Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the School Committee of Hebron:

I herewith submit the annual report of the schools of Hebron.

School officials have been confronted with a hard problem during the past year. The increase wage scale in other lines of work has drawn many capable teachers out of the profession. While neighboring districts having largely increased their wage rates have rendered it hard to fill vacancies. To some extent we have been able in the past to fill our schools with teachers who in order to be at home have taught their local districts. The minimum wage of such teachers has been raised from \$8 to \$10. Yet when teachers have been hired from away it has been necessary to pay a minimum of \$12. This is not fair to the local teachers. Yet it has been impossible to do any better for them as, though an unexpended balance shows on the books yet since the winter term teachers have not been paid and about \$400 is needed for that purpose, there is in reality an overdraw. To meet the needs of another year at least \$1,900 should be raised.

In regard to the salary of the superintendent of school The present average in this state is at present \$1,700 This district consisting as it does of four towns is more than average work. I question if a superintendent can be found for much less than this next year.

Warrant For Town Meeting

To Fred I. Sturtevant, constable of the town of Hebron in the County of Oxford, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitant of said town of Hebron qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Grange Hall in said town of Hebron on Monday, the first day of March A. D. 1920 at ten o'clock a. m., then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a clerk for ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will accept the report as printed.
- Art. 4. To choose a Treasurer for ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To choose a chairman of Board of Selectmen.
- Art. 6. To choose a second selectman.
- Art. 7. To choose a third selectman.
- Art. 8. To choose a Board of Assessors for ensuing year.
- Art. 9. To choose one member for three years for Overseers of Poor.
- Art. 10. To choose Truant Officers for ensuing year.
- Art. 11. To choose a Road Commissioner for ensuing year.
- Art. 12. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.
- Art. 13. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the support of poor, roads and bridges, for summer work on roads, for winter work, for cutting bushes, for miscellaneous acct., for town officers' bills.
- Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of ten dollars for A. A. Dwinal Post for Memorial Day.
- Art. 15. To see what sum the town will vote for free high schools according to the school laws of 1903.
- Art. 16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise for common schools for the ensuing year.
- Art. 17. To see what method the town will take in regard to collecting the tax.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the salary of superintendent of schools for 1920.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for school committee and office expense account, Text Books.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote (yes or no) on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in section 19 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be expended on road leading from Minot town line by Nelson school-house, so called.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to pay for repairing roller used for winter roads in district, so called, No. 8.

Art. 23. To see if the town will instruct its treasurer by a written consent of the selectmen to hire money for use of town.

Art. 24. To see how much money the town will raise for support of Mothers' Aid.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to allow 6 per cent. on all taxes paid before the first day of September, 1920, and charge 6 per cent. on all taxes unpaid the first day of December, 1920.

The selectmen will be in session at the Grange Hall on the first day of March, 1920, at 9 o'clock a. m. for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
