

The Superintending School Committee have looked after the minor repairs, also the work done at East Ridge and on the village school house, and have bought the fuel, so I have had nothing to do with those accounts.

On the whole I believe the schools have been fairly successful the past year. I should like to have the parents visit the schools more, and get better acquainted with the teachers and their work.

Parents do not seem to take interest enough until some trouble comes up between teacher and child, and then they are apt to criticize and condemn the teacher, who may not be wholly to blame for the trouble. To get best results, the parents must co-operate with, and stand by the teacher.

The attendance has been very good, though during the spring term many of the pupils were vaccinated, and this caused some absence. The cold weather of the present winter cut into the last part of the winter term, making the average attendance small in some of the schools.

Our schools are well supplied with books now, but there is a constant wear that must be made good each year.

I think \$200.00 will be a sufficient amount for text-books for the coming year.
