# Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of Hebron:

I respectfully submit herewith the annual report of the Superintendent of Schools.

By vote of the town at the annual meeting in March, the Center School was opened on April 1, 1935 for the spring term. No extra appropriation was made for this. However, through the interest of Mrs. Violet Buck, who made a personal gift of one hundred dollars, and also by lowering of transportation costs, the schools have been operated without incurring a deficit. Several conveyance routes have been combined, others climinated.

#### REPAIRS

The school buildings are in fairly good general condition with the exception of the Nelson School. This building needs a new floor and the underpinning should be rebuilt. The following repair list is suggested:

#### Nelson:

- 1. New floor
- 2. New under pinning
- 3. Painting—inside

#### Sodom:

- 1. Shed should be joined to the school building where it is pulled off.
- 2. Foundation needs repairing

#### Brighton Hill:

1. Three desks need repairing

There are the usual minor repairs that are needed yearly such as setting glass, repairing knobs, etc.

#### FINANCIAL

The School Board and Superintendent have aimed to keep school costs at a reasonable minimum. The increases in expenditures have arisen largely in the teachers' wages' account and the textbook accounts. The books are in very good condition as a whole, with the exception of the arithmetics. A new series of arithmetics is needed.

Hebron benefitted again this year from the equalization fund, and it has been expended in increasing the length of the school year one week, making 33 weeks in the school year.

I wish to express my appreciation to the teachers, officials, and citizens of Hebron who have contributed in making the past year both successful and pleasant.

# **Warrant for Town Meeting**

State of Maine

County of Oxford, ss.

To A. T. Eastman, a constable in the Town of Hebron, in said county.

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Hebron, qualified by law to vote in the town affairs, to assemble at Hebron Grange Hall in said town, on the 2nd day of March, 1936 at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will accept the report as printed.
- Art. 4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To choose a chairman to the board of Selectmen.
- Art. 6. To choose a second Selectman.
- Art. 7. To choose a third Selectman.
- Art. 8. To choose one member of Overseers of Poor for three years.
  - Art. 9. To choose a board of Assessors.
- Art. 10. To choose a road commissioner for the ensuing year and fix his compensation.
  - Art. 11. To choose one member of the school board for three years.
  - Art. 12. To choose a collector and fix his compensation.
  - Art. 13. To choose a fire ward and fix his compensation.
  - Art. 14. To choose all other town officers.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for support of poor.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for summer work, roads and bridges.
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for patrol labor.
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for cutting bushes.
- Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for blasting and removing stone to make clearance for snow plow.
- Art. 20. To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of \$999.52 to pay for repairs on Tractor, repaired in Fall for snow removal.
- Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will raise for winter work and overdraft.
- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for town officers' bills, including school committee.
- Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for miscellaneous account.

- Art. 24. To see if the town will accept the road leading West from the Sanatorium Road (so called), to the residence of Seward Sturtevant.
- Art. 25. To see what action the town will take in regard to 1936 location of 3rd Class Read; to continue where left off in 1935, or start at State Aid road at Hebron, and work back to 1935 location.
- Art. 26. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for A. A. Dwinal Post for Memorial Day.
- Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for free high school, according to the school laws of 1903.
- Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for common schools.
- Art. 29. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for office expense account.
- . Art. 30. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for text books.
- Art. 31. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for repairs.
- Art. 32. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for superintendent's salary, for 1936.
- Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to authorize the school committee to continue school where an average attendance of eight pupils has not been maintained the past year, if they consider it necessary.
- Art. 34. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Section 19 Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- Art. 35. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of Ways, Highway and Bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chap. 175, Public Laws of 1933.
- Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$200. to cut bushes and maintain State Aid Road to entitle the town to receive State apportionment.
- Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$100.00 to cut bushes and maintain State Aid No. 2 Road, to enable the town to receive resolve and State apportionment.
- Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$461.00 to maintain third class road to entitle the town to receive third class road money from the State.
  - Art. 39. To see what action the Town will take in regard to buying

the gravel pit on the late A. W. Skilling Farm, and to see if the town will raise the money needed.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise money to pay unpaid notes.

Art. 41. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for payment of interest for the ensuing year.

Art. 42. To hear report of Library Trustees and act on same.

Art. 43. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for Moody Library.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote, that for the purpose of procuring a temporary loan, to, and for the use of the town, to pay indebtedness of the town due and to became due during the present municipal year, to be paid out of money raised by taxation during the present municipal year, the town treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate what is needed, and to execute and deliver the note or notes of the town therefor signed by the town treasurer and countersigned by the municipal officers of the town.

Art. 45. To see if the town will vote to authorize the town treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen to execute a quit claim deed in behalf of the town, releasing its rights in and to real estate held by it by tax deeds, upon payment of interest at 8 per cent, taxes and costs.

Art. 46. To see if the town will vote to determine the time when the commitment of taxes shall be made, at what time they shall be payable, and what rate of interest shall be collected (from and after such time).

Art. 47. To see if the sum of \$33.00 or more, will be raised for school nursing in the town of Hebron under the auspices of the Bureau of Health of the State Department of Health and Welfare.

Art. 48. To see what action the town will take in regard to hiring the Grange Hall for town purposes.

Art. 49. To see what action the town will take in regard to electing a budget committee for the ensuing year.

Art. 50. To see if the town will accept and handle funds entrusted to it for the upkeep and improvement of the Hebron Churchyard Association Cemetery.

Art. 51. To see what action the town will take in regard to discontinuing the Clark road (so called) on mountain; cross road leading from road near H. J. Salo, leading by old Clark farm (so called) in westerly direction to Paris town line.

Art. 52. To see if the Town will authorize its Treasurer to deduct one-third of the workers' pay for road work, and use it to-pay their delinquent or current taxes; this to be permanent until otherwise changed.

Art. 53. To see if the town will authorize the Tax Collector to collect all Poll taxes on presentation of the Poll Tax bill, on or before June 1, 1936.

Hereof fail not and have you this warrant with your doings thereon. The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the Grange Hall at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.
