To Guy C. Robbins, a Constable in the Town of Carthage in said County,

Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Carthage, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Grange Hall, Berry Mills, in said town on the 5th day of March, A. D. 1945, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the Town Reports of the Municipal Officers for the year ending February 15, 1945.
 - Art. 4. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for support of Common Schools, including Tuition, Text-books and Supplies, Schoolhouse Repairs, Insurance, School Office Expense, High School Tuition, and Interest on School Fund, including Superintendent of Schools.
- Art. 6. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for Repair of Summer Roads and Bridges.
- Art. 7. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for Patrol Fund.

- Art. 8. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for State Aid Road Construction, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways, and under the provisions of Section 19, C. 28, R. S. 1930, or under provisions of Section 3, C. 229, P. L. 1937.
- Art. 9. To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the Joint State Aid Account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid Roads, in excess of the requirements of Section 2, C. 132, P. L. 1935.
- Art. 10. To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$262.00 for the maintenance of the Improved Section of the Third Class roads, to be used in conjunction with the State Apportionment for the Construction of the Third Class Roads.
- Art. 11. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for State Aid road tools.
- Art. 12. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for the purpose of plowing and sanding Winter Roads on Routes 2, 142, State Aid No. 3.
- Art. 13. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for Winter Roads.
- Art. 14. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for Cutting Bushes on Routes 2, 142, State Aid No. 3.
- Art. 15. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for care of Poor.
- Art. 16. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for County Nurse services.
- of \$15.00, being dues for Maine Municipal Association.
- Art. 18. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for Discount on Taxes.

- Art. 19. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for Overdrawn Accounts.
- Art. 20. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for Abatements.
- Art. 21. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for Current Expense.
- Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to pay and refund its indebtedness to the Rumford Falls Trust Co. by authorizing the town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to issue and negotiate the note or notes of the town to the amount of said indebtedness, the number, terms, and conditions of said notes to be determined by the Selectmen.
- Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to hire such sums of money as may be necessary to pay town charges and town debts, in anticipation of the collection of taxes, and to issue and negotiate the note or notes of the town so borrowed to an amount not exceeding in the aggregate the total levy for the preceding municipal year, as temporary loans.
- Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to charge interest beginning December the first, next, on all taxes remaining unpaid at time of settlement in the following February.
- Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to instruct the S. S. Committee to arrange the place and number of schools for the ensuing year, to the best interest of the town.
- Art. 26. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise for advertising our Natural Resources, Advantages and Attractions, under the provisions of Chapter 5, S. 82, R. S. 1930, said sum to be expended under the direction of the State of Maine Publicity Bureau.
- Art. 27. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for the care of Cemeteries.

- Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to appropriate and raise for necessary Bonds for Town Officers.
- Art. 29... To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the town, to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable and to execute quit-claim deeds for such property.
- Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 to cooperate with the Maine Forest Service and the Federal Government in the control of White Blister Rust in accordance with the R. S., C. 11, Secs. 62, 63, 64.
- Art. 31. To see if the town will authorize the Assessors to recind any amount appropriated by the town for State Highway Construction in excess of the amount required to meet State apportionment.
- Art. 32. To see what rate per cent. and final date to be allowed on Discount of Taxes on the 1945 commitment, poll taxes excepted.
- Art. 33. To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$15.00 to hire a doctor to inspect the Carthage school children three times a year.
- Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to accept \$50.00 from Fannie Parker's will and have the Town Treasurer deposit same in bank as the J. P. Staples Fund.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session at the Grange Hall, Berry Mills, in said town, at 9.30 o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting, for revising and correcting the list of voters.





Report of Public Health Nurse

Report of the Nursing Service given to the Town of Carthage by the South Franklin County Tuberculosis and Health Association covering the period January 1, 1944 to January 1, 1945.

With the reorganization of the association this year came a need for the revision of By-laws, and a closer relationship to the public. Article V of the Constitution states, "There shall be a Public Relations Committee consisting of representatives chosen by various prominent civic, religious and social groups, and other organizations in the area served." Article III of the By-laws defines the duties as, "The Public Relations Committee shall meet quarterly with the Executive Committee. The duty of each member shall be to bring to the Association the attitudes, interests, and problems of the group he represents, and to give an intelligent interpretation of the program to his own group."

At the March meeting, Dr. Davidson of the Bureau of Health discussed the Tuberculosis Surveys being done in Maine. Mrs. Anderson spoke of the trends in public health nursing particularly in the schools, and the quarterly report of the nurse was given, followed by a general discussion. At the June meeting, a report of the Tuberculosis Institute held in Boston was given by Miss Bonsey, report of the Recreation Committee by Harold Collins, then Dr. McCloskey, United States Public Health Service, discussed the Venereal Disease problem in Maine, time being allowed for general discussion. The fall meeting was a report of the By-laws Committee by Mrs. Cushman. These were accepted after discussion. The Annual Meeting will be held in April and will be open to the membership. Membership consists of all persons who purchase Christmas Seals to the amount of \$1.00 or more, or contributed \$1.00 or more for the year. This Association is part of your Community and you can help most by being part of the Association and attending meetings.

PROGRAM

The outstanding feature of the year for Carthage was appropriating money for medical examinations in the schools. Instead of examining

only certain grades as was planned, Dr. Defoe generously offered to do the whole school population. If you wish to continue the practice of examining every child each year you should increase your appropriation.

There were 14 whose throats needed to be watched with the expectation that several will require operations by summer; 5 should consult their oculist for vision defects. The nurse has had 19 consultations with teachers and made 9 visits to school children in their homes.

In accordance with national policies, routine visits are not made, each visit being made for a special reason. Several visits have been made with Mrs. Small, State Welfare Worker. You are urged to write the nurse if you wish to see her, not wait for her to call, then when she comes to town she will have your name to visit. This is done to conserve time and to give service where it is needed most.

During the year your nurse has served as Chairman of the Procurement and Assignment Service for nurses, and reported at three district meetings besides the local meetings, attended the Tuberculosis Institute in Boston, and the Venereal Disease Institute in Maine and a Medical meeting on Venereal Disease, reported on this to local nurses and at a state staff meeting in Lewiston. She also took part in a panel discussion at the State Nurses' Association in Bangor, attended the Teachers Convention in Lewiston where a discussion was held of new health records for school. Was present at the Annual Meeting of the Maine Public Health Association at Poland Spring, Seal Sale meeting at Portland, and two staff meetings at Augusta on school nursing and administrative procedures. It is not possible to attend all meetings in the State, but we try to select those that would be of most benefit to the Service.
