

THE WARRANT.

To E. S. CYPHERS, a Constable of the town of Searsport, in the County of Waldo, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Searsport, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House in said town on Monday the 8th day of March, instant, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:—

1st. To choose a Moderator to preside at said

meeting.

and. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

3rd. To see if the town will accept the report of the Selectmen as printed.

4th. To see if the town will accept the report of the

Auditor of Town Accounts as printed.

5th. To see if the town will accept the report of the Superintending School Committee as printed.

6th. To choose three or more Selectmen.

7th. To choose Assessors of Taxes.

8th. To choose Overseers of the Poor.

9th. To choose a Town Agent.

10th. To choose a Town Treasurer.

11th. To choose an Auditor of Town Accounts.

12th-23rd. To choose other Town Officers.

24th. To see if the town will continue the Free High School, and how much money it will raise therefor.

25th. To see how much money the town will raise for the support of schools.

26th. To see how much money the town will raise to buy text books for town schools.

27th. To choose members of the Superintending School Committee to fill vacancies caused by

expiration of term of service.

28th. To see if the town will authorize the Superintending School Committee to choose a Superintendent outside of their own number, if they so desire.

29th. To see how much money the town will raise for the support of the poor and other town ex-

penses.

30th. To see how much money the town will raise to repair highways, and whether in labor or money; and if in labor, how much per hour for men, oxen and horses.

31st. To see if the town will instruct the Selectmen to pay no bills against the town as long as the parties are indebted to the town for taxes.

32nd. To see how much money the town will raise

to buy books for the Sears Library.

33rd. To see if the town will raise \$40 for a Memorial service.

34th. To hear the report of the Fire Department.

of Phineas Pendleton Engine Company and Fire Wards \$3 each, not to exceed sixty-three members; said money being payable to the Clerk of the Engine Co. in a gross sum on or before Jan. 1st, 1898.

36th. To see how much money the town will vote to pay members of Penobscot Engine Co. No. 1 for the ensuing year; said sum to be paid to the Clerk of the Co. on or before Jan. 1, 1898.

37th. To see what discount the town will allow to those who pay their taxes on or before the first day of July, next, and how much to those who

pay on or before the first day of January, 1898. 38th. To see how much discount the town will allow those who pay their highway taxes on or before the first day of June, next, in cash to the Highway Surveyors or Town Treasurer.

39th. To see how much money the town will raise

to pay discount on taxes.

40th. To see if the town will let the road repairing and breaking to the lowest bidders.

41st. To see how much money the town will raise to repair school houses.

42nd. To see how much money the town will raise to pay for road breaking the past winter.

grd. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to sell the unused school houses.

- 44th. To see if the town will vote to use the fund in the Belfast Bank left from the sale of the Poor Farm toward paying the indebtedness of the town.
- 45th. To see if the town will build a sewer connecting with the one at the corner of George F. Smith's store, leading in front of the Merithew and Gordon block to the corner of store occupied by the Post Office, or to connect with the sewer leading from Bay View Street and running into the cellar of the Post Office.

46th. To see if the town will permit the Post G. A. R. to remove a portion of the granite shaft on Soldiers' monument, purchase and place thereon a white bronze statue, all without ex-

pense to the town.

47th. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to pay George B. Putnam for injuries sustained by his wife on the sidewalk, in the summer of 1896.

48th. To choose a Collector of Taxes.

49th. To see how much money the town will raise to place guideboards on the road corners where needed.

50th. To see if the town will annex school district No. 10 in Searsport to school district No. 9, or divide district No. 10 and annex a part of it to school district No. 8, and divide school district No. 9 and annex a part of it to school district No. 8, and establish the lines to mark said alterations in said districts as the town may vote to make.

51st. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to pay the indebtedness of the town.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at their office on Saturday the 6th day of March, instant, at 1 o'clock in the afternoon, for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters.

REPORT.

—OF THE—

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS,

OF THE

TOWN OF SEARSPORT,

FOR THE YEAR ENDING FEB .27, 1897.

UNION DISTRICT.

The Free High School for the past school year has been taught by Mr. Frank H. Mead, a graduate of Bowdoin College. He possesses many of the qualifications of the ideal teacher; has labored hard and faithfully for the good of his school, and has ever had in mind the best interests of his pupils. By his methods as a teacher, and his gentlemanly conduct as a citizen he has won the love and respect of all who know him.

We believe the pupils of this school are entitled to much credit for their work the past year, and could they be urged on and up with modern methods for a time we feel that we could have a school, and course of study that would compare favorably with any school in the state of corresponding grade. We find on examining the school reports for a term of years previous to the report of 1896, that each one makes some reference to a course of study. No such reference is made in the report of 1896, nor have we been able to find traces of a course of study; therefore we are led to think and compelled to believe that sometime during the year previous to Feb. 29, 1896, such course of study was ignored and abandoned much to the detriment of said school.

The Principal of the High School and the Superintendent have worked together this year to classify and organize the High School so that in the near future we hope to have a course of study, and a school up to modern times and principles of education, and a credit to the town.

The Grammar School, taught by Mrs. Emma F. Davis, is one in which even the most casual observer cannot fail to notice the good-will, devotion, and love existing between teacher and pupils; and the grade of work and advancement is all that could be expected considering their age and the chance that the great majority have up to the time they enter this school.

