachers the going wage which is considerable in excess of \$15 per week.

In the industrial unions there may be features which are objectionable, but the principle of equality of wage and a wage sufficient to allow a man or woman to enjoy the benefits of life are highly commendable, and certainly every teacher is worthy of a remuneration commensurate with the service rendered.

Average wages will produce average standards whether in the school world or in the industrial world.

Town Warrant

To Ralph Witham, a Constable in the Town of Rome in the County of Kennebec, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Rome, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town House in said town on Monday, the second day of March, A. - ART. 9. To see what sum of money the town will raise for repair of schoolhouses for the ensuing year.
- ART. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the payment of the salary of the Superintendent of schools.
- ART. 11. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of poor.
- ART. 12. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the building and repair of roads and bridges.
- ART. 13. To see what sum of money the town will raise for breaking snow roads.
- ART. 14. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the payment of miscellaneous orders.
- ART. 15. To see what sum of money the town will raise for patrol work.
- ART. 16. To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay town officers for the ensuing year.
- ART. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State Aid road.
- ART. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for maintenance of the State Aid road.
- ART. 19. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire money for any deficiency.
 - ART. 20. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the care of cemeteries.
- ART. 21. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions, under the provisions of Chapter Four, Section Fifty-nine, of

the Revised Statutes of Maine, the same to be expended by the Maine Development Association.

- ART. 22. To see what the town wishes to do about letting the Town Hall for ensuing year.
- ART. 23. To see if the town will vote to grant the use of the Town Hall to the Grange for the ensuing year.
- ART. 24. To see if the town will raise \$200.00 towards the maintenance of the Belgrade Lakes Fire truck, or take any other action under this article.
- ART. 25. To see if the town will raise \$250.00 to repair road from Trout Brook bridge by Ira Wentworth's to the 3rd Class Road, so called.
- ART. 26. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road beginning near the residence of W. E. Mosher known as the Foss hill road to the house of Fred Hartford and the house occupied by Joseph Blanchette.
- ART. 27. To see if the town will vote to raise \$50.00 to repair road from David Nickerson's to the main road.
- ART. 28. To see if the town will vote to lay out five per cent. of their taxes on the roads to the non-resident cottages, which they occupy, by automobiles or teams, where they are away from main road, to be expended by road commissioner as he sees fit.
