

ANNUAL REPORT

IMPORTANT

All taxpayers should read the following requirement and comply with it:

Section 70, Chapter 13, Revised Statutes of Maine 1930:

"Before making an assessment, the Assessors shall give seasonable notice in writing to the inhabitants , by posting notifications in some public place in Town, or shall notify them in such other ways as the town at its annual meeting directs, to make and bring in to them true and perfect lists of their polls and all of their estates, real and personal, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the first day of April of the same year. If any resident owner, after such notice, does not bring in such list, he is thereby barred of his right to make application to the Assessors or the County Commissioners for any abatement of his taxes, unless he offers such list with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to offer it at the time appointed."

AUDITOR'S REPORT 1941-42

November 30, 1942

TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF SHERMAN:

In accordance with the request of your town manager, I have completed an examination of the accounts of your town officials for the municipal year ended February 20, 1942.

My report, herewith submitted, was prepared from your town records and, to the best of my knowledge and belief, properly reflects the true financial condition of your municipality as of that date.

CASH

All receipts were found to be accounted for and deposited in bank. Disbursements were made by warrant and orders and some items paid without either which is irregular proceedure. Have recommended eliminating orders and disbursements without either, which has been followed closely in 1942-43.

TAXES

The 1941 Commitment was computed, added and found to agree with the assessors records. Unpaid taxes due from the collector is supported by a detail list, schedule 7, as well as all previous years taxes, schedules 8-9-10.

Excise tax was verified with the triplicate receipts Nos. 1—356 inclusive of 1941 tax and found correct, totaling \$1,356.02 and was over remitted to Treasurer by \$2.00.

TAX DEEDS AND LIENS

Payments on these items were properly credited to the respective years, and ones overpaid reconciled with the control accounts, Schedule 6.

TRUST FUNDS

Both M. S. and Cemetery funds have been used by the town. Interest is being paid the Schools on the M. S. Fund and Lots for which funds were left and are being cared for by the town.

The use by the town of Cemetery Trust Funds is, in my opinion, illegal and should be discontinued, by the investment in bonds or Savings account the \$450.00 shown to be the amount in trust.

A complete copy of Audit Report is on file at the Town Manager's office for inspection to any one wishing to examine it.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the members of the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the town of Sherman:

I have the pleasure of submitting for your consideration my third annual school report.

Knowing the extreme shortage of school teachers and and that hundreds of schools have been closed this year in the State because a teacher couldn't be found, I hope you can appreciate as I do the fact that we have an excellent corps of teachers at the present time.

Practically nothing in the way of textbooks and supplies have been denied these teachers and I find the equipment in your schools to be very good. In my opinion your schools are progressing very satisfactorily.

The Doble school is the only one we have had to close on account of being unable to obtain a teacher and since the shortage of teachers is expected to be worse next year we will be lucky if more of our rural schools are not closed before long.

To be able to retain our teachers and keep them happy in their work substantial increases in salaries will again have to be made.

It is regretted to have to show a large overdraft in your repair account but it was hard to avoid it since we encountered so much labor when we found ledges in the well and ditches. You also have a large overdraft in your Insurance account. A policy of over \$3000 of which I knew absolutely nothing about showed up. It was on the high school building, making a total of \$10,000 on that particular building.

Regardless of all the overdrafts we have an unexpended balance in the other school account of \$2,782.51 to offset them. We actually have a net balance in our school accounts amounting to \$893.01 which enables us to reduce our appropriations for schools next year and at the same time take care of our increase in expense including teachers salaries, etc.

The roof of the high school building needs attention next year and the building is badly in need of paint. While it may be possible to get along without purchasing a new furnace next year we shouldn't forget that the old one is in very poor condition.

WARRANT

To Pearl Gallison a constable of the Town of Sherman in the County of Aroostook, GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sherman, in said county of Aroostook, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Sherman Town Hall, in said town, on Monday the 15th day of March, A. D. 1943, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1 To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2 To elect a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3 To hear and act on the Town Report as prepared by the Town Officers.
- Art. 4 To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to employ a Town Manager under the provisions of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1939 and to fix the compensation for said Town Manager.
- Art. 5 To see what action the Town will take relative to fixing the duties to be performed by the Town Manager.
- Art. 6 To elect three or more Selectmen and all other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 7 To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers.
- Art. 8 To see what amount of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Government, including Miscellaneous, Town Officers, Town Hall Expense, Town Office Expense, Election Expense and Lien Costs.

- Art. 9 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Protection, including Street Lights, and insurance on public buildings.
- Art. 10 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to be expended by the Aroostook Anti-Tuberculosis Association for the suppression and control of Tuberculosis.
- Art. 11 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$78.00 for Public Health work in Sherman. Said sum to be expended by the Bureau of Health, State Dept. of Health and Welfare in cooperation with the Local authorities.
- Art. 12 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Highways, including; Town Roads, Cutting Bushes, Snow Removal, Snow Fence, 50-50 Road.
- Art. 13 To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for State Aid Road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930 or under the provisions of Chapter 213, Public Laws of 1941.
- Art. 14 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Patrol Maintenance.
- Art. 15 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$259.00 for the maintenance of improved sections of third class road, or to be used in connection with the third class apportionment, made by the State for the improvement of third class roads.

- Art. 16 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Support of Poor.
- Art. 17 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Public Welfare, Aid to Dependent Children.
- Art. 18 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Elementary and Secondary Schools, including teachers wages, fuel, janitors services, conveyance, text books and school supplies.
- Art. 19 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of its school buildings for the ensuing year.
- Art. 20 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for school property insurance.
- Art. 21 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay interest.
- Art. 22 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to retire Bonds of the Town of Sherman due May 1st. 1943.
- Art. 23 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Commissions, Discounts and Abatements on Taxes.
- Art. 24 To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.
- Art. 25 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance of Cemeteries.
- Art. 26 To see if the Town will vote to charge interest on 1943 unpaid Taxes, fix interest date and rate of interest.
- Art. 27 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen in behalf of the Town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of Taxes thereon on such terms as

they deem adviseable, and to execute quit-claim deeds for such property

Art. 28 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to bring writs of entry for the recovery of and possession of such parcels of land as have been conveyed to the Town, for the non-payment of Taxes and the time of redemption having expired.

- Art. 29 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to make temporary loans in anticipation of Taxes and to issue and negotiate notes therefor, or renewals thereof, or any notes in place of the original notes when paid, to an amount which at any time shall not exceed in the aggregate the total Tax levy of the preceeding municipal year, all such notes to mature and to be paid during the municipal year in which they are issued out of money raised during such current year by Taxes, in accordance with the provisions of R. S. Maine 1930, Section 83, Chapter 5, as amended.
- Art. 30 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civilian Defense.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising the list of voters, at the Selectmens Office at nine o'clock in the forenoon of the day of said meeting.
