REPORT OF SELECTMEN AND TOWN MANAGER

To the Citizens of Carmel:

The Board of Selectmen and Town Manager respectfully submit the following report of activities for the year ending December 31, 1973.

- 1. Town Road Improvement: The funds received for Town Road Improvement were expended, with other funds, for construction of the Pomeroy Road. The Pomeroy Road had to be constructed wholly by Town funds. The State did not accept the road as a State Aid Road.
- 2. State Aid Construction: No further State Aid Construction was done on Hinckley Hill Road this past year. However, the funds appropriated in 1973 had been anticipated the previous year and were, therefore, paid to the State.
- 3. Cutting Bushes: No money was spent for cutting bushes in 1973. We have carried it forward and with the appropriation for this year, we hope to do some cutting and spraying.
- 4. Town Roads and Bridges: Several tons of hot patch was applied to the Fuller Road to get it ready for paving. Culverts were replaced or lowered in several places. Gravel was applied to the Swett Road, Marcho Road, Murray Road, Dyer Road and Hinckley Hill Road.
- 5. Town Road Tar: Hot Top was applied to the Fuller Road from Fitts' residence to the Irish Road four corners, also, from the Irish Road four corners up the Pomeroy Road to the Levant Town line. We feel this was a major improvement in the Town.
- 6. Salt and Sand: 1200 yards of sand was added to the stockpile, which gave us about 1500 yards to start the season. It looks as though we may have a sizeable amount left over for next year.

- 7. Town Dump: Again, our thanks to the contractors who have taken care of the dump the past year. We know our days are numbered for open burning and the present location of the dump. The Planning Board and Municipal Officers will probably have articles for your consideration in the coming year.
- 8. State Revenue Funds were received and applied directly to taxes to reduce the rate.
- 9. Federal Revenue Sharing Funds received were placed in the trust fund. The only appropriation from the funds was \$18,000.00 for Highways.
- 10 Town Hall Lot: At last the old Town safe is down and the cellar filled in and leveled. No definite plans have been made for future use of the lot.
- 11. McGown Store Lot: We are still holding the money in escrow for the purchase of this lot. The papers are in the hands of the attorneys.

The Town Office is open Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., on Tuesday and Thursday from 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 A.M., and on Monday evening from 7:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M.

The Selectmen meet at the town office on Monday evenings at 7:30 P.M. You are welcome to attend and offer suggestions for the betterment of the Town.

