### TOWN WARRANT

Franklin SS. State of Maine

To Guy C. Robbins, a constable in the Town of Carthage in said County.

### Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Carthage qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at the Grange Hall Berry Mills in said town on the 4th day of March A.D. 1940 at ten o'clock in the forenour to act on the following articles to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- A.t. 3. To see if the town vote to accept the town reports of the municipal officers for the year ending Feb. 9, 1940.
- Art. 4. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year
- Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for support of common schools including tuition, text books and supplies, schoolhouse repairs, insurance, school office expense, high school tuition, and interest on school fund, including superintendence of schools.
- Art. 6. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for repair of summer roads and bridges.
- Art. 7. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for patrol fund.
- Art. 8. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for State Aid Roa 1 construction in addition to the amounts regularly raise 1 for the care of ways, highways and bridges under the Provisions of Section 19 C. 28 R.S. 1930 or under provisions of Section 3, C. 229 P.L. 1937.

- Art. 9. To see what sum if any the town would recommend to take from the Joint State Aid Account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State aid roads, in excess of the requirements of Section 2 C. 132, P.L. 1935.
- Art. 10. To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of three hundred and sixty five dollars (\$365) for the maintenance of the improved section of the third class roads to be used in conjunction with the State apportionment of the construction of the third class roads.
- Art. 11. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for State aid tools.
- Art. 12. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for the purpose of plowing and sanding winter roads on route # 142-2.
- Art. 13. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for winter roads.
- Art. 14. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for cutting bushes on routes 2-142.
- Art. 15. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for care of the poor.
- Art. 16. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for County Nurse services.
- Art. 17. To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$15.00 being dues for Maine Municipal Association.
- Art. 18. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for discount on taxes.
- Art. 19. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for overdrawn accounts.
- Art. 20. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for abatements.
- Art. 21. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for current expenses.
- Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to pay and refund its indebtness to the Rumford Falls Trust Co. by authorising the town Treasurer with the approval of the

Selectmen to issue and negotiate the note or notes of the town to the amount of said indebtedness, the number, terms and conditions of said note or notes to be determined by the Selectmen.

- Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to authorize the town Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen to hire such sums of money as may be necessary to pay town charges and town debts in anticipation of the collection of taxes and to issue and negotiate of the town for the money so borrowed to an amount not exceeding in the aggregate to the total tax levy for the preceding municipal year, as temporary loans to be paid during year 1940 out of said money raised during said year 1940 by taxes.
- Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to charge interest beginning December the first next on all taxes remaining unpaid at time of settlement in following February.
- Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to instruct the S. S. Committee to arrange the place and number of schools for the ensuing year to the best interest of the town.
- Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to give a discount of 3 per cent on the 1940 commitment poll taxes excepted paid on or before August 20, 1940.
- Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the services of the Cooperative Health Union health Officer and sanitary Engineer.
- Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions under the provisions of Chapter 5, S. 82, R. S. 1930, said sum to be expended under the direction of the State Maine Publicity Bureau.
- Art. 29. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for care of cemeteries.

- Art. 30. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for necessary bonds for Town Officers.
- Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for the nonpayment of taxes thereon on such terms as they deem advisable and to execute quit claim deeds for such property.
- Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money for the control of the Pine Blister Rust.
- Art. 33. To see if the town will authorize the Assessors to receive any amount appropriated by the Town for State Aid Highway Construction in excess of amount required to meet State apportionment.
- Art. 34. To see if the town will appropriate and raise a sum of money to grade the school yard at Berry Mills, and by whom to be expended.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session at the Grange Hall Berry Mills in said town at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting for revising and connecting the list of voters.

### SOUTH FRANKLIN COUNTY NURSING SERVICE

To the citizens of Carthage, I submit the twelfth annual report of the Nursing Service to cover a period from January 1, 1939 to January 1, 1940.

At the end of any period of service as we look backward, then forward, we realize that it is not the statistics which prove our worth. The citizens themselves do that, by showing that our teaching has resulted in a higher standard of health for the community.

The State found that semi-annual check-up on cars prevented accidents by finding defects before we were aware af them, and we have found that it is much less expensive and gives us more security to comply with this ruling, as well as having a habit of regularly changing oil, greasing, etc. Have you found that seeking your physician's advice about early symptoms rather than waiting until you are desperately ill has saved you an expensive, often losing fight? Better still are you having regular check-ups, and observing good health habits which we are told can easily prolong our lives ten years? Our aim is to give you advice and assistance which will enable you to live happier and more useful lives, and build for your children a foundation which will resist ravages of a strenuous life.

As in the past most of the time is spent in preventive work with children. Fifty-one have had routine school inspection and the following defects found: Teeth 32, throat 5, ears 1, eyes, vision 4, cross-eyed 1, infected lids 1, skin 2. We record 26 conferences with teachers, and with parents in regard to school. Children 27, preschool children 18, babies 9, and 9 visits to adults about their own health, prenatal visits 2, and 2 visits to mothers after baby's birth, 28 visits to interested persons regarding the work or in the interest of patients.

We feel that there has been considerably improvement in our dental program. Through the efforts of your teachers the children have visited the dentist at least once this year and many corrections have been made. Nineteen children received treatment at the free dental clinic at Farmington Hospital. These children also had a physical examination by the hospital physician, at Stickney's Corner, the whole school availing themselves of both examinations.

As we look backwards we realize that while we have progressed, it has been with no definite plan, but we look forward to, possibly, a meeting of parents, teachers, and nurse where a discussion of our problems and how they can best be met might result in a much more efficient use of our time, and thus be of more benefit to you.

The cordial welcome which the nurse always receives, and your efforts to cooperate, are appreciated.

1939 dealt very lightly with your town so far as acute communicable disease was concerned there being but four cases reported—two whooping cough, one mumps, and one of tetanus.

Nineteen were given toxoid to induce protection against diphtheria, three were Schicked to find if a previous toxoid had given immunity, 28 were vaccinated against smallpox, and nine tuberculin tested.

Sixty-one pupil inspections were made at request of the nurse, teachers, or parents.

Our sanitary engineer made seven trips to investigate nuisance and water supplies.
