I shall be obliged to take out a few liens on 1941 tax in order to protect the town as some unsettled estates are involved. There are a few uncollected taxes over a period of years which should be written off, as the property

belongs to the town now by virtue of tax liens. It was my purpose to clean up all back taxes during 1941, but illness prevented my doing that, I plan to do that as soon as possible. I beg to call your attention to the fact that without taking out tax liens, the amount of uncollected tax is the smallest in many years. I wish to take this opportunity to thank all who showed so much interest during my illness and by their assistance enabled me to make as good a showing as I have.

COMMENTS

Cash:

All cash recorded as received appeared to be properly accounted for and deposited in the bank. Expenditures were made by check from properly authorized warrants. The cash balance was reconciled with the bank.

Tax Liens and Deeds:

All income from tax liens and deeds appeared to be properly accounted for by your Treasurer. Those unpaid as of February 21, 1941 were listed and are shown on Schedules 3 and 4.

Trust Funds:

The trust fund investments were checked and listed on Schedule 6. The income from these funds appeared to be properly accounted for.

There is a small balance amounting to \$31.63 of trust fund cash impounded in the banks, which is probably of little value.

Taxes:

The 1940 tax commitment was added and found in agreement with the records of the Assessors. As far as could be determined, all cash collected has been turned over to the Treasurer. Lists of all unpaid taxes were prepared by us and shown on Schedule 2, with the exception of the unpaid taxes for the year 1934, the detail for which is not available.

REMARKS

An acute shortage of teachers now exists. Teachers are not leaving school because they wish to, but because they have to. Unless salaries are increased teachers will be forced to leave in much larger numbers next year. The increasing flow of teachers into better paid occupations threatens the quality of educational opportunity because these teachers cannot be replaced by adequately trained persons. Already standards are being lowered by the granting of "special certificates." Prices are going up and the value of the buyer's dollar is coming down. Now is the time to permit more generous financial support of schools. Incomes in general are rising faster than the cost of living. Property is worth more. Tax delinquency is less. Both the schools and teachers are doing good work. Your superintendent wishes to thank all who have contributed in any way to the advancement of the schools during the past year. Annual Report of Public Health Nursing

— 1941 —

During 1941, twenty-one families were serviced by the Public Health Nurse. Two expectant mothers, seventeen infants, twenty-three preschool children, five school children and four crippled children were extended advisory nursing services. Medical supervision, well balanced diets, habits of play, rest and sleep, the importance of immunization and vaccination were highlights discussed with the mothers. It is hoped that in the spring the town of Rome will sponsor a vaccination clinic in order that its children and citizens may be protected against disease in such a time of national distress.

WARRANT

FOR TOWN MEETING OF MARCH 2, 1942

To George G. Downs, a Constable in the Town of Rome, Kennebec County:

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Rome, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall at 8 o'clock in the forenoon, on Monday, March 2, 1942, to act on the following articles, to wit:

To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for the purchase of textbooks and supplies.

ARTICLE 5

To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for repairs of school buildings.

ARTICLE 6

To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for tuition of High School scholars.

To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for Superintendent of Schools.

ARTICLE 8

To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for support of poor.

ARTICLE 9

To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for Patrolled roads.

ARTICLE 10

To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for breaking snow roads.

ARTICLE 11

To see if the Town of Rome will vote and raise the sum of \$200.00 for the purpose of controlling the White Pine Blister Rust in the Town. The above sum to be used for local labor, and to be supplemented with 50% from the State or with WPA if available.

ARTICLE 12

To see if the Town will vote and raise \$30.00 for Public Health nursing in Rome. Said sum to be expended by the State Bureau of Health for local service.

ARTICLE 13

To see if the Town will vote and raise the sum of \$150.00 for use of the Belgrade Fire Truck.

ARTICLE 14

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for repair of roads and bridges.

ARTICLE 15

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of State Aid Roads.

ARTICLE 16

To see if the Town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the Town to State Aid, for State Aid Highways, for the ensuing year.

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for State Aid roads.

ARTICLE 18

To see if the Town will vote to raise \$330.00 required by law for maintenance of Third Class road.

ARTICLE 19

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for payment of miscellaneous orders.

ARTICLE 20

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay Town Officers for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 21

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the care of cemeteries.

ARTICLE 22

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to cut bushes on the highways.

ARTICLE 23

To see if the Town will vote to retain 33 1-3% of the employees' wages, same to apply on taxes for the ensuing year and all previous years of unpaid taxes.

ARTICLE 24

To see what compensation the Town will vote to give for collecting the taxes for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 25

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay interest on short time notes.

ARTICLE 26

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to procure a temporary loan or loans, in anticipation of taxes for the purpose of paying indebtedness of the Town. Such notes to be paid during the current municipal year, out of money raised during said current municipal year by taxes.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to raise in behalf of said Town, the sum of One Thousand Dollars, (\$1,000.00) and to give the note or notes of the Town for said amount, for the purpose of raising money for payment on the permanent note, said Town having legal right to raise money for said purpose; said amount not to be included among any loans which may be procured in anticipation of taxes for the current municipal year.

ARTICLE 28

To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$240 for Dependent children.

ARTICLE 29

To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to pay Insurance on Town Hall and the Schoolhouses.

ARTICLE 30

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay for electric lights for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 31

To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$225.00 to be expended on the black road to pay for breaking snow, sanding roads and erecting snow fence.

ARTICLE 32

To see whether or not the town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.00 for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions, under the provision of Chapter 5, Section 82 of the Revised Statutes. Said money to be expended through the State of Maine Publicity Bureau.

ARTICLE 33

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the Town, to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable and execute quit claim deeds for such property.

ARTICLE 34

To see if the Town will vote to maintain a school in Long Pond District (so-called).

To see if the Town will vote to maintain a school in Hersom District (so-called).

ARTICLE 36

To see if the Town will vote to renew the option with R. H. MacMillan for snow removal or to accept or reject any bids which may be made.

ARTICLE 37

To see if the Town will vote to impower the Selectmen to recontract in the event the elected contractor is not accepted by the State and a regular bonding company.

ARTICLE 38

To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to pay outstanding bills.

ARTICLE 39

To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to install electric lights in the church.

ARTICLE 40

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the Town Hall at 7 o'clock in the forenoon on the 2nd day of March, 1942.
