## Warrant

PENOBSCOT SS.

STATE OF MAINE.

To B. W. FADEN, a constable in the town of Carmel, in said County.

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Carmel, qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at the Town House in said town on Monday, the first day of March A. D., 1915, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a town clerk.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the town report as printed.
- Art. 4. To elect three or more selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor.
  - Art. 5. To elect town treasurer.
  - Art. 6. To elect one member of school committee.
  - Art. 7. To elect one or more town constables.
  - Art. 8. To elect a collector of taxes.
- Art. 9. To elect one or more fire wardens; fix his compensation and raise money for the same.
- Art. 10. To elect all other town officers as required by law to be chosen at the annual town meeting.
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of schools, and the poor, and repairs of roads and bridges; for contingent expenses, for school books, for repairs on school houses, for tuition expenses, and for cutting bushes on highways.

- Art. 12. To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriation and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State aid as provided in Section 20 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will approrpriate and raise the sum of \$533 for the section of State aid road as outlined in the report of the State highway commission, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provision of Section 19 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.
- Art. 14. To see whether the town will vote to raise money and what sum for the maintenance of State and State aid highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provision of Section 9 and 18 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will raise to reconstruct bridge located at Station 707 and 735 on State highway.
- Art. 16. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars to be expended on Plymouth road commencing at Etna town line.
- Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise thirty dollars and donate the same to the C. K. Johnson Post for Memorial services.
- Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise one hundred dollars to purchase metal culverts with.

- Art. 19. To see if the town will raise one hundred dollars to be expended in repairs on cemetery fences in town.
- Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars to be expended on the road from the Five Corners to the Railroad Crossing at Damascus.
- Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars to be expended on road from Austin Miller's to Hermon's town line.
- Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars to be awarded in prizes for the Boys and Girls Agriculture Clubs of Carmel.
- Art. 23. To see how much money the town will raise to support a free high school.

The selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the Town House in said town at nine-thirty o'clock in the forenoon of the said meeting.

#### REMARKS

As may be seen by reference to the appended statistics for the year, there is need of punctuality of the pupils. A large variety exists in the number of tardy marks for different schools in the same locality. Punctuality is a part of education and should be encouraged by parents. The Committee has given prompt attention to all necessary repairs as far as possible. The old-fashioned plank desks have been removed from number seven school and modern desks put in their place. A new floor has been laid also.

Little change has been made in the course of study. The Silver-Burdett Arithmetic has been introduced to take the place of the old text which was badly worn.

The schools are well supplied with text books and only a few will be needed the coming year to replace worn out books.

Most of the teachers I have found devoted to their work. Whatever success has attended the work has been due in a large measure to their untiring efforts.

Whole number of pupils in town April 1, 1914, 253 Whole number weeks taught for year 300.

The town of Carmel received no apportionment out of the equalization fund for the year 1914. This fund is apportioned to those towns whose rate of taxation for common school purposes is considerably in excess of the average rate for the State. The rate of the town of Carmel was considerably below the average in 1913.
