At the end of the spring term the joint committee did not deem it advisable to ask Mr. Avery to remain another year, thus necessitating the election of a Principal for the Academy.

Mr. Chas. P. Allen, of Columbia Falls, was elected to fill this position. Mr. Allen came very highly recommended and his work has been very satisfactory.

Miss Helen White, at the end of the spring term, resigned her position as 1st assistant, in order to pursue post graduate work. We were very sorry to lose Miss White from this department, but were fortunate in securing the services of Miss Mary Weeks, who has done very satisfactory work.

We also had vacancies in primary and intermediate schools caused by resignations of Misses Mary Wright and Mary Merrill. These teachers did good work in their respective schools the spring term. It was my desire to get normal graduates for these schools, but could not for the money that we are paying. We however got teachers who had had normal training, Miss Mary Nute and Miss Alma Rines, who have worked hard in the schools and with marked success.

It is not necessary for me to mention the work of the teachers who have been with us a number of years, it is already well known. The teachers in all of the schools have worked faithfully, and it seems to me with success.

The members of the school board have aided me materially the past year for I have consulted them frequently in regard to all matters of importance pertaining to the schools. I hope the committee will be given the power to unite with the committees of other towns in the election of a superintendent, for I think this would be one step for the advancement of the schools.

Warrant for Town Meeting

STATE OF MAINE

To Wm. B. Lewis, Constable of the Town of Wiscasset, in the County of Lincoln.

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Wiscasset, qualified by law, to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Franklin Hall in the said town on Monday, the 11th day of March A. D., 1907, at 10 o'clock in the morning, then and there to act on the following articles, viz:

- ART. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside in said Meeting.
- ART. 2. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- ART. 3. To see if the town will choose one Road Commissioner, whose duty shall be to overlook all roads in the town and to oversee all work on said roads.
- ART. 4. To see if the town will vote to pay a man twenty cents per hour for labor on the Highway.
- ART. 5. To see if the town will authorize their selectmen to sell or tear down the "Old Hearse House," so called.
- ART. 6. To see what action the town will take to raise money for exterminating the browntail and gipsy moths pests.
- ART. 7. To see what action the town will take to raise money for fencing and for fixing up the entrance to Hall's Cemetery.
- ART. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended in continuing a state road under the provisions of Chapter 285, Public Laws of 1901, or do or act anything under said chapter.
- ART. 9. To see if the town will vote to give a discount of two per cent. on all taxes paid on or before Sept. 1st, 1907, and to charge interest at the rate of six per cent. on all taxes not paid on or before March 1st, 1908, or do or act anything thereon.
- ART. 10. To see if the town will grant and raise such sums of money

as may be necessary for the maintenance and support of schools and poor and repair of roads and bridges and to defray all other town charges for the ensuing year.

- ART. 11. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of a free high school for the ensuing year.
- ART. 12. To see if the town will accept a clock presented by Capt. Wm. H. Clark to be placed in the Methodist Episcopal church tower, to be cared for and kept in good running order and insured by the town.
- ART. 13. To see if the town will vote to establish a town landing for the use of the public at Wiscasset village and appropriate money therefor.
- ART. 14. To see if the town will authorize their Treasurer to borrow on the faith and credit of the Town, from time to time, the ensuing year, such sums of money as may be necessary for the payment of town charges; such sums to be paid during the current municipal year.
- ART. 15. To see if the Town will accept the list of abatements as prepared by the Selectmen.
- ART. 16. To see if the town will vote to authorize the S. S. Committee to unite with the Committees of adjoining towns in the election of a Superintendent of schools.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting a copy thereof attested by you in a public and conspicuous place in said town seven days at least before the time of holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not to make due return of this warrant, with your doings thereon, to the Selectmen or Town Clerk, on or before the time of holding said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at their office for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters, on Saturday the 9th day of March, 1907, from 10 o'clock in the forenoon until 12 o'clock at noon.
