Town Warrant

To Ray P. Savage, Constable of the Town of Carthage, GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Carthage, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Grange Hall, Berry Mills, on Monday, the 1st day of March, A. D. 1926, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

ART. 2. To choose a clerk, selectmen, assessors, overseers of the poor, and all other necessary town officers.

ART. 3. To see how much money the town will vote and raise for the support of common schools, for tuition, text-books and supplies, schoolhouse insurance, schoolhouse repairs, school office expenditures, and interest on school fund.

ART. 4. To see how much money the town will vote and raise for the repair of roads and bridges.

ART. 5. To see how much money the town will vote and raise for winter roads.

ART. 6. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be applied to a two horse patrol, on State Aid road.

ART. 7. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 19, Chapter 25 of the Public Laws of 1916.

ART. 8. To see if the town will appropriate the sum of \$300 for the improvement of the State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the above amount being the maximum amount the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Section 18, of Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes.

ART. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for advertising our natural resources, advantages, and attractions, under provisions of Chapter 4, Section 59, of the Revised Statutes. The same to be expended under the Maine Development Association.

ART. 10. To see how much money the town will vote and raise for the Supt. of Schools.

ART. 11. To see how much money the town will vote and raise for the support of the poor.

ART. 12. To see how much money the town will vote and raise for current expenses.

ART. 13. To see how much money the town will vote and raise for overdrawn accounts.

ART. 14. To see how much money the town will vote and raise for Memorial Day expenses.

ART. 15. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the town road commencing at the John Robbins buildings, at So. Carthage, and ending at the Lindon Mason buildings, or to the place where said buildings formerly stood.

ART. 16. To see if the town will vote to use the \$300 raised at the annual town meeting, March 2, 1925, (to build a shed) for road and bridge purposes.

ART. 17. To raise a sum of money to pay Harry L. Smith and Fred Morrison for damage caused by discontinuing the Basin road.

ART. 19. To see at what time the town will vote to have the taxes collected and paid to the treasurer.

ART. 20. To see if the town will vote to give a discount on all taxes (the poll tax excepted) on the 1926 commitment paid on or before August 20, 1926, and to raise a sum of money for the same.

ART. 21. To see if the town will vote to charge interest on all taxes of the 1926 commitment that remain unpaid December 1st, 1926.

ART. 22. To see if the town will vote to accept the list of jurors as prepared by the municipal officers, town treasurer and clerk.

ART. 23. To see if the town will raise money to provide for the services of a Public Health Nurse or take action thereon.

ART. 24. To see if the town will vote to pay the superintending school committee for their services.

ART. 25. To see if the town will vote to sell the Ellis school-house.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session, at the Grange Hall, Berry Mills, on Monday, the 1st day of March, A. D. 1926, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to correct the list of voters.

To the Superintending School Committee of Carthage and Citizens:

I hereby submit to you my first report of the schools of your town.

The attendance at the Berry Mills school is very irregular and there should be a truant officer in that district who will look after children who are staying out of school with no good reason for doing so. A part of our State money is apportioned on the basis of aggregate attendance. Consequently a child in school is not only helping himself to get an education but also helping his town to get money from the State to assist in paying for it.

FINANCES

There are only two overdrafts in the school accounts and these are very small. The superintendence account is overdrawn \$3.00.

The account for books and supplies shows an overdraft of \$3.24. All the other accounts have unexpended balances. The total of the balances exceeds that of the overdrafts \$766.32 and so far as I have been able to learn all bills for the past fiscal year have been paid.
