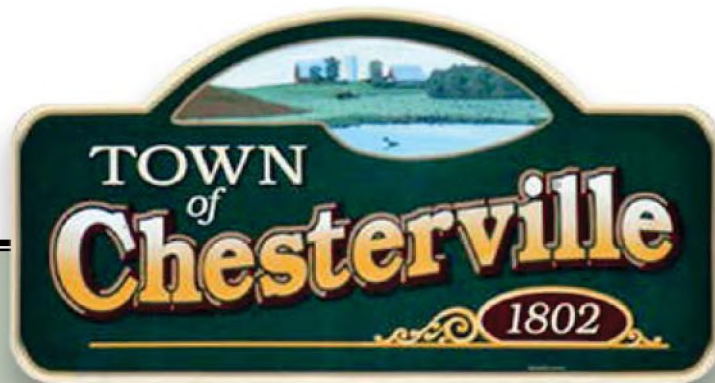

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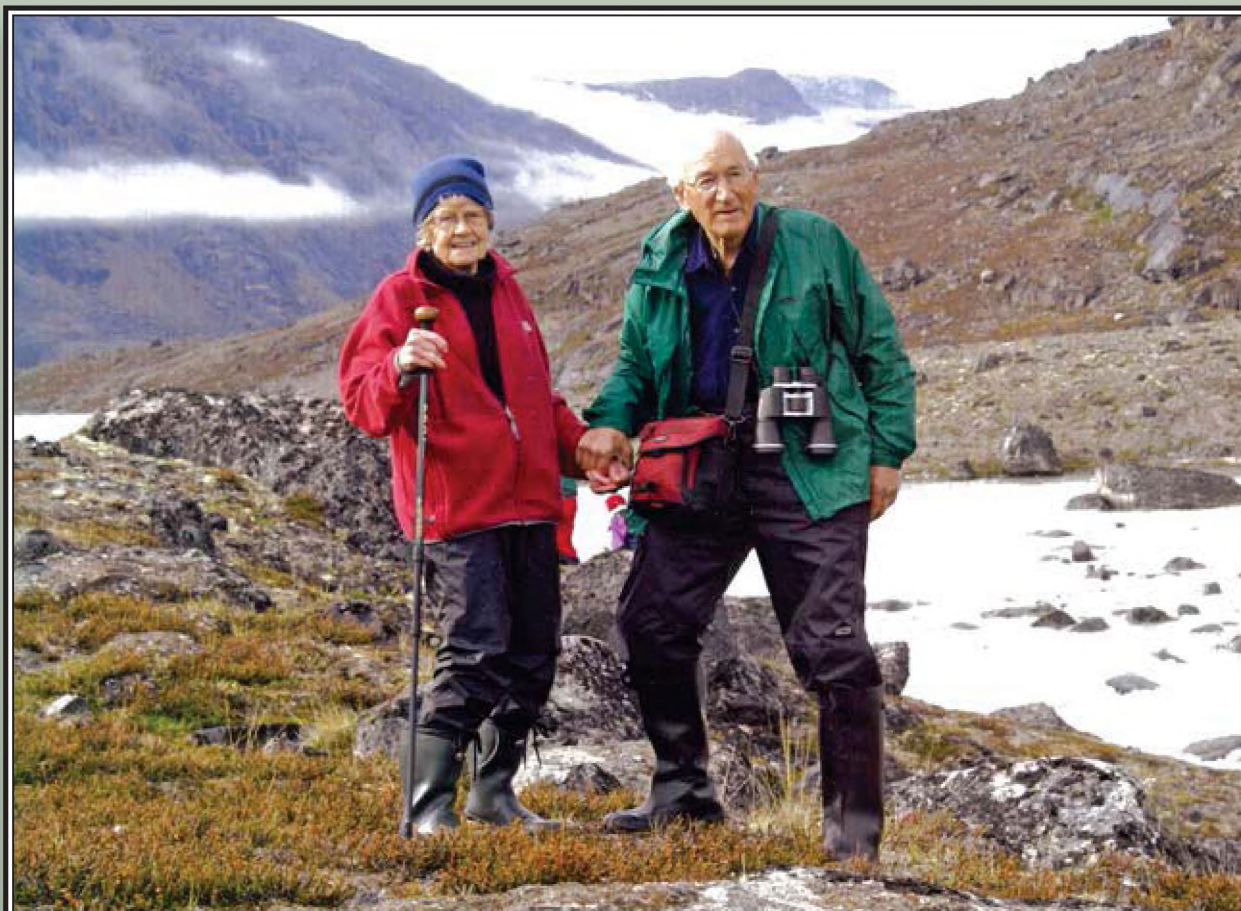
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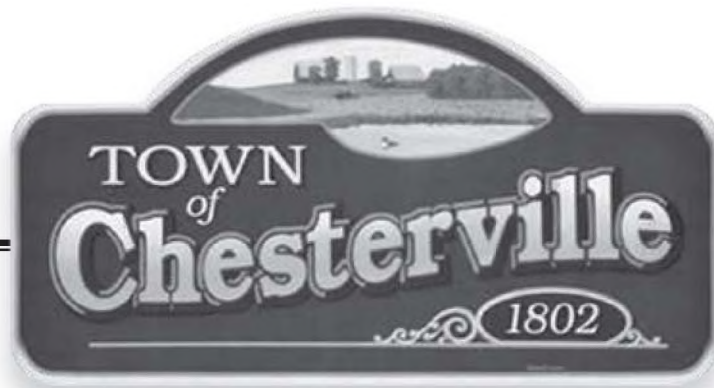

