# WARRANT

PENOBSCOT SS.

STATE OF MAINE.

TO LESTER P. PATTEN, a constable in the town of Hermon, in said  
county,

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Hermon, qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at the Town House in said town on Monday, the thirteenth day of March, A. D., 1911, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles to wit:

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the town report as printed.

Art. 4. To elect three or more selectmen, assessors and overseers of the Poor.

Art. 5. To elect one member of the S. S. Committee.

Art. 6. To elect a truant officer.

Art. 7. To elect a town treasurer.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to elect one or more road commissioners.

Art. 9. To elect one or more road Commissioners.

Art. 10. To see what sums of money the town will grant and raise for the Support of schools, the poor, the repair of roads and bridges, for contingent expenses, for school books, for repairs of schoolhouses and for school incidentals.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the care of cemeteries.

Art. 12. To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of twenty-five dollars for the care of the soldiers monument and memorial expenses.

Art. 13. To fix compensation of tax collector.

Art. 14. To elect a tax collector and other necessary town officers.

Art. 15. To fix compensation of S. S. committee, Supt. of Schools, town treasurer and road commissioner.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" upon the adoption of the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine, for the year 1907, as amended by Chapter 69 Public Laws of 1909, relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to state aid for highways for the year 1911.

Art. 17. To see if the town will raise and appropriate in addition to the amounts regularly raised and appropriated for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the sum of \$400.00, being the maximum amount which the town is allowed to raise under provisions of Chapter 112 of the public laws of Maine for the year 1907 as amended by Chapter 69, Public Laws of 1909.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to reinstate school number six and instruct the superintending School committee to maintain said school for the school year.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to abolish school number fourteen and instruct the superintending school committee to dispose of the school buildings.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise to be expended in laying out and improving Evergreen Cemetery and what action in regard to care of same.

Art. 21. To see what sums of money the town will grant and raise for Free High School purpose for the current year.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to buy one-half of a steel ladder to go on the town house and vote to raise \$5.00 for same.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for repair of town buildings and what such repairs shall be.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for building and repairing schoolhouse fences.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the Town House at 9.30 o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.

Fail not to make due service of this warrant and return your doings thereon at the time and place of meeting.

### TEXT BOOKS

The small geographies, the Progressive and the Cyr readers are in such a condition as to render them unfit for further use. With these exceptions, the schools are well supplied with text books.

During the summer vacation, the S. S. Committee adopted the New Century speller, bound in two parts, to replace the old Harrington spellers, and authorized the Superintendent to make the exchange which he did.

### REPAIRS

New seats have been placed in No. 10.

In No. 11 a part of the floor has been renewed and the outside of the building painted.

The building in No. 3 has also been painted. No. 2 has been repaired quite extensively and minor repairs have been made on other buildings. No. 2 needs new seats. A wood shed is needed in No. 3 also a larger stove.

The foundation of the building in No. 4 needs repairing. No. 5 needs a new floor and the ceiling repaired.

No. 8 needs a new outbuilding and the schoolhouse should be painted.

A new floor should be laid in No. 10. The ceiling in No. 11 needs repairing and this building should also be provided with new doors and double windows.

No. 13 needs outer doors.

### SCHOOLS

Although the work done in a few of the schools during parts of the year, has not met our expectations in others the excellence of the work has been especially gratifying.

In general, we feel justified in saying that the condition of the various schools throughout the year has been satisfactory.

The average attendance, compared with the total enrollment indicates a very irregular attendance of the scholars enrolled.

We feel that this condition is due, in a large measure to indifference on the part of the parents which is something to be deplored. If some of the parents feel that their school has not been a success, they should remember that success in any undertaking is impossible without the co-operation of all concerned. They should see that their children attend school regularly, and they should maintain toward the school and the teacher an attitude of encouragement rather than criticism.

In closing I wish to express my appreciation of the courtesy shown me by all with whom my work during the past year has brought me in contact.
