TOWN OF ROME FOR YEAR 1946**GREETINGS:**

The cessation of war activities, political changes, strike conditions with its obvious unemployment, causes us to realize that many people will be compelled to lower their standards of living. These people previously working and living in large industrial areas, will be returning to the smaller communities. Some will be able to carry out an improved standard of living; others, less wise, a lower standard. Communicable disease is on the upswing in many places. Therefore, with these factors in mind, it would appear that the health of our community is a very vital thing, needing the constant cooperation of the Community with the State through the Public Health Nursing Service.

Report of Nursing Service for 1946:

17 days of Nursing Service was allocated to Rome. 78 home visits were made to interpret the principles of healthful living to mothers, infants, preschools, and school children.

There were 3 Child Health Conferences held with an attendance of 35 children. Physical examinations and protection against communicable disease were offered. 13 children were vaccinated against small-pox; 7 protected against diphtheria and 5 against whooping cough.

Tuberculin testing in all schools resulted in 55 children, with the consent of their parents, being tested. Free x-rays by the State Bureau of Health Mobile Unit at Waterville were given where indicated. No active Tuberculosis was found.

Audiometer testing of hearing loss has not been done as planned but will be before the ending of the school year.

In making the above report of the Service for 1946, may I, as your Public Health Nurse, thank you for past cooperation and urge a continuation of this loyal support for 1947!

EQUALIZATION

In December 1947, the Town of Rome will not receive any equalization money from the State. This is because the law states the school tax rate for a town must be above the average for the State if the town is to receive equalization; and the school tax rate for the Town of Rome is .01126, while the average tax rate of the several towns for school maintenance in the State is .01855. Our school tax rate of .01126 is arrived at by dividing our local school maintenance appropriation, which is \$5,600, by the State valuation of the town, which is \$497,413.

The financial statement included in this report shows the total receipts and disbursements of the school department for the year ending February 8, 1947. The total receipts for the year in the common school fund account \$6,478.42, high school tuition account \$3,683.09, books and supplies account \$410.00, repairs account \$328.12, administration account \$285.00. The total disbursements in the common school account were \$6,120.87, in high school tuition account \$2,424.21, in books and supplies account \$426.35, in the repairs account \$123.00, in administration account \$354.51. The unexpended balance in each account is as follows: common school account \$357.55, high school tuition account \$1,258.88, repairs account \$205.12. There is a deficit in the following accounts: in books and supplies \$16.35, in administration account \$89.54.

County, GREETINGS:

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for repairs of school-buildings.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to transport the High school scholars for the ensuing year if the parents will pay one-half of transportation expense.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for tuition of High school scholars.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for Superintendent of Schools.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for support of poor.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for public health nursing in town of Rome, said sum to be expended by the State Bureau of Health for local service.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 5, Section 82, of the Revised Statutes of Maine.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid for State Aid Highways for the ensuing year.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for State Aid Road. One and one-half units or \$800 is the limit.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for maintenance of State Aid Roads.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for Patrolled Roads.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote and raise \$300 to use a bulldozer to widen the "Russell Stevens" Hill, so-called.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for repair of Roads and Bridges.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for breaking snow roads.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of \$150 for use of the Belgrade Fire Truck.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for payment of miscellaneous orders.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for care of cemeteries.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to cut bushes on the highways.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for non-payment of taxes thereon, and to execute Quit Claim Deeds or Bills of Sale, as the case may be, for such property.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to procure a temporary loan or loans, in anticipation of taxes, for the purpose of paying indebtedness of the town. Such notes to be paid during the current municipal year, out of money raised during said current municipal year by taxes.

Art. 26. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest on short time notes.

Art. 27. To see what compensation the town will vote to give for collecting taxes for the ensuing year.

Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for dependent children.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to establish an electric light at Tibbetts Corner, so-called.

Art. 30. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay for electric lights for the ensuing year.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of \$215.00 to be expended on the black road for breaking snow, erecting snow fence, and sanding roads.

Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to refund to Leon M. Davis and Velora R. Davis the amount of \$500.00 paid by them to the Town of Rome for the Lydia Scavone property.

Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to authorize the School Committee to establish a school in the Long Pond district, so-called.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to authorize the School Committee to establish a school in the Blaisdell district, so-called.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote and raise a sum of money for payment of outstanding bills.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote and raise a sum of money to pay for overdrafts.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of \$300.00 to tar the road from Richardsons' Corner to Fosters' Corner.
