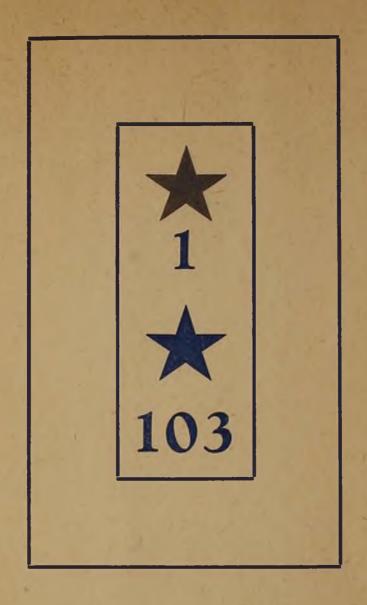

#### **IMPORTANT**

All taxpayers should read the following requirement and comply with it:

Section 70, Chapter 13, Revised Statutes of Maine 1930:

"Before making an assessment, the Assessors shall give seasonable notice in writing to the inhabitants by posting notifications in some public place in Town, or shall notify them in such other ways as the town at its annual meeting directs, to make and bring in to them true and perfect lists of their polls and all of their estates, real and personal, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the first day of April of the same year. If any resident owner, after such notice, does not bring in such list, he is thereby barred of his right to make application to the Assessors or the County Commissioners for any abatement of his taxes, unless he offers such list with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to offer it at the time appointed."

January 6, 1944

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sherman:

In accordance with a request of your town agent, Mr. D. B. Curtis, I have completed an examination of the accounts of your town officials for the municipal year ended February 20, 1943.

#### COMMENTS

#### CASH:

An examination was made of all receipts as recorded and of warrants issued by the selectmen.

Receipts were found to be properly accounted for and deposited in the bank.

Warrants were paid by check, supported by detail invoices on file.

The cash balance at the close of the year reconciled with the bank balance as shown by Schedule No. 1.

#### TAXES:

The 1942 Tax Commitment was added and found to differ in the amount of \$42.24 which credit was passed to the Collector as shown in Exhibit C. The balance due from the Collector in this commitment is supported by a list of unpaid taxes taken from the records as shown in Schedule following Exhibit F.

The excise tax was verified with the triplicate copies of the receipts as follows:

#### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the members of the Superintending School Committee and citizens of the town of Sherman:

It is with pleasure that I submit for your consideration my fourth annual reports of the condition, progress and needs of your schools.

I doubt if you need to be informed much about the teacher shortage because I think every one of you already know the seriousness of the situation, and you are well aware that it is almost impossible to secure the services of teachers for one room rural schools. I have lost nine teachers since Christmas and several of those vacancies are yet to be filled with certified teachers.

Under conditions like that I feel that you have reasons to be proud of your teaching staff and the progress made by your schools this year. When more teachers are available if the people of the town are dissatisfied with the present school system, your rural schools can be re-opened but it certainly is not advisable to do it at the present time.

You will notice that this plan of consolidation was brought about with no additional expense to the town. In fact after increasing the teachers' salaries substantially and purchasing a new school bus which cost \$1,400.00 we are able to show an unexpended balance of \$921.10.

The much needed repairs have been made on the high school building this year. The entire roof has been shingled and the building has received a thoroughly good paint job of two coats. Other repairs have also been made on the furnace of that building. Bills have not yet been rendered for the installation of two new furnaces for the schoolrooms of the town hall. It is anticipated that the cost to the school department will not exceed \$250.00 which will have to be taken care of in your next appropriation.

The average appropriation for the maintenance of your schools for the last four years is \$7,500.00. For the four years previous to that time the average appropriation was \$6,922.00. I want you to see that your schools to-day, regardless of the fact that the salaries of the teachers, janitors, conveyance and cost of fuel has been greatly increased, are costing you in taxes very little more than previously.

Since the town will not share in any equalization fund from the State next year as a result of our appropriation of \$6,000 being too small to give the town a school rate above the average for the State, it will be necessary to appropriate much more money this year. If \$10,000.00 is appropriated this year you can count on about \$3,500 being available from the State Equalization fund in the distribution of December, 1945, according to information from the State Department of Education.

- Art. 8 To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the starting and support of a local Public Library.
- Art. 9 To see what action the Town will take regarding the closing of the following one room rural schools; Woodbridge Cornor, Golden Ridge and Longfellow.
- Art. 10 To see if the Town will vote to create a Capital Reserve Fund in accordance with Sections 4 to 8 of Chapter 262 of the Public Laws of 1943, and, to transfer to said Fund a stated amount from present working capital.

- Art. 18 To see what amount the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Patrol Maintenance.
- Art. 19 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$259.00 for the maintenance of improved sections of third class roads, or to be used in connection with third class apportionment made by the State for improvement of third class roads.
- Art. 20 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Support of Poor.

  - Art. 31 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen in behalf of the Town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes thereon on such terms as they deem adviseable, and to execute quit-claim deeds for such properties.

- Art. 32 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to bring writs of entry for the recovery and possession of such parcels of land as have been conveyed to the Town for the non-payment of taxes and the time of redemption having expired.
- Art. 33 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to make temporary loans in anticipation of taxes and to issue and negotiate notes therefore, or renewals thereof, or any notes in place of the original notes when paid, to an amount, which at any time shall not exceed in the aggregate the total Tax Levy of the preceding municipal year, all such notes to mature and to be paid during the municipal year in which they are issued out of money raised during such current year by Taxes, in accordance with the provisions of R. S. Maine 1930, Section 83, Chapter 5 as amended.
- Art. 34 To see what sum the Town will raise for Civilian Defense.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising the list of voters, at the Selectmens Office at nine o'clock in the forenoon of the day of the meeting.
