Annual Report of Public Health Nursing Service in Carmel for the year 1967

The effectiveness of a community health service depends to a large extent on the interest in and the understanding of the public health program by all citizens of that community. It is essential that they appreciate the value of that service. From a personal standpoint they should be interested in the program because the individual's physical, emotional and economic needs affect other citizens, and because the cost of this service is directly or indirectly borne by the individual taxpayers of the community.

The public health nurse maintains a program of guidance and education by teaching health rules and assisting in the prevention of disease and deformity, thus lessening

human suffering.