Doc and Joan - A Son Recalls

*Doc and Joan Cooper did sweeten the hearts
Of all who stood in the midst of their love
'Twas the same at the end as it was at the start
Steady and Loyal and Graced from above

And year and year again the senses stung

When Mum and Dad came to Maine from British Columbia, Canada, in the summer of '53, to work for long time Farmington veterinarian Dr. Russell, they were given an apartment in his large home, known around town as the Gingerbread House. Two years later, after having been introduced to the waterways of the near-by town of Chesterville by their friend college professor Charles Prebble, they decided to set out on their own, purchasing and moving into a dilapidated farmhouse on the north shore of Norcross Pond, where Dad began his life as a country vet. "What a spot", I said to Dad 30 summers later, taking in the view as we paddled our canoe toward the sandy beach in front of the house. "You and Mum sure knew how to pick 'em".

"I guess so" said Dad, "but the real reason I wanted this place wasn't so much the house or the pond. It was the opportunity to live next to the Bog Stream. The first time Mr. Prebble took your mother and me there to watch the birds as we floated along, and to eat lunch on the banks of the Little Norridgewock, I knew I was home". That's why Dad was such a great vet. He was at home in nature, and drawn to every single creature in it. Of course he loved all the animals you'd expect him to, the cats and dogs, the farmstock, but Dad also had a special affection for the ones most people didn't like:

*Spiders, bats and rats and rattlesnakes
He loved them all for their own sake
Said every creature has its worth
If it flies or swims or crawls this earth*

Rugged as all get out, afraid of nothing, and the least squeamish person I have ever known, Dad was born to be a large animal vet. Nothing discouraged him, not the four hour birth of a dead calf, not the horse ravaged in the barbed wire, and not the three-days-in-the-hot sun autopsy. He approached it all with his unending enthusiasm and his legendary tenacity. And as the years went by and his power began to ebb, he started asking onlookers for help and he learned to wrestle the critters less with his strength and more with his wisdom. "Common sense, that's always been your dad's secret", said Mum. I'd second that, and add in his deep respect for the salt of the earth farmer, and for those like himself who thrived on hard work, and had somehow kept their childhood sense of wonder.

Dancing with the girl next door

I hardly feel my feet on the floor

Rising and falling again

Till this dance is done and the next one begins

The smartest thing my father ever did was to marry my mother. He didn't have to go too far to find her because she was literally the girl next door, and she complimented him perfectly. Beautiful and refined, and smart enough to graduate from high school two years early, she was already a working nurse by the time she met Dad. She soon helped him focus his interests and head him toward college and veterinary training. After they were married she put the bread on the table while he worked toward graduation, and they had the first of their four children.

