## Report of School Committee and Superintendent of Schools

To the Citizens of Hebron:

We hereby submit our annual report covering the fiscal year from February 1, 1944, to January 31, 1945.

As in every other type of business, education has felt the effect of the prolongation of the war. This past year the State of Maine has not been able to staff all schools despite the fact that many schools have been consolidated; many persons have been teaching on permits; and high school graduates have been teaching without certification of any kind. In fact 240 permits have been issued to partially qualified persons, licensing them to teach in Maine for the duration of the emergency. There has been issued 75 sanctions to people who have had very little, if any, training beyond the high school level. In spite of this temporary lowering of the teaching standards, the superintendents of schools in Maine report 150 teaching vacancies in their classrooms. The national picture bears about the same relation in teachers as we see in our own State. Obviously the town paying the better salaries will have teachers while the poorer paying communities will go without, since there are not enough teachers to fill all of the positions.

The Town of Hebron has been particularly fortunate in having qualified local teachers, who have been willing to teach.

The following elementary schools are being operated this year:

There are ten pupils attending West Minot School and two attending Mechanic Falls elementary school. The Town of He-

bron is also furnishing school privileges to six children from Turner and three children from West Minot.

Hebron did not receive any State equalization money for this school year, and the superintendent's office has just been notified that there will be none for the coming year.

This past summer the inside of the Brighton Hill School was painted. During the coming year the Academy School should have an outside paint job.

## Report of Public Health Nurse

#### ANNUAL REPORT, HEBRON, 1944

The school examination was held at the Western Maine Sanatorium. Dr. Adams and his staff gave this service to the school children. Sixty-five pupils were examined. Dental defects were numerous. Not only untreated dental caries but need for daily cleaning of teeth was found. The difficulty in securing dental appointments has been a problem. Talks were given in the school room and in the homes concerning the vital importance of good mouth hygiene. Some throat defects were found.

Two school children had tonsillectomies during the summer.

One child was found with a crippling condition and has been referred for correction.

Twenty-four visits were made to interpret the needs of children to parents and to assist them in securing corrections.

The audiometer for testing hearing was used in all schools. Sixty-nine children were examined. Four were found with defective hearing. The parents of these children were notified.

Twenty-seven visits were made to infants and preschool children in the interest of communicable diseases control and for health supervision.

Immunization clinics were held in schools. Twenty-three children received protection from diphtheria and nine vaccinations were done. Through the cooperation of the Health Officer, the town officials, Dr. Adams and his staff, and Mr. Robinson, the superintendent of schools, this health program has been made possible. I would like to take this opportunity to thank these people for their help and interest during the past year. Continued support is needed during the coming year.

## Warrant for Town Meeting

State of Maine

County of Oxford, ss.

To Andrew Hawkins, a Constable in the Town of Hebron, in said County:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Hebron, in said County, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Hebron Center Grange Hall, in said town, on Monday, the fifth day of March, 1945, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, namely:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a clerk for ensuing year.
- Art. 3 To see if the town will vote to accept the report as printed.
- Art. 4. To see what salary the town will vote to pay its officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for summer work, roads, bridges, and patrol labor. Raised last year \$1,700.00. Selectmen recommend \$1,700.
- Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for cutting bushes on town roads. Raised last year \$100.00. Selectmen recommend \$100.00.

- Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for state aid road construction, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for care of ways, highways, and bridges under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937. Raised last year \$34.00. Selectmen recommend \$370.24.
- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for cutting bushes on state aid road. Raised last year \$100.00 Selectmen recommend \$100.00.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for maintenance of third class roads, to entitle the town to receive its allotment of third class road money from the State. Raised last year \$500.00. Selectmen recommend \$424.00.
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for winter work. Raised last year \$1,000.00. Selectmen recommend \$1,500.00.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for welfare account. Raised last year \$200.00. Selectmen recommend \$600.00.
- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for town officers' bills. Raised last year \$1,600. Selectmen recommend \$1,600.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for miscellaneous account. Raised last year \$550.00. Selectmen recommend \$350.00.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for Memorial Day. Raised last year \$35.00. Selectmen recommend \$25.00.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town wil vote to grant and raise for cutting bushes on third class roads. Raised last year \$100.00. Selectmen recommend \$100.00.

- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for cutting bushes on unimproved roads. Raised last year \$50.00. Selectmen recommend \$50.00.
- Art. 18. To see how much the citizens of Hebron will vote to raise for each of the school purposes listed below: The recommendations of the superintending school committee are as follows: (a) Common Schools, \$4,600.00, (b) High School Tuition, \$1,000, (c) Textbooks, \$50.00, (d) Supplies, \$50.00, (e) Lights and Telephone, \$60.00, (f) Repairs, \$175.00. Total, \$5,935.00. Raised last year \$5,055.00. School Committee recommends \$5,935.00.
- Art. 19. To see if the town will raise and appropriate \$33.00 for public health nursing in Hebron, said sum to be expended by the State Bureau of Health for local service. Raised last year \$33.00. Selectmen recommend \$33.00.
- Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to authorize the officers to procure a temporary loan or loans in anticipation of taxes for the purpose of paying obligations of the town; such loan or loans to be paid during the current municipal year out of money raised during said current year, by taxes.
- Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen on behalf of the town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quit-claim deeds for such property.
- Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to authorize the treasurer, with the approval of the selectmen, to execute a quit-claim deed in behalf of the town and, or, assignments with rights of foreclosure in case of unmatured tax mortgage liens releasing its rights in and to real estate held by it by tax deeds and tax liens upon payment of such amount, or amounts, in each case, as the Selectmen in their discretion deem proper.
- Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to ratify and confirm and approve the acts of the Treasurer and Selectmen hitherto performed by them in making settlement of tax deeds and tax liens by compromising the claims of the town and accepting less than the aggregate of the taxes, costs and interest at 8 per cent.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$200. to cooperate with the Maine Forest Service and the Federal Government in the control of the White Pine Blister Rust in accordance with Revised Statutes, Chapter 11, Sec. 62-63-64.

Art. 25. To see whether or not the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25. to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 5, Section 82, of the Revised Statutes of Maine.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$175.00 to buy as much new snow fence as possible with said amount, provided such is available. Selectmen recommend \$175.00.

Hereof fail not, and have you this warrant with your doings thereon. The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the Grange Hall at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.
