Report of the Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor

To the Citizens of Bingham:

We herewith submit our annual report of the financial standing of the town for the year ending February 15th, 1932.

Because of the large overdraft in the previous year, which you voted to take care of at your last town meeting, it was necessary to increase the tax rate from \$42.00 to \$47.00 per \$1,000.00 in 1931.

You will note on the following double page in this report under "Schedule of Appropriations and Expenses" an overdraw on the Poor Account to the amount of \$1,671.19. Demands against this account are very uncertain and largely beyond our control, which condition the past few years has been nation wide. We might advise at this point, that were it not for the hearty cooperation given us by the town in general in the matter of gifts of clothing, etc., that this account would have been considerably larger. The only other overdraw of any amount you will note, was on Snow Roads. Of this overdraw totaling \$320.97 there will be approximately \$300.00 reimbursement coming to us from the State in the spring.

Although these overdrafts were largely beyond our control, you will note that we saved enough money on other accounts to bring the net overdraft down to \$314.24.

At one special town meeting this summer it was voted to hire \$4,000.00 for widening the macadam surface on the Main street, same to be paid off at the rate of \$500.00 per year plus interest. At another special town meeting in the fall, it was voted to hire \$4,500.00 for work on the State Aid Road, same to be paid off proportionally by the town and the State in three years. It was apparently considered very good business to take care of these loans by reducing them each year, rather than to continue them indefinitely and be saddled with interest charges on same. It would be natural to assume that because of these two loans, plus the small overdraft this year and also because we have discarded accounts that had been carried on our books as an asset the past few years, that these conditions would increase our liabilities nearly \$10,000 over the liabilities of last year. Happily, however, this is not so, as you will note in this report on the page showing our financial standing, that our liabilities only increased \$5,025.80. The saving is roughly accounted for by

reimbursement to ourselves on last year's overdraft. We might also state, that were it not for the State and other towns owing us some \$2,500.00 our bank balance would be considerably larger than last year.

You will note in the Town Warrant in the back part of this report that your Selectmen together with the Budget Committee have recommended drastic cuts in the appropriations for the coming season with the view of greatly reducing your taxes. In a number of cases they have recommended no appropriation and the article has been left in the Warrant for you to vote on.

In closing we wish to thank all the officials and citizens of the Town of Bingham for their co-operation during this past season.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the
Town of Bingham:

The written report here submitted is to be brief, merely stating some items of change and progress during the school year, the remainder of the report is to be submitted later in mimeograph form.

TEACHERS

Our teaching staff for the past year has met with but one change, Miss Louise B. Taylor, accepting the position left vacant at the close of the spring term by the resignation of Miss Nowell in grades five and six. Miss Taylor has had two years' work at the University of Maine besides summer term credit at Gorham Normal School. Her experience and training are such that she does her work impatiently and efficiently. In fact, it is our belief that the entire teaching force is exceptional as far as character, ideals, and ability are concerned. The spirit of co-operation existing between all concerned during the year has made for a successful year. Without this spirit, no system can hope to successfully carry out a good school program.

MUSIC

Our program in music is well carried out especially in the lower grades and in the Girls' Glee Club. It is sometimes difficult to judge what is accomplished from year to year, but when the work of the past four years is reviewed and a comparison made between what our boys and girls could do four years ago with what they can do now, an evidence of real progress can be seen.

REPAIRS

The primary building was given a coat of paint during the summer and quite a bit of interior decorating done at the high school building. This building needs painting and the rooms

in the primary building need to be refinished, but it is believed best to allow these items to hold over until at least another year.

Our students at the several colleges are doing good work and you will note in Principal Chapman's report that we are still on the New England College Entrance Certificate Board. It is interesting to note in passing that we have not had a student sent home from college due to inability to carry on work of college grade within my memory, certainly an enviable record. This shows among other things that our students are well prepared in pre-college work.

The American Legion Auxiliary presented us during the year, with a Giant Stride. This playground device is a great addition to our playground equipment and greatly appreciated by both the school department and especially by the children. We have also had gifts of an American flag, glassed and framed, a framed picture of George Washington and a year's subscription to "Current History" presented by the D. A. R.

In closing, I wish to thank all who have in any way contributed in making this a pleasant and profitable school year.

School Report

Mr. Howard L. Bowen, Superintendent of Schools:

I submit, herewith, my annual report as principal of the Bingham Junior-Senior High School.

The total enrollment this year is 112. This represents a decrease of only eleven from the number of last year. Class enrollment is as follows: Seniors 9, juniors 15, sophomores 21, freshmen 31, eighth grade 15, seventh grade 21.

The most important scholastic event of the past year was the entrance of Bingham High School in the University of Maine Scholarship Contest. In the final contest held at Madison, May 23, one of our seniors won the highest honors in the district in a comprehensive, competitive examination, and was awarded a year's scholarship at the state university. Underclassmen entered in the contest won both state and district honors in English, geometry and elementary algebra. We feel that we can be justly proud of our record as a school in that contest.

During the past year four of our recent graduates have entered New England colleges and very creditable reports have been received from them. It is interesting to note that these graduates were received, by the institutions in which they are matriculated, on certificate from this school, under the privilege which we now hold from the New England College Entrance Certificate Board.

While it is true that a relatively small number of our students enter college, it is equally true that as a rule those taking the college preparatory work, and who therefore, have a definite goal in view, take far greater interest in their school work than those who are not preparing for further study. It is important that both parent and pupil should keep in mind the fact that the college preparatory work should be taken from the first year on if there is even the slightest possibility of a college career ahead.

Last year the baseball team enjoyed another very successful season, making the total record of the last four years twenty-nine victories and eight defeats.

The Glee Club and the Home Economics Club are both well organized, and play an important part in the social life of their members. The combined clubs have been sponsoring a series

of socials which are well attended by members and guests. We are greatly indebted to the Fireman's Association for the occasional use of their hall, and their courtesy is very much appreciated.

Our school library has been increased to quite an extent during the last few years by gifts from graduating classes, other interested friends, and by an occasional purchase. The presence of worthwhile books encourages an interest in reading, and an appreciation of both current and classical literature. The available material recently added to the Bingham Union Library, for the use of our school pupils, is also of great benefit to those who use it.

In conclusion, may I state that the need of the interest of all parents in the school work of their children is greater now than ever. Home interest and constructive encouragement often mean the difference between success and failure. The pupil should not be rushed through school, as discouragement often results, when at a later age much good work could be done. Physical factors of health and environment frequently have retarding effects on school progress. The teachers are always glad to cooperate with parents in regard to the school work of their children.

For the loyalty of the teaching staff, and the constant support of the superintendent and school committee during the past years, I am very grateful.