Everything Dad accomplished in his career was done in full partnership with Mum. She was his advisor, his secretary, his bookkeeper, his medical assistant, and his best friend. She was a wonderful mother, grandmother and great grandmother as well, and she had a way of making any gathering an occasion. Her cooking skills were legendary, and it can truly be said that never once in his life did Dad complain about any dish that she put in front of him. As they got older I watched their love for each other turn into true reverence. When Mum became too frail to always enjoy preparing food, Dad would take great pleasure in greeting her in the evening with a small glass of wine and some cheese and crackers, or in the morning with a perfectly sliced orange centered on a plate.

How many passings did Mum and Dad oversee down through the years? So many farmers. So many friends. So many loved ones. Both Mr. Prebble and later my father's mother, passed away in my parents' house, having been taken in and lovingly nursed in their final months by my mother. And then of course there were all the animals. So many animals. So many stories. One that sticks in my mind was told to me by Chesterville's very own Matt Welch. Years ago, to please a daughter, he had rescued a baby grey squirrel, and ended up keeping it. It lived quite a few years but eventually when it began to fail, he called up Dad to see what could be done. Apparently Dad took particular interest in the furry rodent, partly because she was calm and let you do just about anything to her, and partly because she was such a unique customer. So over the course of many weeks he tried this remedy and that remedy, hoping to at least delay the inevitable. When he didn't hear from Mat for a while he'd check in, just like he had done countless times with countless people. Nobody asked him to. He just cared. One day when he called up to see how the little guy was doing, Mat informed him that she had passed away. There was a moment of silence and then Dad said, "Well, she sure was a good patient".

Mum always assumed she would precede Dad into the afterlife, but he got there seven months before her.

*You old cowboy you - What's a gal supposed to do
Thought I'd be the one to ride ahead - But I guess you were the one instead
You old cowboy you
Don't know why I should be surprised - You always were the first to rise
Then soon you'd say it's time go - Hardest working man I know
You old cowboy you*

Three years ago, on the day of Dad's funeral, we decided to park his famous red truck, in all its beat up, worn out, million miles glory, in front of the church. As the place began to fill up my wife watched while person after person stopped before going in to reach out and pat that old relic. They patted it, she thought, just like someone would pat a loyal horse, or say good bye to an old cat or a sheep or a cow, or their favorite dog in the whole wide world.

*A thousand conversations in the cab of that old truck
To have you Dad to talk to sure was my good luck
"Don't know what I'd do without you", is what he'd say to me
He said it when I was sixty and he said it when I was three
"Come on and ride me".*

The greatest compliment I could give my parents is to say that even though they weren't born here, even though they came "from away" they somehow managed, through a sixty year career working in a state known for its reserve and its do-it-yourself attitude, to become the rarest of the rare - honorary Mainers. They took to this place, from the endless hours spent crisscrossing its terrain, to the mountains they so loved to climb, to the ever growing wood pile where Dad swung his maul, to the shore land forest where he and my mother now lie, and most of all to Norcross and the Bog Stream and the banks of the Little Norridgewock, where it all began.

As my mother might say:

*So may God's face now shine upon you
May all the creatures that you saw to
In your life come back to bring you joy
May you sit my dear easy in the saddle
Have an old canoe to paddle
And eyes as bright as when you were a boy
Before you grew to be my old cowboy*

**TOWN OF CHESTERVILLE
2017 TOWN MEETING WARRANT**

To: Robert Cox, a Citizen in the Town of Chesterville, County of Franklin, State of Maine.

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Chesterville qualified to vote in Town Affairs, to assemble at the Chesterville Town Office in said Town on Monday, March 13th, 2017 A.D. at 1:00 P.M. until 6:00 P.M. to act on Articles 1 and 2.

And also notify and warn the said inhabitants to meet at the Chesterville Town Hall in said Town on Monday, March 27th, 2017 A.D. at 7:00 P.M. to act on Articles 3 through 49.

ARTICLE: 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ARTICLE: 2. To elect all necessary Town Officers by Secret Ballot.