The Intermediate School, during the past year, has been taught by Miss Lillian G. Runnells. The scholars in this school have been faithful in attendance, and tried their best to do the work assigned them by their teacher. The scholars of this grade are of an age when their minds are easily susceptible of an impression which quickly becomes permanent. This grade should

have the best instruction that an experienced and well trained teacher can

The Primary school was taught by Miss Desire Nichols, a teacher who has the advantage of having a training school preparation for the chosen work, and of having passed a successful experience. The pupils of this grade are of such an age that great skill and patience are required of the teacher. We call the school a success and believe Miss Nichols to be the right teacher in the right place.

DISTRICT NO. 1.

This school was taught the past year, by Miss Minnie E. Kelbert. scholars have been faithful in attendance, obedient, and devoted to their The scholars and parents in this district make it especially pleasant for the teacher, and I congratulate the next teacher on her pleasant surroundings.

DISTRICT NO. 2.

This school, taught by Mrs. Mary R. Perkins, has been small, but the scholars that have been in attendance have done good work. We consider Mrs. Perkins' experience sufficient guarantee of good work so that no eulogism is needed from us. We are of the opinion that the school should have been, and should be discontinued, and the scholars transported to other

schools. DISTRICT NO. 7.

Miss Katherine Kneeland is too well known as a teacher in this school to need words of praise. The school is not large, so the teacher has been able to give a great deal of attention to each pupil, and the advancement of all has been good. Miss Kneeland should have a larger and more advanced school, where she would have a better chance to put into use her skill as a teacher.

DISTRICT NO. 8.

Mrs. Abbie M. Nickels has had charge of this school during the entire past school year. On becoming Superintendent last March, and having been out of the schools of the state of Maine for about ten years, I tried to make myself familiar with the schools of Searsport by reading former school

reports, and in particular the one printed in the spring of 1895.

After reading the report of this district I visited the school with many After a somewhat extended visit I was not able to see that, misgivings. "The pupils shirked study," that, "The pupils evidently have never learned how to prepare a lesson," nor that "The larger boys are backward." All of the above quotations, therefore, seem to me to be a gross libel on the teacher and pupils, and an insult to the parents.

On the other hand, we found the teacher very pleasant and happy in her work; the pupils obedient and diligent in their studies. At the beginning of the fall term we found six in this school prepared to enter our High school at the village. Four of said six pupils came to the High School, and were a credit to themselves and to their former teacher. Good work has been

done in this school.

DISTRICT NO. 9.

Miss Carrie G. Closson has now taught six terms in this school At the beginning of the past school year we were able to hear only good reports of her work for the previous year; therefore she was re-elected for the year, as were all the other lady teachers in town. Near the latter part of November a petition was received addressed to the school committee, asking for "A change in the teacher for the winter term of school." No reason was given for such a request. On December 4, at the new school house at North Searsport, a meeting of the citizens interested, and the school committee was held. At this meeting no one made charges against Miss Closson of a nature to warrant her dismissal. After an extended hearing the committee came to the following conclusion:

We, the undersigned members of the school committee, at a meeting of the committee held to investigate charges against Miss Closson, Do not find charges sustained, and vote to retain her as teacher for the winter term of

school in the new house at North Searsport.

Miss Closson taught the winter term and the scholars that attended made good progress. We could not recommend Miss Closson for the school again, but in a school where no personal feeling, or antagonism to her existed, she could do good work, as she is faithful, well educated, ambitious, and has the correct principles and deportment of a successful teacher.

IMPROVEMENTS AND REPAIRS.

During the past year a new school house has been built at North Searsport. The construction and material was let on contract. A good and workman-like job was done throughout, and, with proper care, will last for many years. The coming spring the house should have another coat of paint, for at the present time the clapboards have but a coat of priming. The lot also needs grading.

Dist. No. 8. Owing to the nature of the soil where this building is located, it is exposed to much damage by frost. The lot is very wet. The heaving of the building had damaged the ceiling to such an extent that it was decided best to sheathe the entire walls of the schoolroom. The roof has also been newly shingled. New paint is needed the coming spring.

Dist. No. 7. This building should be sheathed inside, as the walls are now in a very bad condition. The roof is in good condition, having been

shingled the past year.

Union Dist. The north wall was examined by an expert, who pronounced it safe, but suggested that repairing the underpinning would save it from further damage. The underpinning has been repaired. The school rooms in this building look very unattractive for the want of paint.

FINANCIAL CONDITION.

At March town meeting, 1896, amt. of school fund unexpended, \$ 51.73 860.00

Total, \$911.73

Bills contracted in 1895 and paid in 1896 more than consumed the above amount so as a matter of fact there was nothing left over from 1895 to be used in 1896. It will be easy to see why our schools have been seven weeks less this year than the year before, when we bear in mind that the year before there was \$524 left from the year 1894, the amount raised was \$40 less

this year than in 1895, and that the mill tax available this school year was \$32 less, making a total, in round numbers, of \$594 less to use in the year of 1896 than was available in 1895. It has cost to pay nine teachers, \$84 per week, and at this rate the \$594 shortage easily explains why we have had to cut our schools short seven weeks.

We recommend the town to raise the following sums for the support of schools the ensuing year: For Free High School, \$500; for Common Schools, \$1500; Text Books, \$200; Rapairs, \$250.
