Progress Report of Mouth Health Project

CARTHAGE - DECEMBER 1960

To the Carthage School Committee:

The first mouth health program in several years was completed on December 16, 1960, by a dental hygienist from the State Division of Dental Health. A total of 2½ days was used for the program.

Series of sodium fluoride applications, for partial prevention of dental decay, were offered to pre-schoolers and children in the second, fifth and eighth grades. These grades were selected because children in these age groups are getting their new permanent teeth. Best results occur when sodium fluoride is applied to teeth as soon as they erupt — before decay has time to occur.

In addition to the four series of sodium fluoride applications, each child received a mouth examination, a professional dental prophylaxis, and proper toothbrushing instructions. Mouth reports for parents were sent home by the children informing them of the condition of their child's mouth. The first grade children also received mouth examinations.

From the mouth examinations of all the children who participated in the program, it was found that:

- a. Not one of the 28 children examined said they went to the dentist twice a year for regular dental check-ups. 9 children said they had been to a dentist once or twice. And 19 said they had never been to a dentist.
- b. Not one of the 28 children said they brushed their teeth at least twice every day. 21 children said they brushed only when they thought of it, or were made to by parents. 7 children said they seldom remembered to brush their teeth.

c. 14 children had over 5 decaying teeth in their mouths. 6 children had over 10 decayed teeth each; and only 1 child had no visible signs of active dental decay.

The necessity for regular six-month dental check-ups, with needed corrections, and proper daily toothbrushing cannot be overemphasized. Lack of interest or understanding on the part of the parents will likely result in pain, discomfort, and possible loss of teeth by the children, as well as expensive dental bills. Parents may be unaware of the fact that teeth are complex, vital organs of the body — necessary for chewing, talking, and appearance. It is a well-recognized fact that regular six-month dental check-ups, which may involve a few small fillings, are much less expensive than the removal of several teeth with essential replacement or some other operation due to dental decay.

The dental hygienist wishes to thank Mr. Mercier, Mr. Dyke and all those who helped with this program, and for making her first visit to Carthage a very pleasant one.

Walking Blood Bank Report

It is our pleasure to submit a report to the Citizens of Carthage, Dixfield, and Peru on the achievements of the Dixfield American Legion Walking Blood Bank for the year 1960.

One year ago we had only 52 members and it is now most encouraging to note that we have now 432 persons typed and registered in our Walking Blood Bank. A total of 110 pints of blood have been donated for 33 of our patients at the Rumford, Lewiston, and Portland hospitals. It is imperative that we have more people register who will be able and willing to donate blood in times of need and emergency, as some of our older members are reaching the age where they can no longer give. Your help is needed if we are to provide adequate protection for the people of our area. Experience has proven that in small communities one large "Walking Blood Bank" is the only answer. In one unified effort there is less chance for duplication and confusion. The Bank is carefully controlled, with accurate records kept, to insure a systematic rotation of donors. This allows for no individual to be called upon too frequently. A Bank of this type also makes possible immediate and efficient action in any emergencies.

We certainly wish to thank the participating members who have made this project a success this past year, and if any of the citizens of the Carthage, Dixfield, and Peru area are ever in the need of a blood donor, please call us. We are proud to serve you.

Annual Report of Public Health Nursing Services

CARTHAGE - FOR THE YEAR 1960

Public health, in simple terms, is the sum total of the health of individuals and families living in a community. An organized program for public health is one that offers those individuals and families every possible chance of living and enjoying life, free from the handicaps of preventable disease and disability. In more formal terms, the objective of a public health program is to bring to all the people the benefits of modern medical and related sciences including the care and rehabilitation of the sick and disabled, the promotion of healthful living, and the prevention and control of disease.

A number of people are involved in the attaining of this objective. All together they make up a "health team". The public health nurse is an essential member of this team. She shares in planning and action with other workers in the fields of health, education, and welfare; with physicians, hospitals, clinics; with school personnel; with citizen groups. One of her important functions is coordination with the others involved to provide public health services to individuals, families, and community. Citizens of the community are also essential members of the health team. Alert to the health needs of their community, taking their share of responsibility to meet these needs, their contribution as health workers is indispensable to the effectiveness of the public health program. A vital, dynamic, working "health team" in the local community strengthens the public health not only of that community, but also of the State and the Nation.

Some of the public health nursing activities in your community were as follows:

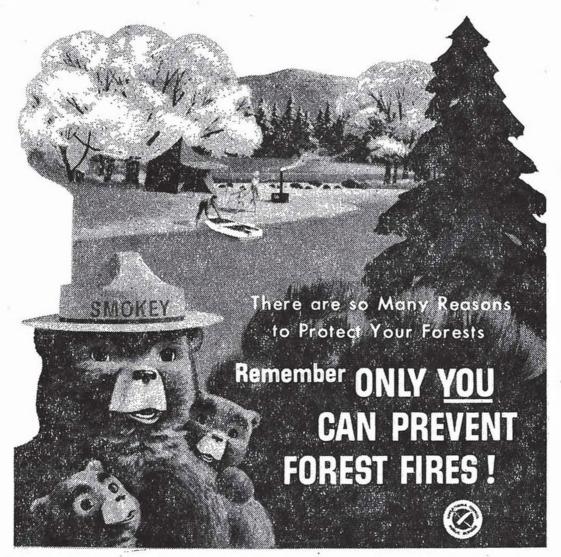