ARTICLE: 3. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$1,500 (estimate audit is not complete) from Surplus to cover all 2016 overdrafts.

Selectmen and Budget Committee Recommend.

ARTICLE: 4. To see if the Town will vote to increase the property tax levy limit of \$526,974.00 established for the Town of Chesterville by State law, in the event that the municipal budget approved under the warrant articles result in a tax commitment that is greater than the property tax levy limit.

(This has to be voted on by a written ballot).

UNDER LD 1 \$6,020.00

ARTICLE: 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Municipal Officers to spend an amount not to exceed 3/12 budgeted amount in each budget category of the 2017 Annual Budget during the period from January 1, 2018 to the 2018 Annual Town Meeting.

Explanation: This article legalizes the Municipal Expenditures made after the fiscal year ends but before the Annual Town Meeting.

Selectmen and Budget Committee Recommend.

ARTICLE: 6. To see if the Town, in accordance with 36 M.R.S.A. Section 506, will authorize the Tax Collector and Town Treasurer to accept prepayment of taxes not yet committed and to pay no interest thereon.

Selectmen and Budget Committee Recommend.

ARTICLE: 7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire money to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes and pay interest on the Tax Anticipation Note out of overlay.

Selectmen and Budget Committee Recommend.

ARTICLE: 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to carry forward balances as required and to appropriate to their intended purposes.

Explanation: Animal Control Late Fees and Education will be carried forward. All other monies left unspent in an account at the end of the year will be transferred into the General Fund.

ARTICLE: 9. To see if the Town will vote to charge interest on Tax Liens.

ARTICLE: 10. To see if the Taxes will be collected by law, payable on or before December 14, 2017 and interest of 7% annually to be charged starting on December 15, 2017.

ARTICLE: 11. To see if the Town will allow a 3% Discount on Real Estate Taxes for a thirty(30) day period from the post marked date on the Tax Bill.

ARTICLE: 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000.00 to take care of Discounts.

ARTICLE: 13. To see if the Town will set the interest rate pursuant to 36 M.R.S.A. Sec. 506-A, to be paid by the Town on taxes paid and later abated at 3% annually from the date of the tax payment to the date that the abated amount is refunded to taxpayer.

Explanation: If taxes are paid but later abated, the municipality must refund the abated taxes and pay interest on them. For taxes assessed on or after April 1, 1996, 36 M.R.S.A. Sec. 506-A provides that the rate of interest set by the municipality to be paid on overpayments may *not exceed* the rate set for delinquent taxes, *nor be less* than that rate reduced by 4%. Thus if the delinquency rate is 7%, then the town meeting may not set a rate lower than 3.00%.







Town of Chesterville Recall of Selectmen Ordinance

- A. Any Selectman representing the Town of Chesterville may be recalled and removed from office by the qualified voters of the Town of Chesterville as herein provided.
- B. 10 percent or more of the voters of the municipality in the last gubernatorial election may make and file with the Town Clerk an original petition containing the name or names of the Selectman or Selectmen whose removal is sought, and a general statement of the reasons why such removal is desired. The Town Clerk shall thereupon prepare petition blanks for such removal consisting of a copy of the original petition and the general statement printed thereon or attached thereto, which petition blanks shall also contain the signature of said Town Clerk, shall contain the Town's official seal, shall be dated as of the day the petition was filed with the Town Clerk, shall be addressed to the Board of Selectmen, and shall contain the name or names of the person or persons whose removal is sought. The Town Clerk shall file said petition blanks and shall during office hours for the next 20 business days thereafter, keep the same open for signatures by qualified voters of the town. For the recall petition to be effective the signatories to the original petition combined with the signatories to the petition blanks prepared by the clerk must equal at least 20 percent of the registered voters of the town, and to every signature shall be added the place of residence of the signer giving the street and number or description sufficient to identify the place.
- C. At the expiration of said 20 business days, the Town Clerk shall declare the petition closed and shall within 5 business days ascertain whether or not the petition is signed by the requisite number of voters and shall attach thereto his certificate showing the results of such examination.
- D. If the petition is certified by the Town Clerk to be sufficient he shall submit the same with his certificate to the Board of Selectmen at its next meeting and shall notify in person or by regular mail the officer(s) whose removal is sought of such action. The Board of Selectmen shall within five business days of the Town Clerk's certificate call a special town meeting to be held not less than 30 nor more than 40 calendar days thereafter, for the purpose of acting on the petition, and place the petition on the

warrant for that meeting, provided that, if a regular town meeting is to occur within 60 calendar days after the receipt of said certificate, the Board of Selectmen may, in its discretion, instead place the petition on the warrant for the regular town meeting.

