# School Report

FEB. 20, 1927

To the School Committee and Citizens of Rome:

I herewith submit my ninth annual report of the schools for the year ending Feb. 20, 1927.

The year has closed after thirty-one weeks of school session, and the progress and standard of the work on the whole has been very satisfactory. There has been no friction in the several districts and this in itself is conducive to the best interests of the pupils. There has been very little sickness and the attendance has been as good or better than last year.

In three of the districts the same teachers have had charge of the work for the year. In the Robbins school, however, Miss Jessie Curtis resigned in June and at the beginning of the fall term Miss Delia Rogers was engaged. Miss Rogers was with us but three weeks when she was called home by a death in the family. Mrs. Louise Moulton was then engaged to finish out the year. While each teacher in charge of this school has done her best to maintain the standard set by the other schools, much better work would have been accomplished had there been no interruption in the teaching force. Mrs. Moulton has done splendid work and I sincerely hope that she may be retained for the remainder of the year.

We are sending to the secondary schools in the surrounding towns some ten or twelve pupils, a large number when we consider the school registration, and there seems to be a growing interest along this line. This is a very encouraging outlook for the time is at hand when a boy or a girl must have at least a high school education before he can expect to compete for a position in the business or industrial world. The commercial and industrial world today is based on skilled and expert labor and there is practically no employment to be had, which provides a living wage, that does not require education and skill. Therefore any movement that the town may make, or any encouragement that the home or the citizens may

contribute to help boys and girls to obtain this education will be in the performance of a duty which we owe to the younger generation.

#### REPAIRS

Under the present law governing school toilets, the town has until Sept. 1, 1927 to complete this work, after which date the State school funds may be withheld until the work is completed. Since the law was passed the matter has been brought to your attention in each report.

This year the committee voted to build a woodshed and standard closets at the Blaisdell school. This work has been completed with the exception of the vaults, which will be constructed as soon as the frost goes out of the ground.

Toilets both in the Whittier and Robbins schools should be provided for the coming year. The sheds in these districts are worthless as such but these buildings can be torn down and the lumber used in the new construction. The approximate cost in each case will be \$300 each, and it would seem wise to attend to this matter at the annual meeting.

At a meeting of the committee in the spring a tentative vote was taken to the effect that each member of the committee should receive fifteen dollars for his services for the year. This shows the attitude and feeling of the committee and brings very forcibly to mind the question as to whether we should ask our committee to give of the time, strength and money to matters of such importance without a reasonable compensation. A committee must meet three or four times during the year to make regular arrangements for the schools, emergencies arise when it is necessary to call the members from their work, the matter of repairs and insurance and wood is in their hands, all of which demand more or less of their time and attention. Therefore it would seem only just (if you wish the best to serve) to pay for this service and not depend on a man's generosity or goodwill. In all cases is "The laborer worthy of his hire."


### FOR TOWN MEETING, MARCH 7, 1927

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for breaking of snow roads. ART. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the repair of roads and bridges. ART. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise 600 for maintenance of Patrol roads. ART. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote and maise 3 for State Aid road. 25001 ART. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for maintenance of State Aid road. ART. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for payment of Miscellaneous Orders.
- ART. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- ART. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to be expended and used for advertising the resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.
- ART. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for care of Cemeteries.

- ART. 23. To see if the town will grant to the Grange the use of the Town Hall for the ensuing year.
- ART. 24. To see if the town will raise \$100 towards the maintenance of the Belgrade Lakes Fire truck, or take any other action under this article.
- ART. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to repair the road from Arthur Hetherington's Lane to Russell Stevens'.
- ART. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to repair the Long Pond road.
- ART. 27. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for a cemetery vault.
- ART. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise \$100 to repair the road from the LeBaron Corner to Leon Watson's.
- ART. 29. To see what action the town will take in regard to the following petition of E. A. Bean: To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to lay out a road to my cottages on Great Lake.
