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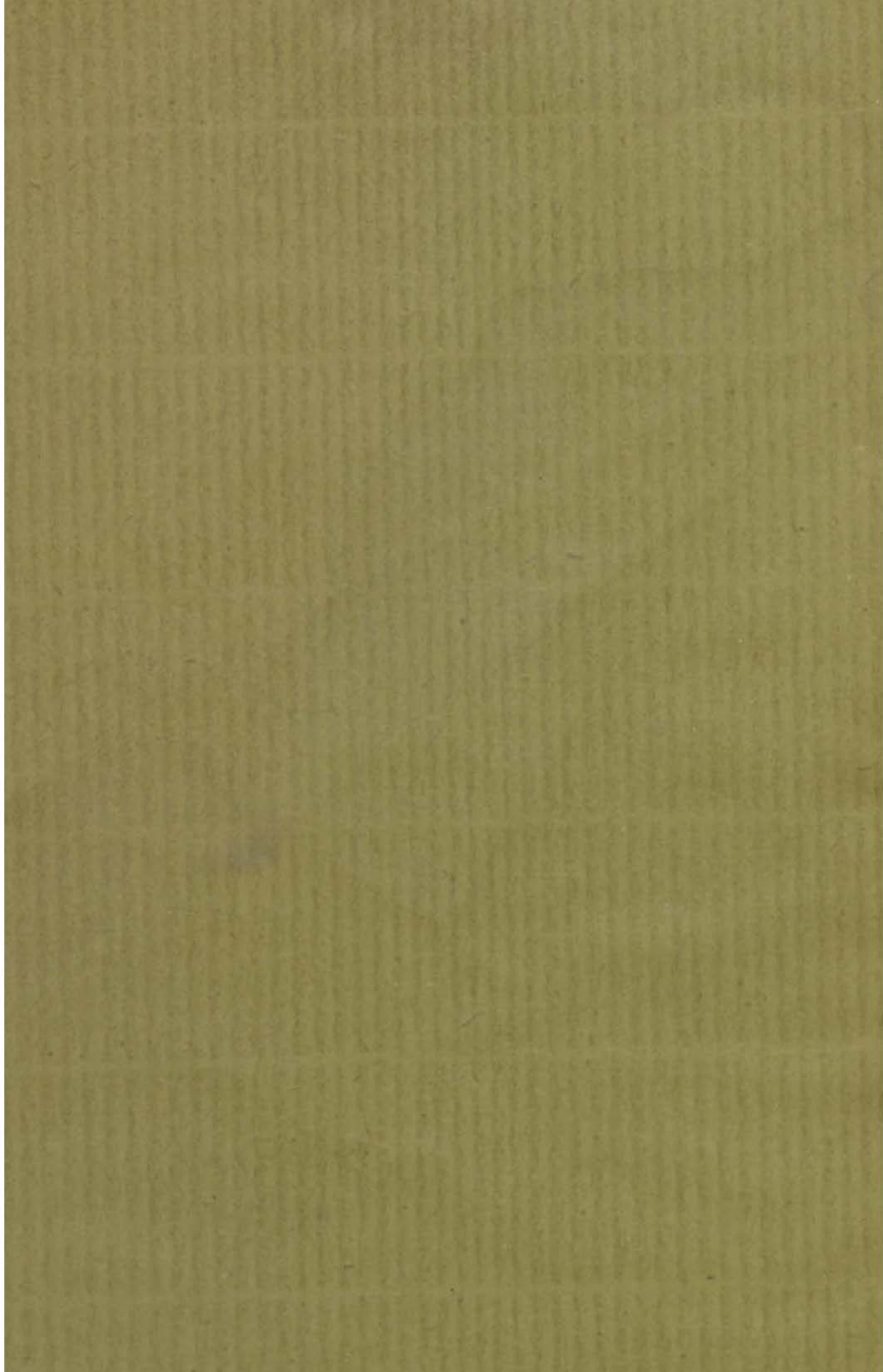

WARRANT

STATE OF MAINE.

To B. W. FADEN, a constable in the town of Carmel, in said county.

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Carmel, qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at the Town House in said town on Monday, the second day of March A. D., 1914, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the town report as printed.

Art. 4. To elect three or more selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor.

Art. 5. To elect town treasurer.

Art. 6. To elect one member of S. S. Committee.

Art. 7. To elect one or more town constables.

Art. 8. To elect one or more fire wardens; fix his compensation, and raise a sum of money for the same.

Art. 9. To see what sums of money the town will raise for support of schools, and the poor, and the repairs of roads and bridges; for contingent expenses, for school books, for repairs on school houses, and for tuition expenses.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to paint Village Cemetery fence and raise money for the same, and the North Carmel Cemetery fence and raise money for the same.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to paint the town house and build a platform in front of house and raise money for the same.

Art. 12. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the the sum of one hundred dollars to be expended in equipment for Fire Department at Carmel Village.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriation and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State aid, as provided in section 20 of chapter 130 of the Public laws of 1913.

Art. 14. To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$533 for the section of State aid road as outlined in the report of the State highway commission, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provision of section 19 of chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

Art. 15. To see whether the town will vote to raise money and what sum for the maintenance of State highways during the ensuing year within the limits of the town, under the provision of section 9 of chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to have a school in School District No. 4 and No. 8 for the ensuing year.

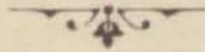
Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise thirty dollars and donate the same to C. K. Johnson Post for Memorial services.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to accept the list of Jurors as prepared by the municipal officers, town treasurer and town clerk.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the Town House at nine-thirty o'clock in the forenoon of the said meeting.

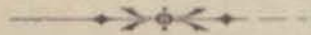
