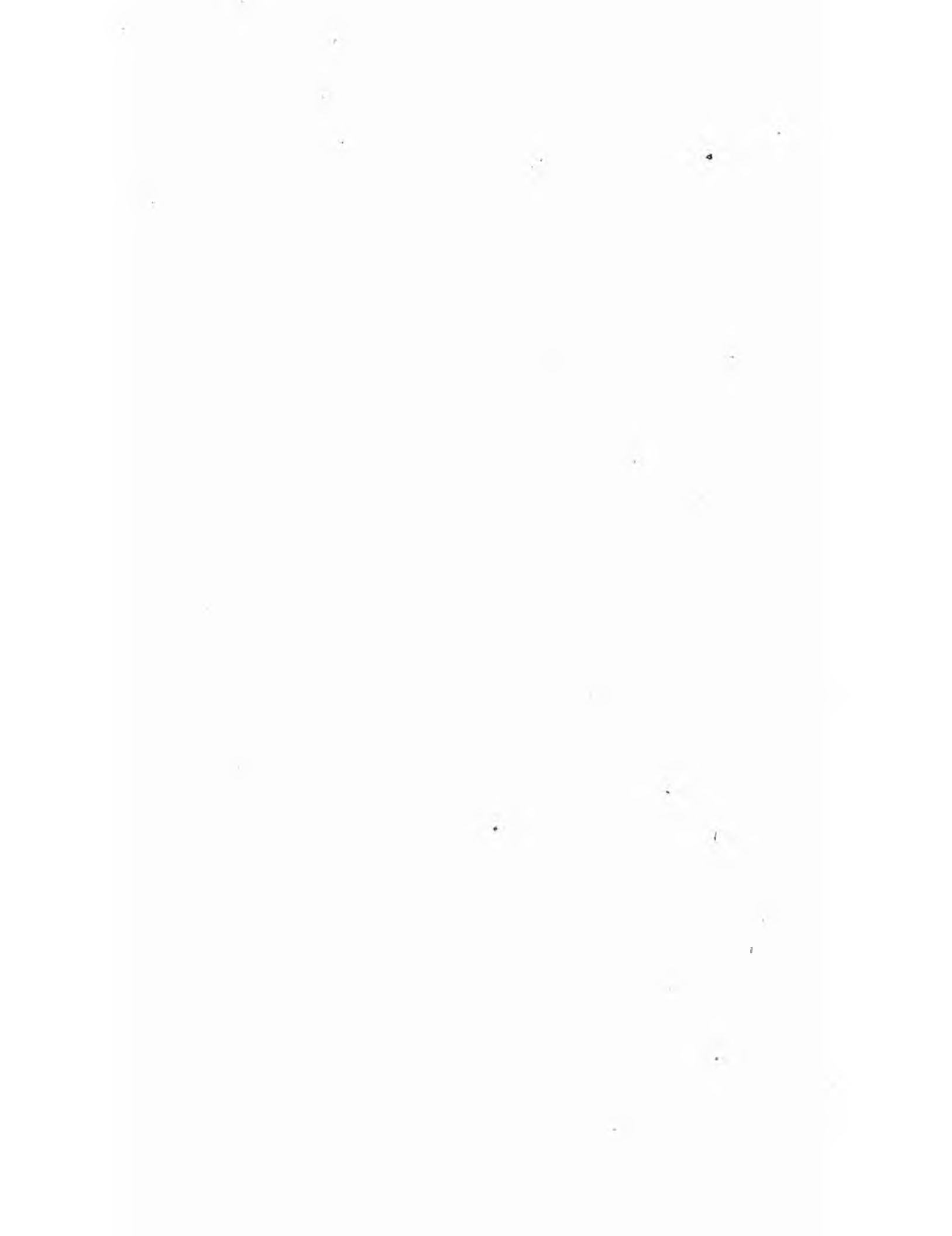

The Wiscasset Fire Company respectfully presents the following report of the work of the company for the year commencing Feb. 27, 1933 and ending Feb. 24, 1934:

Of all these fires there was only one total loss, this was the Dickson house which burned on night of March 23rd, 1933. This fire was practically out of control when discovered and on account of the extremely bad mud condition of the roads there was some delay in reaching the fire. This house has since been rebuilt.

The budget committee for 1934 finds our town in a condition which makes it necessary to raise considerable money to pay unusual expenses incurred during the past year. The largest unusual expense was the cost of caring for the poor. The second largest was the removal of snow. The increased number of property owners unable to pay their taxes deprived our treasury of expected funds. Very careful consideration of our financial condition and the problems con-

fronting our town prompts your committee to recommend the following budget for this year:

SCHOOL REPORT

To the Citizens of Wiscasset, GREETINGS:

The same eight schools have been maintained this year as last year, with enrollments since September 11, 1933 as follows: Primary school, 41; Intermediate school, 35; Second Grammar school, 38; First Grammar school, 33; Birch Point school, 5; South school, 13; North school, 16; Lowelltown school, 7. Attendance and progress have been excellent in all these schools. Board has been furnished to one scholar. All expense to the Town of conveyance has been avoided.

All financial items connected with the schools are shown elsewhere in this town report, and I suggest that you study them carefully. You will observe that the Common School Fund is overdrawn. This is due to the uncertainty of the State Refund, which in these times shows wide variations resulting from the fluctuations of the 3 1-3 mil school tax. We know that the State has lost revenue through loss of bank assets and decrease in business activities on which this 3 1-3 mill tax is levied. This accounts for the decrease in the State Refund. We hope the upswing of business in the State will continue, thus increasing the State revenues.

The overdraft in the Common School Fund is largely offset, however, by the unexpended balance in the School Repairs Account, so that the School Department as a whole shows only a small deficit. Considering the difficulties with which your School Committee has had to contend I consider this showing as very favorable.

