To the School Board and Citizens:

Herewith is submitted my fourth annual report as your superintendent of schools, showing a detailed accounting of all receipts and expenditures.

This year we were faced with the task of financing the schools on an appropriation of \$5500 as compared with the appropriation of \$8300 last year and that of over \$10,000 for the years before that. The school committee met and analyzed school expenditures and it was found that our rural schools and conveyance items were the only places where any money could be saved except by cutting the pay of the teachers. Accordingly it was decided to close one rural school—the Morgan—and to eliminate two conveyance routes.

As this new prospectus was later studied it was found that we were still short of sufficient money by about \$500. To make up this amount the opening date of school was delayed and this \$500 does not appear in this year's expenditures, for we have not yet made up this two weeks.

To recapitulate: We needed to make up the difference between last year's appropriation of \$8300 and the \$5500 of this fiscal year. This sum of \$2800 was realized as follows:

For the coming year we have no unexpended money and it appears that the appropriation for 1936-37 should be increased over this year's \$5500 by the amount of the unexpended balance i. e. \$1,400.00.

In event the Morgan School is re-opened, an additional amount of \$500 should be made available.

#### School Progress

Several changes were necessitated this year in the teaching force due to resignations. In the High School, Mr. Thompkins was elected to fill the vacancy caused by the advance of Mr. Osgood to a better paying position. The change in no way affected the high standard of work in the Agriculture department. Mr. Thompkins is a capable and popular teacher. An improvement was made in the English and Language department of the school by filling the vacancy caused by Mrs. Pomeroy's resignation by a graduate of the U. of M. and of the Maine School of Commerce, Miss Carter. We were fortunate in being able to find a teacher who was a graduate of these two institutions. now organized, two teachers of the faculty are prepared to teach English and Languages. Heretofore these two subjects had to be handled by one teacher and the load was too great.

Mr. Fletcher, the principal of the school, is a man of specialized training for his position and knows just what is required for a class "A" school. He applies this knowledge to Sherman High and our pupils are receiving the instruction that compares favorably with any secondary school.

In the common schools, too, are several new teach-In the Doble school is Miss Dora Corey, a teacher of experience. This district has had more than its share of inexperienced teachers and the fine progress made here this year shows the wisdom of placing experienced teachers when it is possible to do so. Another experienced teacher was found to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Miss Donald in the lower grades, in Miss Helen Dow. The children in this school are doing one of the pieces of work in the Union. Indeed, I do not think there is another school where first year pupils can read as well as can this group. The record of the high progress made by these children is an additional argument for experienced teachers. Mr. Webb, in the Junior High grades, is a graduate of the three year normal training course. He is a man of sterling character and of a marked liking for young people. This is his first year's teaching and his development has been rapid. He has coached the boys' basketball team of the high school to help in relieving the heavy load carried by the high school teachers. The material he had to work with in the team was inexperienced and the boys were light as compared to the other teams in the Katahdin League. These boys, however, surely exhibited a scrappiness that was admired and as they gain in experience they should make a creditable team.

The other members of the teaching personel returned from last year. In the rural schools Mrs. Storm and Miss Sleeper continue to be very capable and popular. Miss Elwell of the Woodbridge school has applied many of the

good ideas she got at the Summer School of the U. of M. last year and has a successful and well organized school.

The enrollment and costs per pupil per year are shown by the annexed table. It will be seen that our greatest expense is the small rural schools. Sherman is laid out in such a way, however, that there appears to be no way in which this expense can be avoided.

In conclusion, we wish to assure the town that as teachers and superintendent, we wish to do just what the town feels is best for the children. Without the support of the parents and friends of the schools our tasks would be much more difficult but we fully realize that the children themselves are not to blame for this situation in which we find ourselves financially and we wish to do all that can be done for them.
