Elementary school tuition is being paid for eight pupils who attend the West Minot School and for one who attends the elementary school in Mechanic Falls.

Hebron is providing elementary school facilities for seven pupils from Turner and for two pupils from Minot.

Hebron did not receive any State equalization money for this school year, and advance notice from the State Department of Education shows that none will be received for this next school year.

There are two regular conveyors this year: Mr. Leslie Perry is conveying from Sodom to Brighton Hill; Mr. Guy Collins is conveying from Back Street and also from Sanatorium Hill to the Center School.

Hebron is also sharing a conveyance with Minot and Oxford, each town paying one-third of the cost.

Report of Public Health Nurse

HEBRON, 1943

NURSING SERVICE IN HEBRON

It is with pleasure I present a report of the Nursing Service, a pleasure because of the interest shown in health.

In May, through the interest and cooperation of Mr. Sturtevant, Health Officer, Mr. Robinson, Superintendent of Schools, and Dr. Adams, Superintendent of Western Maine Sanatorium, a physical examination was offered to the children in Hebron schools.

Forty-eight children received physical examinations, several of the defects found have been corrected.

Eleven children received toxoid, protection against diphtheria and six were vaccinated against smallpox. Because there are so few children under school age in Hebron, it is not thought advisable to hold Child Health Conferences, but mothers with children under school age took advantage and four pre-school children were brought to the school clinic for physical examination, toxoid and vaccine.

Forty-six children and three adults were given tuberculin tests to see if they had had contact with tuberculosis. All reports were negative.

Nineteen follow-up visits were made after the above clinic to interpret the findings to the parents, encourage correction of defects and discuss nutrition. Two children who were positive reactors to the tuberculin test in 1939, assumed their own responsibility and went to the Western Maine Sanatorium for X-rays as advised at the clinic. Two children were referred to the Crippled Children's Clinic and this advice was followed by parents and both children attended the clinic conducted by the State Bureau of Health.

Dental corrections have been made through parents assuming responsibility or by assistance from the Red Cross.

Six visits were made to prospective mothers to assist them in planning for delivery. Three visits were made soon after delivery to help mothers make necessary adjustments and give adequate care to the new babies.

Eleven infant visits and eight preschool visits were made to stress need of continuous supervision and protection against communicable diseases.

Seven visits were made to communicable diseases to assist in securing medical examinations, to supervise and urge isolation in the control of whooping cough and measles.

I am gratefully appreciative of the cooperation I have received from officials, Mr. Sturtevant, Health Officer, and Dr. Adams and his staff of assistants. Also, the school committee, who were so helpful in solving our transportation problem to the Western Maine Sanatorium for physical examination.

Warrant for Town Meeting

State of Maine.

To Ernest L. Bumpus, a Constable in the Town of Hebron, in said County:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Hebron, in said County, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Hebron Center Grange Hall, in said town, on Monday, the sixth day of March, 1944, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, namely:

Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a clerk for ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report as printed.

Art. 4. To see what salary the town will vote to pay its officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for summer work, roads, bridges, and patrol labor. Raised last year, \$1,700.00. Selectmen recommend \$1,700.00.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for cutting bushes on town roads. Raised last year \$50.00. Selectmen recommend \$100.00.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for state aid road construction, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for care of ways, highways, and bridges, under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937. Raised last year \$41.17. Selectmen recommend \$34.00.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for cutting bushes on state aid road. Raised last year \$100.00. Selectmen recommend \$100.00.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for maintenance of third class roads, to entitle the town to receive its allotment of third class road money from the state. Raised last year \$200.00. Selectmen recommend \$500.00.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for winter work. Raised last year \$1,000.00. Selectmen recommend \$1,000.00.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for welfare account. Raised last year \$100.00. Selectmen recommend \$200.00.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for town officers' bills. Raised last year \$1,500. Selectmen recommend \$1,600.00.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for miscellaneous account. Raised last year \$500.00. Selectmen recommend \$550.00.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for Memorial Day. Raised last year \$5.00. Selectmen recommend \$35.00.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for cutting bushes on third class roads. Selectmen recommend \$100.00.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for cutting bushes on unimproved roads. Selectmen recommend \$50.00.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to cooperate with the Maine Forest Service and the Federal Government in the control of the White Pine Blister Rust in accordance with Revised Statutes, Chapter 11, Sections 62-63-64.

Art. 19. To see whether or not the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the

natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 5, Section 82, of the Revised Statutes of Maine.

Art. 20. To see how much the citizens of Hebron will vote to raise for each of the school purposes listed below: The recommendations of the superintending school committee are as follows: (a) common schools, \$4,150.00, (b) high school tuition, \$750.00, (c) textbooks, \$75.00, (d) supplies, \$20.00, (e) lights and telephone, \$60.00. Total \$5,055.00. Raised last year \$5,075.00. School Committee recommends \$5,055.00.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for repairing the road beginning at the Minot town line, on the George Allen road and leading toward the residence of Henry Kyllonen. Selectmen recommend \$800.00.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a new snow plow and raise money for same. Selectmen recommend \$800.00.

Art. 23. To see what action the town will take in regard to having the poll taxes collected, and on what date.

Art. 24. To see if the town will raise and appropriate \$33.00 for public health nursing in Hebron, said sum to be expended by the State Bureau of Health, for local service. Raised last year, \$33.00. Selectmen recommend \$33.00.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Assessors to rescind any amounts appropriated by the town for State aid road construction in excess of the amount required to meet state apportionment.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to authorize the officers to procure a temporary loan or loans in anticipation of taxes for the purpose of paying obligations of the town; such loan or loans to be paid during the current municipal year out of money raised during said current year, by taxes.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen on behalf of the town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quit-claim deeds for such property.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to authorize the treasurer, with the approval of the selectmen, to execute a quit-claim deed in behalf of the town and, or, assignments with rights of foreclosure in case of unmatured tax mortgage liens releasing its rights in and to real estate held by it by tax deeds and tax liens upon payment of such amount, or amounts, in each case, as the Selectmen in their discretion deem proper.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to ratify and confirm and approve the acts of the Treasurer and Selectmen hitherto performed by them in making settlement of tax deeds and tax liens by compromising the claims of the town and accepting less than the aggregate of the taxes, costs and interest at 8 per cent.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to authorize the town treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to sell either at private or public sale, any property to which the town has obtained title, either by tax deeds or tax liens upon such terms and for such consideration as the Selectmen in their discretion deem advisable and in such cases, to authorize the town Treasurer to execute appropriate deeds in the name of the town and to acknowledge the same.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to close the Sodom school.

Art. 32. To see if the town will close the Nelson school.

Art. 33. To see what action the town will take in regard to selling or otherwise disposing of the Nelson and Sodom school houses, provided the School Committee deems it advisable.