- E. If a majority of the written ballots cast concerning the article of recall approves the recall of an elected Selectman or Selectmen, then such recall shall become effective on the day after the date of the vote; provided that the total number of written ballots casts for and against the article equals or exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the total votes cast in the municipality in the last gubernatorial election.

In the event of a successful recall, the candidate(s) to succeed the recalled Selectman or Selectmen for the balance of the unexpired term shall be determined by an election to be held within 20 days.

- F. Should the Board of Selectmen fail or refuse to order an election as herein provided, such election may be called by a Notary Public in the county on written petition of a number of voters equal to 10 percent or more of the number of votes cast in the town at the last gubernatorial election, but in no case less than ten (Title 30-A MRSA Selection 2521(4.))

To the Chesterville Residents:



CODE ENFORCEMENT REPORT

There were 47 building permits issued this year and 6 notifications for exempt projects, for a total of 53. I issued 42 permits and 6 notifications, and the Planning Board issued 5 permits. The number of single-family homes decreased from 8 last year to 7 this year. 5 were stick built, 2 were mobile homes, and we also had 3 seasonal camps built. Building permits for additions to existing single-family home's, sheds, and garages were yet again the highest. Construction cost this past year increased to \$807,478.06 from \$487,056.00 last year. It is estimated that \$506,500.00 of the construction cost was for new stick-built single-family homes, mobile homes, and seasonal camps, throughout the town.

The office has again been very busy this year with inquiries regarding modifications to waterfront property and other property throughout the Town of Chesterville.

The Planning Board continues to review permits for commercial gravel pits, and modifications to camps within the Shoreland Zone. We had two new businesses open in North Chesterville, an Antique Store, and a small retail store with homemade goods to sell. The review of the remaining 2 gravel pits to be licensed will continue in the spring.

I will be continuing to visit properties throughout the Town to check for conformance with the Chesterville Ordinances, particularly waterfront property. It is very important that before you build and/or do other activities, that you contact me at the Town Office to ask if permits or a notification are required. After-the-fact fines start at \$200.00! I now can be reached by email as well at: chestervilleceo@mvfairpoint.net. My hours are Mondays 8 a.m. to 12 p.m., Thursdays 4 p.m. to 8 p.m., and Fridays 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. **Please call and make an appoint to meet with me because site visits are also conducted during these hours.** Thursdays I try to stay in the office from 5-8 p.m. unless there is a situation that needs immediate attention.

I would like to thank everyone for another year of service.

Report for Clearwater Food Pantry 2016

The Clearwater Food Pantry is governed by Clearwater Ministry, a 501c3 organization whose primary focus is the Clearwater Food Pantry serving those residents in the towns of Industry, Chesterville and New Sharon. In 2016 we had 99(an increase of 18) active families with 260 unduplicated individuals served. An average of 180 individuals were served each month with 2200 individuals cumulatively over the year. This number does not include families who access the food pantry for produce and bakery items on a weekly basis.

We would like to thank the towns for their support. Industry made in-kind donations covering the insurance of the pantry building and maintaining the drive and parking area (snow plowing, sanding, and leveling) and Chesterville for their \$500 donation. These resources have been invaluable in maintaining the Clearwater Food Pantry. We had a refrigerator donated to replace one that no longer worked. Shorey Chapel donated Hannaford \$10 Gift Cards for the Thanksgiving baskets and had a free coat give away at the pantry this fall. They also provided backpacks and school supplies for school age children and snacks for children during school vacations. The United Methodist Church in New Sharon continues to donate funds (from a dinner) and food they regularly collect for the pantry. Barclays, in Wilton, donated 8 Thanksgiving Baskets allowing us to serve more families. We also received baskets for Christmas from the Farmington Chamber of Commerce. Industry and Chesterville have collected non-perishable foods items and community members have generously donated monetary funds and needed personal items. We appreciate the efforts of all who were able to donate, monetary or in-kind services including the Cub Scout troop who helped collect food when our shelves were very low.

