# REPORT OF SELECTMEN AND TOWN MANAGER

To the Citizens of Carmel:

The Board of Selectmen and Town Manager respectfully submit the following report of activities for the year ending December 31, 1969.

- 1. Town Road Improvement—approximately 1/4 of a mile of new construction on the Five Road.
- 2. State Aid Construction—the money raised was held over until this year for construction on the Hinckley Hill Road.
- 3. Cutting Bushes—Cleared the four corners at Irish Road, Hinckley Hill Road and corner of the Dyer Road.
- 4. Town Dump—pushed back and burned regularly. Poison applied and gravel hauled in when needed.
- 5. Special State Aid Construction—a special grant of \$8,500 was allocated to Carmel and the State rebuilt a section of the Fuller Road.
- 6. Town Road Tar—mulch and seal was applied to the Pomeroy Road, Fuller Road and Church Street.
- 7. Permanent Bridge Fund—new steel and concrete bridges were installed on the Haskell Road and the Marcho Road. New timbers were applied on the Robinson Mill Road Bridge.
- 8. Salt and Sand—800 yards of sand was stockpiled for winter use.
- 9. Cemeteries—a plot of land joining the North Carmel Cemetery was donated to the Town by Milton and Dora Connors. Arrangements have been made to have the lots planned and staked out in this plot and also the Highland Cemetery.

The Town Office is open Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., on Tuesday and Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m., and on Monday evening from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. The Selectmen meet at the town office Monday evenings at 7:30 p.m.

## CIVIL DEFENSE REPORT

To the Residents of the Town of Carmel:

With this report comes the end of another year of Civil Defense activities and what the Director considers successful in many categories, also with the assistance of many local people.

We would like to point out that radio monitoring is in effect 15 to 20 hours daily, with not so many hours on Sunday, but could be put into operation within minutes of any emergency, with not less than 20 persons ready to assist in the projects.

The Carmel Emergency Radio Club, Inc., now headed by its new president, Mr. George Cumming, has assured us that the same cooperation will continue in every category they are qualified to assist. Under last year's president, Mr. Lloyd Marcho, Jr., the following assists were given to law enforcement agencies within the area.

Three search parties, all of a serious nature, assisted the Sheriff's Office several times at their request.

We would also like to bring to the attention of all residents of the area, the possible curtailment of ambulance service. The State law requires many services along with qualified personnel to perform the same. It is a herculean task to obtain volunteers and just one or two will not be enough. This project needs the individual assistance of every resident to assist financially for the training of personnel so that a shortage of qualified persons cannot arise in any given emergency. Please bear in mind that this is a suggestion and that this is not under Civil Defense in any way.

Article 20. Shall Article VIII, Section 3 of the Carmel Zoning Ordinance be amended to read—"Any person in the Commercial Zone owning a building which has been destroyed by fire or other cause shall have the right to rebuild or repair, regardless of the size of the lot, providing it is still owned by the same party and is not a detriment to the neighborhood".
