



REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Committee and Citizens:—

Herewith is the fifth annual report it has been my pleasure to submit. Several interested citizens have suggested that this report could be shortened without making it less complete and at the same time saving the town the three dollars or so that each page in this report costs. Following these suggestions I will make this brief.

Early last fall the State Department wrote that Sherman High would be in danger of forfeiting its Class "A" rating unless the commercial course were dropped and a teacher hired to fill this vacancy who would be prepared and certified to teach in the regular high school subject field, or unless an additional teacher be hired outright. The committee and superintendent did not feel that the commercial course should be dropped and therefor took the other course of hiring an additional teacher for the high school. This change can be discussed at the Annual Meeting. If it is thought best to retain the additional teacher, it will necessitate an increased appropriation to pay this salary. If an additional appropriation cannot be

made, the commercial or agricultural course will have to be discontinued until funds are available, for we must have three teachers in the high school outside of these two special courses.

The only other serious matter is the condition of the school houses. At least \$100 is needed to make repairs on the rural buildings this year and an additional \$300 should be appropriated to complete the high school roof and to brighten up the interior of the high school building. This \$400, with the unexpended balance of over \$200 in the repairs account will do a fair job in putting the buildings in passable shape.

Enrollment is very nearly what it was for the past few years except in the high school where we have a larger group of tuition pupils than heretofore. Woodbridge school now has a large enrollment, 29 pupils, and if further children from that neighborhood apply for admission, the Morgan school may have to be re-opened.

- At. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of memorial day.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$323.86 for the maintenance of improved sections of third class road or to be used in connection with the third class apportionment made by the State for the improvement of third class roads.
- Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 (five hundred dollars) to pay school house note due April 23, 1937.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance of cemeteries.
- Art. 16 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for public welfare.
- Art. 17. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of snow removal for the ensuing year, and specify roads to be plowed.

- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal.
- Art. 19. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of raising and appropriating money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Sec. 20 Chap. 28, Revised Statues of 1930.
- Art. 20. To see what sum the town will raise and appropriate for State Aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sec. 19 Chap. 28 Revised Statues of 1930, or under the provisions of Sec. 3 Chap. 173 Public laws of 1935.
- Art. 21. To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid roads in excess of the requirements if Sec. 2 Chap. 132 P. L. 1935.
- Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money and if so, how much, to be expended under the direction of the local Board of Health or Public Welfare officer, for the suppression and prevention of tuberculosis.
- Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for elementary and secondary school purposes including teachers wages, fuel, janitors, conveyance, tuition, text books, school supplies and lights.
- Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for school house repairs.
- Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for school insurance.

- Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to give discounts on 1937 taxes, and fix discount date, and rate of discount.
- Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to cover discount and commissions on taxes.
- Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to charge interest on unpaid taxes, and fix interest date, and rate of interest.
- Art. 29. To see if the sum of \$40.00 or more will be raised and appropriated for school nursing in the town of Sherman to be expended under the auspices of the Bureau of Health of the State Department of Health and Welfare.
- Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum equal to ten cents per capita or \$100.00 to be expended and used for advertising the recreational advantages and attractions, natural resources and industrial possibilities of Aroostook County, the town and the State of Maine, the same to be expended through the Aroostook Development Association, Incorporated.
- Art. 31. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow fence.
- Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to give authority to the town Treasurer under the direction of the Selectmen, for such sums as the Selectmen shall see fit to accept therefor, to sell and convey all the right, title and interest in and to such parcels of land, bid in at tax sales and the town acquired under tax deeds.
- Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to bring writs of entry for the recovery of

and possession of such parcels of land as have been conveyed to the town, for the non-payment of taxes and the time of redemption having expired.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and town Treasurer to borrow money for and in behalf of the town in anticipation of taxes, and to renew notes given for money borrowed heretofore, and to borrow money for any other legal purpose not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$18,000.00. Also to see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to sign notes of any necessary evidence of said indebtedness and deliver the same for and in behalf of the town for the purpose aforesaid.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to ratify and confirm as debt of the town the sum of \$11,323.95 in notes now held by the Katahdin Trust Co., and to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to execute in the name and behalf of the Town any renewals of said notes.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising the list of voters, at the Selectmen's office, at nine o'clock in the forenoon of the day of said meeting.
