#### ATTENTION

To the Tax Payers of the Town of Rome:

I beg leave to present the following facts for your consideration. The Eighty-ninth Legislature passed a law requiring all tax collectors to be bonded by a surety bond, in consequence I was required to furnish such a bond. One of the conditions upon which this bond was issued was, that I would enforce collection of tax either by lien, suit or distraint, within one year from the date of commitment which date was June first, 1939. In accordance with this requirement I am obliged to start action on uncollected taxes by May 15th, 1940, no matter what my personal wishes might be in the matter. You will please note the amount of uncollected taxes is the smallest in years and I trust that all will cooperate with me so that I may not be forced to take action which would be very displeasing to me. # WARRANT

#### FOR TOWN MEETING, MARCH 4, 1940

To George G. Downs, a Constable in the Town of Rome, Kennebec County:

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Rome, qualified by law to vote in town affairs to meet at the Town Hall at 8 o'clock in the forenoon on Monday, March 4, 1940, to act on the following articles, to wit:

#### ARTICLE 1

To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

#### ARTICLE 2

To proceed with the Australian Ballot.

#### ARTICLE 3

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for Common Schools.

#### ARTICLE 4

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the purchase of text-books and supplies.

#### ARTICLE 5

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for repairs of school buildings.

#### ARTICLE 6

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for tuition of High School scholars.

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for Supt. of Schools.

#### ARTICLE 8

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for support of poor.

#### ARTICLE 9

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for Patrolled roads.

#### ARTICLE 10

To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for breaking snow roads.

#### ARTICLE 11

To see if the town of Rome will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the purpose of controlling the White Pine Blister Rust in the town. The above sum appropriated to be used on local labor matched with 50% of State Funds under the supervision of the Selectmen, or supplemented with local W. P. A. labor if available.

#### ARTICLE 12,

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions, under the provisions of Chapter 5, Section 82, of the Revised Statutes of 1930 said sum to be expended under the directions of the Kennebec Fish and Game Association.

#### ARTICLE 13

To see if the Town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$35.00 to be expended on cross road leading from Mercer road to Ira Wentworth Road so-called.

#### ARTICLE 14

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00. This money to be used in part or in whole to pay for the use of the Belgrade Fire Truck at the rate of \$25.00 per hour to fight fire in the Town of Rome.

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$30.00 for public health work in Rome, said sum to be expended by the Bureau of Health, State Department of Health and Welfare, in cooperation with local authorities.

#### ARTICLE 16

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be expended in repairing North Pond Camp Road.

#### ARTICLE 17

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used in repairing road leading from State Aid Road to Bradley's Farm.

#### ARTICLE 18

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used in repairing Dry Point Road (so-called) from residence of Mayo Richardson.

#### ARTICLE 19

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used in widening and repairing the road from Hillside Camps to Crystal Spring Camps.

#### ARTICLE 20

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of roads and bridges.

#### ARTICLE 21

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Roads.

#### ARTICLE 22

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of State Aid Roads.

#### ARTICLE 23

To see if the town will vote and raise \$310.00 as required by law for maintenance of Third Class Road,

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of miscellaneous orders.

#### ARTICLE 25

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay Town Officers for the ensuing year.

#### ARTICLE 26

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of cemeteries.

#### ARTICLE 27

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to cut bushes on the highways.

#### ARTICLE 28

To see if the town will vote to retain 331/3 per cent of the employees' wages same to apply on taxes for the ensuing year and all previous years of unpaid taxes.

#### ARTICLE 29

To see what compensation the town will vote to give for collecting the taxes for the ensuing year.

#### ARTICLE 30

To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to procure temporary loan or loans in anticipation of taxes for the purpose of paying indebtedness of the town. Such notes to be paid during the current municipal year out of money raised during the current municipal year by taxes.

#### ARTICLE 31

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay outstanding notes at the Depositors Trust Co., Oakland.

#### ARTICLE 32

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay interest on short time notes.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for electric lights for the ensuing year.

#### ARTICLE 34

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$225.00 to be expended on the black road to pay for breaking snow, sanding roads and erecting snow fence.

#### ARTICLE 35

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 for dependent children. (Mother's Aid)

#### ARTICLE 36

To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen on behalf of the town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable and to execute quit claim deeds for such property.

#### ARTICLE 37

To see if the town will vote to maintain a school in Long Pond district (so-called).

#### ARTICLE 38

To see if the town will vote to maintain a school in Blaisdell School (so-called).

#### ARTICLE 39

To see if the town will vote to maintain a school in Hersom School (so-called).

#### ARTICLE 40

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions under the provisions of Chapter 5, Section 82, of the Revised Statutes of 1930 said sum to be expended under the direction of the State of Maine Publicity Bureau.

#### ARTICLE 41

To see if the Town of Rome will vote to accept One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) in trust, interest only to be used annually for care of James Mosher's Cemetery lot.

To see if the town will vote to include musical instruction in the Town Schools and appropriate money for same.

#### ARTICLE 43

To see what action the town desires the Selectmen to take on the report of the department of audit relative to Ernest L. Blaisdell and Arthur D. Wilde.

#### ARTICLE 44

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay outstanding bills.

#### ARTICLE 45

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the Town Hall at 7 o'clock in the forenoon on the 4th day of March, 1940.
