Rome School Report

1927-1928

To the School Committee and Citizens of Rome:

I hereby submit my tenth annual report of the schools for the year ending Feb. 20, 1928..

Four schools have been maintained for the year, viz: the Whittier, Blaisdell, Robbins and Dudley Schools. The length of the school year has been thirty weeks and the same teachers have completed the year's work in only one school. During the spring term, Ermine Blaisdell taught the Whittier school, Mrs. George LeBaron the Blaisdell school, Louisa Moulton the Robbins school and Arthur Wilde the Dudley school. At the beginning of the fall term Lucie Burrill of Canaan was engaged for the Whittier school, Ermine Blaisdell was transferred to the Blaisdell district and Miss Vivian Brown was hired at the Robbins.

There has been very little sickness in the schools. The weather has been very favorable for a good attendance, but notwithstanding this there have been too many absences. The best results cannot be obtained at school unless there is a full attendance every day. Often times parents complain of the scholastic standing of a school, when their own children, by repeated absences, are to a large degree responsible for the low standard.

The standard course of study requires a thirty-six weeks' school year to complete the work. The law, however, requires the town to hold school in session but thirty weeks. In such a system there is a direct loss of six weeks of schooling to the pupil. Such a course over a period of eight years, run behind the standard, one year and one-third. In other words, when a child has finished the work in a thirty week system such a child would be rated only as a sixth grade pupil in a system of thirty-six weeks.

A bill was introduced into the last Legislature, that would have made the school year thirty-six weeks in length, and uniform throughout the State, but this bill was not passed. It is, therefore, up to the town itself to provide for this increase.

In order that Rome might enjoy this school privilege, which is recognized as standard by a majority of the towns of the State, it would be necessary for the town to raise an additional school fund of \$375, a small amount when we consider that it will give six weeks' additional schooling to all the children in town.

REPAIRS

During the year much repair work has been done in the several districts. At the Whittier and the Robbins schools, new sheds have been built complete, and standard closets installed. Cement vaults were built at the Blaisdell school, thus completing this project as the new shed and wood house was built one year ago. In order to complete all the work of installing new toilets, in all the schools as required by law, it will be necessary to provide cement vaults and proper vents at the Dudley school. This is a small matter and will be attended to as soon as the frost is out of the ground.

Notwithstanding the fact that we have done considerable work on our school buildings during the past years, the buildings are now far from being in good repair. At the Robbins school the ceiling is in very, very poor condition. In cold weather it is almost impossible to warm this room, because of the cracks in the ceiling which allow much of the heat to escape. All of the school buildings need more or less paint and varnish on the inside, and most of the buildings need to be painted on the outside. The seats at the Blaisdell school are of the double stationary type while those at the Whittier school are of the single stationary type, both of which have been in the schools for a period of years and should be discarded for the modern adjustable type of desk.

To put our schools in good repair, would cost approximately the sum of \$2,000. It is not necessary to raise this sum in any one year, but if the town would appropriate the sum of \$500 for repairs, for a few years, and apply same to providing these improvements which I have mentioned above, in the course of a few years all the buildings

would be in good repair and this would add a great deal to the comfort of the pupils, the efficiency of the schools, and be a source of pride to the citizens of the town.

HIGH SCHOOL TUITION

The tuition of high school pupils up to this year was set at sixty dollars annually per pupil, and a town not supporting a free high school was obligated to pay this amount.

At the last Legislature a law was enacted whereby the town not supporting a free high school is obliged to pay high school tuition, per pupil annually an amount not to exceed \$100. The amount of tuition charged by the respective secondary schools, is now based upon the cost of schooling, per pupil, for the year preceding. Many of the smaller schools have not as yet advanced their tuition, but some of the larger institutions are already charging the limit of \$100. Hence this is why in the report some schools show a higher tuition charge than others.

The cost of tuition is bound to increase as the cost of maintaining the high school increases, and the recommendation for this tuition, therefore, is simply an estimate of what in the opinion of the superintendent will be the cost of high school tuition for the coming year.

