In submitting this report I beg to say that accuracy has been observed to the best of our ability. According to the vote of the Town all uncollected taxes for 1933 and 1935 must be submitted to an Attorney for suit. I feel that this should be done in many cases after a careful consideration by the voters of the town. Many of these taxes can be collected without any legal action. It must be remembered that several of these tax payers owed quite large amounts of back taxes and these have been taken care of by them as rapidly as possible. I trust that you will notice that no tax liens or tax deeds have been executed since 1933, so that all the receipts accounted for have been in the form of available cash or road credits. On the balance of the 1936 commitment (which came into my hands Aug. 15, 1936) certain tax liens will be taken out, but my time limit before this can be done does not expire until April 15th at the earliest possible date. I have the assurance of two of the largest tax payers reported delinquent that their tax shall be paid before the above mentioned date.

I wish to thank all who have so kindly coöperated with me during my term of office.

WARRANT

FOR TOWN MEETING, MARCH 1, 1937

To Geo. G. Downs, a Constable in the Town of Rome, Kennebec County: GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Rome, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall at 8 o'clock in the forenoon on Monday, March 1, 1937, to act on the following articles, to wit:

ARTICLE 1

To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

ARTICLE 2

To proceed with the Australian Ballot.

ARTICLE 3

To see if the town will accept the accounts and reports of the several Town Officers for the year 1936.

ARTICLE 4

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for Common Schools.

ARTICLE 5

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the purchase of text-books and supplies.

ARTICLE 6

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for repairs of school buildings.

ARTICLE 7

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for tuition of High School scholars.

ARTICLE 8

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for Supt. of Schools.

ARTICLE 9

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for support of poor.

ARTICLE 10

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for Patrolled roads.

ARTICLE 11

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for breaking snow roads.

ARTICLE 12

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for repairs of roads and bridges.

ARTICLE 13

To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, for State Aid Highways for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 14

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for State Aid Roads.

ARTICLE 15

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for maintenance of State Aid Roads.

ARTICLE 16

To see if the town will vote and raise \$230 as required by law for maintenance of Third Class Road.

ARTICLE 17

To see if the sum of \$30.00 will be raised for School Nursing in the town of Rome under the auspices of the Bureau of Health of the State Department of Health and Welfare.

ARTICLE 18

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for payment of miscellaneous orders.

ARTICLE 19

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay Town Officers for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 20

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for care of cemeteries.

ARTICLE 21

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to cut bushes on the highways.

ARTICLE 22

To see if the town will vote to retain 33 1-3 per cent of the employees' wages, same to apply on taxes for ensuing year.

ARTICLE 23

To see if the town will vote and raise \$300 yearly, said money to be expended on the North Pond Club Road.

ARTICLE 24

To see what compensation the town will vote to give for collecting the taxes for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 25

To see if the town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen and Treasurer to hire such money as necessity may demand during the fiscal year.

ARTICLE 26

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay outstanding notes at the Depositors Trust Co., Oakland.

ARTICLE 27

To see if the town will vote to establish a school in Long Pond District (so called).

ARTICLE 28

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay interest on short time notes.

ARTICLE 29

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for electric lights for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 30

To see if the town of Rome will grant permission to the "Belgrade Lakes Region Guides Association" to erect and maintain tables, shelters, and fireplaces on Crooked Island (so called), situated in Great Pond, for the use and convenience of the public and of the town's summer guests.

ARTICLE 31

To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to tar the road from Meadow Stream to the entrance of North Pond Camps.

ARTICLE 32

To see if the town will vote to raise \$196 to purchase a sanding machine.

ARTICLE 33

To see if the town will vote to raise \$225 to be expended on the black road to pay for breaking snow, sanding roads and erecting snow fence as required by the State Highway Commission.

ARTICLE 34

To see if the town will vote to give preference of labor on the highway to those who owe real estate taxes prior to 1937 with the understanding that 50% of such earnings be applied to such unpaid taxes.

ARTICLE 35

To see if the town will vote to instruct the municipal officers to meet at the Town Hall on the second and fourth Saturday of every month at 1.30 P. M. for the purpose of transacting town business.

ARTICLE 36

To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of \$100 to be expended by the Kennebec Fish and Game Association for publicity purposes.

ARTICLE 37

To see if the town will appropriate and raise a sum of money to take care of overdrafts.

ARTICLE 38

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