This year we hope to work with Industry Community Kitchen to have a dinner raising funds for the food pantry. We sponsored a Free Food Truck this spring and hope to again.

We would like to publicly thank the Farmington Hannaford store who generously donates meats, deli, bakery, and produce weekly and Backyard Farms donating tomatoes to us weekly .

Without the dedicated staff and volunteers who pick up and sort food, keep the shelves and freezers stocked, pack the boxes, distribute the food, keep financial records and maintain the paperwork so we can continue, we would not be able to do all we are doing.

The Clearwater Food Pantry is open each Monday 9-11:00AM to all residents of Industry, Chesterville and New Sharon who are in need. If the schools are closed because of weather the food pantry will be closed but will be opened the next school day. For emergency food please call our Pantry Director, Brenda Bickford at 778-3368.

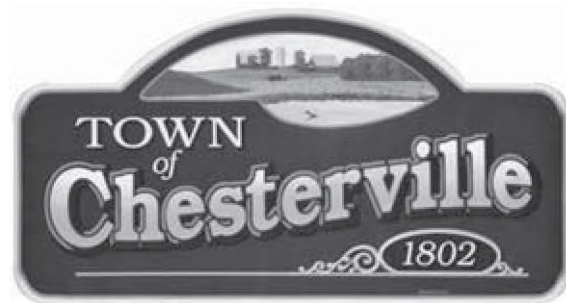

Dear Friends:

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate. I am grateful for the trust the people of our State have placed in me and welcome this opportunity to share some key accomplishments.

Growing our economy by encouraging job creation remains a top priority. The tax relief bill enacted during this last Congress contains provisions I authored to provide small businesses with the certainty that they need to invest, grow, and, most important, hire new workers. The 2017 National Defense Authorization Act includes a provision the Maine delegation worked together to champion requiring that military recruits be provided with athletic footwear made in America, as is required for other equipment and uniform items whenever possible. This is a great victory for our troops and for the 900 skilled workers at New Balance factories here in Maine.

Maine's contributions to our national security stretch from Kittery to Limestone. As a senior member of the Appropriations Committee, I successfully advocated for critical funding for projects at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard and \$1 billion towards the construction of an additional ship that will likely be built at Bath Iron Works. This funding will strengthen the Navy and our national security, and the additional destroyer will help meet the Navy's goal of a 355-ship fleet.

Maine's growing population of older individuals creates many challenges. That's why, as Chairman of the Senate Aging Committee, my top three priorities are fighting fraud and financial abuse directed at our nation's seniors, increasing investments in biomedical research, and improving retirement security.

The Aging Committee's toll-free hotline (1-855-303-9470) makes it easier for senior citizens to report suspected fraud and receive assistance. Last May, a call to the hotline helped lead to the arrest of a national crime ring targeting seniors, and in June I worked to secure the humanitarian release of a Maine senior who had been imprisoned in Spain after being victimized by an international drug smuggling scam.

The Aging Committee also released an extensive report detailing the findings of our bipartisan investigation into the abrupt and dramatic price increases for prescription drugs whose patents expired long ago.


I advocated strongly for the \$2 billion increase in funding for the National Institutes of Health to advance research on such diseases as diabetes and Alzheimer's. I also championed and authored portions of the 21st Century Cures Act that will further support biomedical innovation and make significant reforms to our mental health system.

The Senate also took steps in the past year to combat the nation's heroin and opioid epidemic by passing the Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act (CARA), which I was proud to cosponsor. CARA is a monumental step forward in our effort to address the devastating addiction crisis affecting countless families and communities across the country and right here in Maine.