If there are any Wiscasset taxpayers who feel that their schools are costing them too much, I should like to call your attention to the fact that both your municipal and your school rates of taxation are below the

average for the State of Maine. The average municipal rate is .048 in Maine, where the rate for Wiscasset is .042. The average school rate is .01087 whereas the school rate for Wiscasset is .00677. These figures show plainly that the taxpayers of Wiscasset are raising only a little over half of the amount for your schools that the average Maine town is raising, according to your taxable assets. I think I know the people of Wiscasset well enough to know that they believe in education, and will not permit their school system, so carefully built up by public-spirited citizens, to suffer any serious set-back.

Four of your teachers are now contributing 5% of their pay to the Maine Teachers' Retirement Association. This contribution is not optional with these teachers, but compulsory, in accordance with the Revised Statutes of Maine.

The elements continue to assault our school buildings in depression times as well as in times of prosperity, and it is hardly economy to allow these buildings to suffer neglect in spite of the scarcity of funds. The grammar school roof is in need of attention, and should be shingled this summer. The boys' toilets in this building have been declared in need of modernization by health officials, and there seems no choice but to remedy this condition at once. Special articles are being inserted in the Town Warrant for discussion of these repairs, and I am inclined to believe your judgment will show you the wisdom of providing for attention to these items. The regular Repairs and Insurance Account is inadequate to care for these repairs, especially since insurance premiums, maturing during 1934-1935, will require over \$500 from this account for proper renewal.

The following appropriations are recommended for 1934-1935:

This report might be extended indefinitely, but it seems best to touch only the most essential points, in the interests of economy.

ART. 9 To choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year, including a member of the School Committee for three years.

ART. 10 To see if the town will vote 'Yes' or 'NO' on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Sec. 20, Chap. 28, Revised Statutes of 1930.

ART. 11 To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sec. 19, Chap. 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Sec. 3, Chapter 175, Public Laws of 1933.

ART. 12 To see if the town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of \$626.70 or any other amount for the maintenance of state and state aid highways, during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under provisions of the Revised Statutes of 1930, and the Public Laws of 1931.

ART. 13 To see if the town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of \$446.00 for the maintenance of Third Class Highways, as required by Sec. 5 of Chapter 175, Public Laws of 1933, relative to Third Class Highways.

ART. 14 To see what action the town will take in regard to the discontinuance of the Birch Point Bridge.

ART. 15 To see what action the town will take in

same regard to the discontinuance of the Birch Point School and the Lowell Town School.

ART. 16 To see if the town will vote to appropriate and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for interest and reduction of Town Debt, Common Schools, text books and supplies, repairs and insurance school buildings, town farm and poor, fire department, town officers and superintendent of schools, health officer, repair of sidewalks, repair of highways, surface treatment of village streets, blasting on highways, repair of bridges, removal of bushes on improved roads, maintenance of Westport Ferry, snow removal, snow fence, town landing, street lights, hydrant rental contingent fund, mothers' aid, cemetery improvements, Wiscasset Public Library, pine blister rust control, state ward, and to defray all other necessary town charges for the ensuing year.

ART. 17 To see if the town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of two hundred and ninety-five dollars to complete the shingling of grade school building.

ART. 18 To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the boys' toilet in grade school building.

ART. 19 To see if the sum of \$50.00 or more will be raised for school nursing in the town of Wiscasset under the auspices of the Bureau of Health of the State Department of Health and Welfare. As the amount of appropriation increases, the length of service will be greater.

ART. 20 To see if the town will vote to authorize

its Superintending School Committee to make a contract with the Trustees of Wiscasset Academy for the tuition of its scholars, qualified to attend such school, in accordance with the Revised Statutes and the Public Laws of 1931.

ART. 21 To see what sum of money the town will vote to appropriate and raise for maintenance for a free high school for the ensuing year.

ART. 22 To see if the town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of \$100.00 to reimburse Che-wonki Tribe, No. 112, Improved Order of Red Men, for the use of their hall for practice for basket ball teams of the Wiscasset Academy, or take any action relative thereto.

ART. 23 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to procure a temporary loan or loans in anticipation of taxes for the purpose of paying indebtedness of the town. Such notes to be paid during the current municipal year out of money raised during said current municipal year by taxes.

ART. 24 To receive the report of the Committee appointed to investigate the cost of repairing and refurnishing Town Farm; and to see if the town will vote to repair and refurnish the Town Farm and what sum it will appropriate and raise therefor; and to see if the town will vote to appoint a committee to supervise such repairing and refurnishing. 5/1000.

ART. 25 To see if the town will vote to fix a time limit for the payment of poll taxes within the current municipal year for which the tax is assessed.

ART. 26 To see if the town will vote to change the approach to the Holbrook road or do or act anything regarding the same. Also to see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the same.

ART. 27 To see if the town will vote to make necessary repairs and improvements on the interior of the Selectmen's Office, and what sum the town will raise and appropriate for same.

ART. 28 To see if the town will vote to adopt the same wage scale as will be established by the Highway Department of the State of Maine, for work on town ways and bridges, or take any action relative thereto.

ART. 29 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to gravel the Chewonki Road, so called, or what action they will take relative thereto.

ART. 30 To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the Auditor.

ART. 31 To choose a Budget Committee of five members.

ART. 32 To see what action the town will take relative to an alleged claim in favor of the Wiscasset Water Company for the sum of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) against said town, or do or act anything relative thereto.

Art. 33 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by post-

ing a copy thereof, attested by you, in a public and conspicuous place in said town, seven days at least, before the time of holding said meeting.

Hereof, fail not and due return make of this warrant to the Selectmen or Town Clerk, with your doings thereon, on or before the time of holding said meeting.
