



Town Warrant

To D. W. Berry, a Constable in the town of Carthage, in the county of Franklin.

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Carthage, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet at the Grange Hall at Berry Mills, in said Town, on Monday, the 1st. day of March, A. D. 1915 at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, TO WIT:

Article 1st. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2nd. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3rd. To hear reports of Town Officers for the year.

Art. 4th. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 5th. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for summer roads and bridges for the ensuing year.

Art. 6th. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for winter roads for the ensuing year.

Art. 7th. To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the Town to State aid, as provided in Section 20 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

Art 8th. To see if the Town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$300 for the improvement of the section of State aid road as outlined in the report of the State highway commission in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges; the above amounts being the maximum which the Town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Section 19 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

Art. 9th. To see whether the Town will vote to raise money, and what sum, for the maintenance of State aid highways during the ensuing year within the limits of the Town under the provision of Section 18 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913

Art. 10th. To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for the support of common schools for the ensuing year.

Art. 11th. To see if the Town will vote to have a Free High School and what sum of money shall be raised for the support of same.

Art. 12th. To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for the purchase of text books for the ensuing year.

Art. 13th. To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for the repair of schoolhouses for the ensuing year.

Art. 14th. To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for the support of poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 15th. To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for current expenses for the ensuing year.

Art. 16th. To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for insurance for the ensuing year.

Art. 17th. To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Art. 18th. To see if the Town will vote to give the Superintending School Committee authority to maintain schools in such districts as they consider necessary.

Art. 19th. To see it the Town will vote to authorize its Superintending School Committee to join with either or any of the following towns, to wit: (Jay or Weld) or such other town or towns as it may deem expedient for the purpose of employing a Superintendent of schools in accordance with the provisions of Sections 40 to 45, inclusive, of Chapter 15 of the Revised Statutes.

Art 20th. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary of superintendent of schools for the ensuing year.

Art. 21st. To see if the Town will vote to charge interest on taxes of the 1915 commitment that remains unpaid on Dec. 1st, 1915.

Art. 22nd. To see if the Town will vote to pay a discount on all taxes paid within three months from commitment and what sum of money will vote and raise for the same.

Art. 23rd. To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for tuition for High school.

Art. 24th. To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for wood and janitor services for High school.

Art. 25th. To see if the Town will vote to raise a certain sum of money for the repair of Town Office.

Art. 26th. To see if the Town will vote to buy a Holley snow plow and sled and what sum of money shall be raised for same.

Art. 27th. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the purpose of grading the hills from Libby cemetery to Dixfield town line

Art. 28th. To see if the Town will vote and raise a sum of money to purchase a Boston Grader

Art. 29th. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to help build a shed for horses for the Grange Hall.

Art. 30th. To see if the Town will vote to have all brush that is cut and piled on the fences along the highways or in the limits of the highways removed or burnt by Oct. 1st, at the expense of the owner.

Art. 31st. To see if the Town will vote that all land owners owning land along the highways shall cut, burn or remove all brush and bushes in the limits of the road adjoining their land on or before Dec. 1st, next.