A Maine value that always guides me is our unsurpassed work ethic. In December 2016, I cast my 6,236th consecutive vote, continuing my record of never missing a roll-call vote since my Senate service began in 1997.

Since being sworn into the Senate in 2013, I have made it my mission to address at the federal level the most important issues facing our great state. Working closely with my colleagues in the Maine Congressional Delegation, we've been able to successfully secure a number of legislative victories that support our state's economy, our rich traditions, and the hardworking people I am proud to represent. In an increasingly polarized Congress, my goal as an Independent is to put partisanship aside, build consensus and further common-sense solutions to address the needs of the American people. To this end, I have co-founded the Former Governors Caucus, a group of former state executives who are frustrated with legislative gridlock and eager to find bipartisan solutions. And as always, I aim to bridge the partisan divide by hosting barbeque dinners in Washington with colleagues ranging from Ted Cruz to Elizabeth Warren. If you know a person's children, then you see them as a mother or father and not a rival vote, and working to further personal dialogue and build relationships can lay the foundation for successful legislation.


One of the accomplishments of which I am most proud is the legislative victory that protects our college students and their families from an expensive hike in student loan interest rates. In 2013, as students faced a significant spike in interest rates that would have taken thousands of dollars out of their pockets, I brought together colleagues from across the political spectrum to broker compromise legislation called the Bipartisan Student Loan Certainty Act. Thanks to this bill, students will save \$50 billion over the next 10 years by lowering their interest rates, which means that a student in Maine will now save between \$3,000 and \$6,000 over the life of their loan.

Being an Independent in the Senate has allowed me to make calls and vote on policies that are best for Maine, but it has also made it possible to play key roles in finding simple solutions and legislative fixes that make good commonsense to both parties. Of course, much of what we do in the Senate doesn't happen on the Senate floor, or even in committee. Instead, it involves working across all levels of government to ensure the State of Maine receives attention and support from the federal government. Take, for example, the opioid and heroin epidemic devastating communities across our state. While Congress has passed legislative solutions aimed at expanding access to medical treatment, I've also pressed for other changes that can be accomplished more quickly and make a more immediate difference in Maine. For example, I successfully urged the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to increase the number of patients to whom a doctor can provide medication-assisted treatment, and in 2015 brought the Director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy to Brewer to meet directly with Mainers and hear their stories. I've also engaged law enforcement – including the Drug Enforcement Agency – to crack down on the production of opioids and work to limit their diversion. Together, Senator Collins and I helped pass the Northern Border Security Review Act to combat drug and human trafficking along our border with Canada. While the opioid epidemic is certainly our biggest public health crisis, job loss in Maine is still our number one economic problem and that's why we need to focus on bringing good paying jobs back to Maine and protecting the ones we still have. As a member of the Armed Services Committee, I teamed up with Senator Collins and Representative Poliquin to successfully secure a provision in the defense bill that can help domestic shoe manufacturers like New Balance. The three of us also worked together with the Department of Commerce to establish an Economic Development Assessment Team, known as an EDAT, to assist Maine's forest industry in the wake of several mill closures. We have an incredible spirit of innovation and ingenuity in Maine and I believe finding ways to invest in that spirit will reignite Maine's forest products sector and our economy. Part of our economic path forward must also include expanding access to high-speed broadband, which can help connect our businesses and communities to information and economic opportunities.

As a member of the Senate Armed Services and Intelligence Committees, I work to keep Maine and our nation safe. Part of that important work means continuing to work for funding for the construction of Navy ships that will be used to protect American interests across the globe. We all know that "Bath Built is Best Built," which is why I've fought to authorize funding for Navy ships built at BIW. The best way to preserve peace is by deterring war through unassailable strength, and to do that we must support our shipbuilders and our brave service members and invest in our military. I strive to meet this solemn responsibility every day as a member of these committees, which is why I hardly ever miss a hearing and take great care in overseeing the agencies sworn to keep us safe. Armed Services Chairman John McCain called me "one of the most serious and hard-working members" of the Committee, and that's a humbling compliment from a true American hero.

One of the greatest honors of my life is serving as your representative in Congress. 