WARRANT

FOR TOWN MEETING, MARCH 5TH, 1928

*To A. D. Wilde, a Constable in the Town of Rome, in the County of
Kennebec,* GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Rome, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet at the Town House on Monday, the fifth day of March, 1928, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

ART. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

ART. 3. To choose selectmen, assessors, and overseers of poor.

ART. 4. To choose a member of the school committee.

ART. 5. To choose a road commissioner.

ART. 6. To choose a treasurer, collector of taxes and all other town officers required by law to be chosen at said meeting.

ART. 7. To see if the town will grant to the Grange the use of the Town Hall for the ensuing year.

ART. 8. To see what action the town will take in regard to letting the Town Hall for the ensuing year.

ART. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for common schools.

ART. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for purchase of text-books and supplies.

ART. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for repairs on school buildings.

ART. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for tuition of scholars attending High school.

ART. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay Superintendent of Schools.

ART. 14. To see what sum of money town will vote and raise for support of poor.

ART. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for breaking snow roads.

ART. 16. To see what sum of money town will vote and raise for repair of roads and bridges.

ART. 17. To see what sum of money town will vote and raise for maintenance of patrolled roads.

ART. 18. To see what sum of money town will vote and raise for State Aid road.

ART. 19. To see what sum of money town will vote and raise for payment of miscellaneous orders.

ART. 20. To see what sum of money town will vote and raise to pay town officers for ensuing year.

ART. 21. To see what sum of money town will vote and raise for care of cemeteries.

ART. 22. To see what sum of money town will vote and raise for maintenance of State Aid road.

ART. 23. To see if the town will vote and raise \$800 to be expended on Ira Wentworth road, \$300 of it to be expended from Ira Wentworth's house in a southwesterly direction, and the remaining \$500 from Ira Wentworth's house toward the Hersom school.

ART. 24. To see if the town will vote and raise a sum of money and how much to be expended in repairing road from foot of Hoyt Hill to Jamaica Point Farm.

ART. 25. To see if town will vote and raise a sum of money to repair road from Arthur Hetherington's Lane over Worcester Hill.

ART. 26. To see if town will vote and raise a sum of money to repair road leading from State Aid road to Sewall Tracy's.

ART. 27. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of three hundred dollars to be expended in carting gravel on road from Richardson's Corner to Foster's Corner.

ART. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages, and attractions of the State of Maine.

ART. 29. To see if the town will raise \$50 towards maintenance of the Belgrade Lakes fire truck, or take any other action under this article.

ART. 30. To see what action the town wishes to take in regard to the following petition of E. A. Bean, to wit: To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen of Rome to lay out a right of way from my camp situated on Great Lake, across the lands of Miss Edith Merrill, H. M. Adams, C. L. Dennis, Herbert Mosely and James Mosher to the County road leading from Belgrade Lakes to Rome Corner, I to assume all cost.

ART. 31. To see if the town will vote to erect a tool shed on site of old Town Hall.

ART. 32. To see if town will vote to have all the unpaid taxes of previous years settled by Oct. 1, 1928.

ART. 33. To see if the town will vote to pay \$3.50 per day for labor on highway.

ART. 34. To see if the town will vote to authorize Selectmen and Treasurer to hire money until taxes are available.

ART. 35. To see if town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to lay out a right of way from Perkins Farm on Hoyt Hill to State road on Sand Hill, crossing land of G. D. Mosher & Son, and Varney Mosher.

ART. 36. To see if the town will vote to charge 6% interest on all taxes unpaid September first, 1928.

ART. 37. To see if the town will vote to employ a timekeeper on roads and elect same.

ART. 38. To see if town will vote to accept list of jurors prepared by selectmen, clerk and treasurer.

ART. 39. To see if the town will vote to widen road from Levi LeBaron's turn, so called, to the ledges on top of the hill and raise sufficient money to pay for same.

ART. 40. To see if the town will vote and raise \$1,000 to pay one note at Peoples National Bank.

ART. 41. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