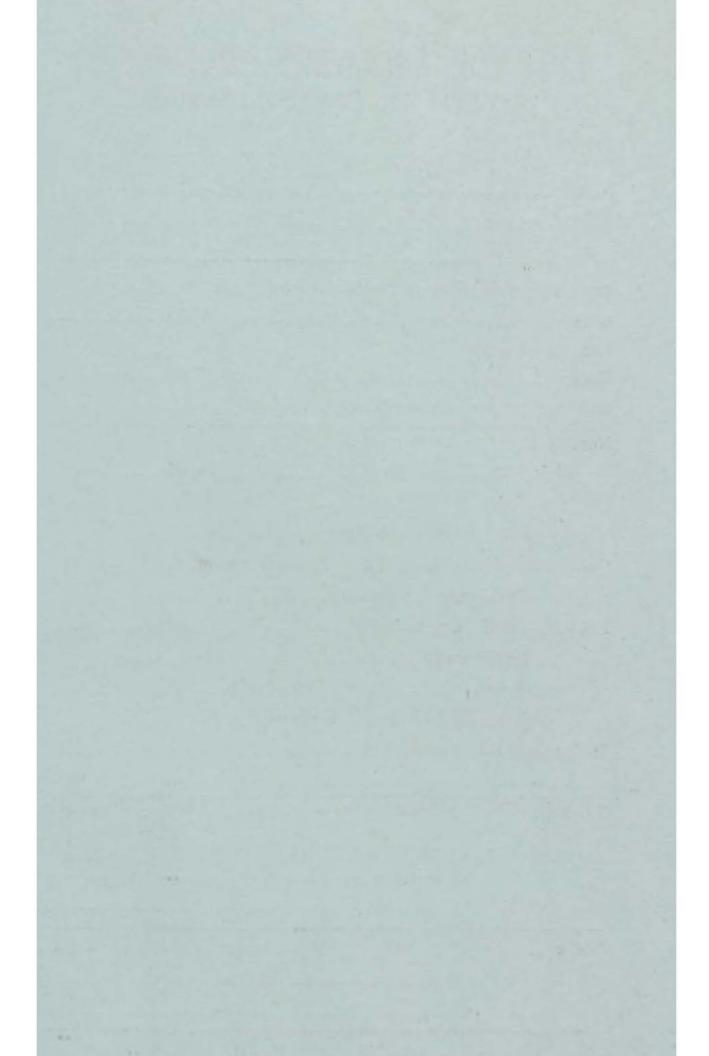

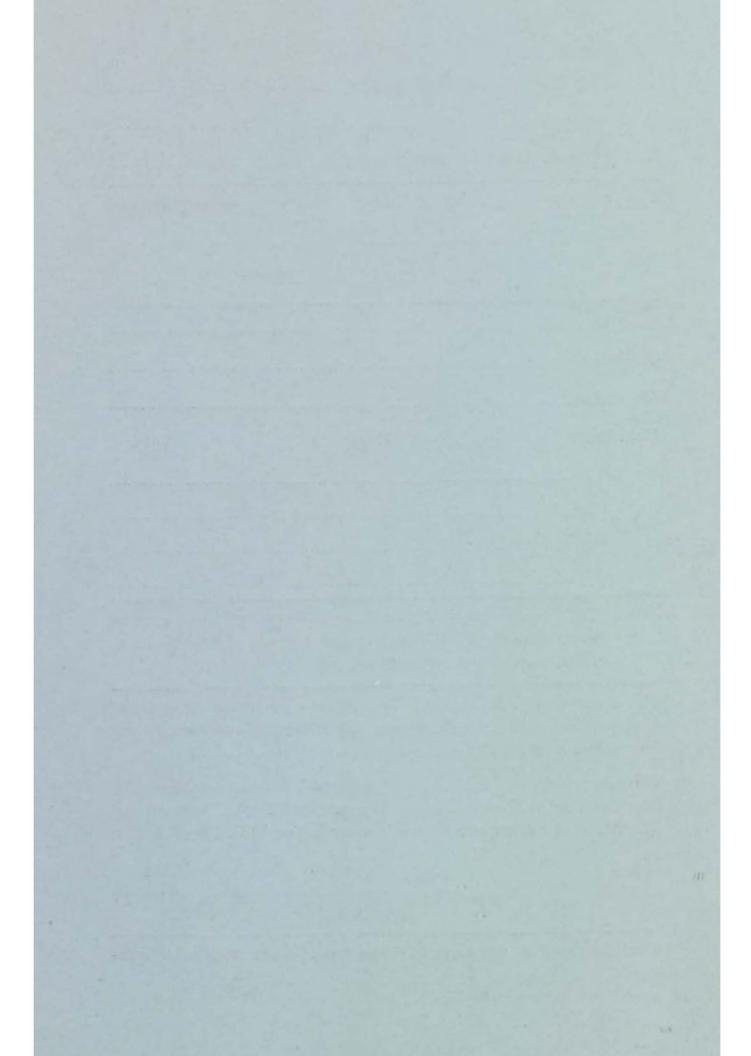

AUDITOR'S REPORT

February 12, 1974

Board of Selectmen Carmel, Maine

In accordance with Title 30, Section 5253, Maine Revised Statutes Annotated of 1964, as amended, an audit has been conducted of the financial records of the Town of Carmel for the year ended December 31, 1973.

The examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

In our opinion, the exhibits and schedules incorporated in this report, present fairly the financial position of the Town at December 31, 1973, and the results of its operations for the period indicated.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

The system of internal control was reviewed as it pertained to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern. Cash accounts were verified by reconciliation of bank statements and/or bank confirmation.

An analysis was made of receipts and deposists as well as disbursements and bank charges. Vouchers, payrolls and canceled checks were examined on a selective basis. Letters of confirmation were used on a test basis to verify the correctness of recorded assets and liabilities.

Revenue accruing to the municipality from various sources was examined and checked to pertinent records. Records of town and selectmen's meetings, as they pertained to financial matters, were checked. Federal revenue sharing, trust and reserve fund transactions were reviewed and investments were verified. Surety bond and insurance coverages were determined.

COMMENTS OPERATIONAL RESULTS

The fiscal year's operations showed that a net unexpended departmental balance of \$8,017.24 was lapsed to unappropriated surplus, per the following summary:

Departmental Accounts:	
Unexpended Balances	\$13,532.16
Overdrafts	5,514.92
Net Unexpended Balance	\$ 8,017.24

The unallocated excise tax revenue unexpended balances in the contingent and costs and interest accounts less overdrafts in the town road tarring and welfare accounts were the major factors contributing to the net amount lapsed to surplus. The records did not indicate that the legislative body had voted to allow overdrafts in appropriation accounts.

The following comments pertain to the accompanying financial statements:

ASSETS . . . The general fund cash balance totaled \$85,602.23 and federal revenue sharing funds amounted to \$18,289.71 at December 31, 1973. The bank balances used in reconciling this amount were confirmed by the depositories. Petty cash was counted.

Accounts receivable of \$12.00 consisted of amounts due from a municipality for welfare expenditures.

Taxes receivable totaled \$19,299.79 of which \$19,207.74 represented current year accounts. The remaining balance of \$92.05 was for delinquent accounts dating from 1971. Tax liens and tax acquired property amounted to \$2,330.49 and \$2,136.02 respectively.

LIABILITIES, RESERVES AND SURPLUS . . . The departmental accounts showed an unexpended balance of \$16,693.50 carried forward to the ensuing year in accordance with customary practice and/or pending further financial activity.

Federal revenue sharing payments for the entitlement periods January 1, 1972 to June 30, 1972, July 1, 1972 to December 31, 1972, January 1, 1973 to June 30, 1973 and the first quarterly payment for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1973 amounted to \$32,304.00. Interest earnings credited to the account was \$985.71. Appropriated federal revenue sharing funds of \$18,000.00 were allocated to the town's operating account and expended for public transportation purposes. Unappropriated funds totaled \$15,289.71 at December 31, 1973. At the year end, \$18,289.71 was on deposit in a savings account of which \$3,000.00 was due the general fund.

The unappropriated surplus amounted to \$94,256.74, a decrease of \$7,560.29 for the year. This change was occasioned principally by the voter authorized transfers for tarring town roads and purchase of the McGown Lot for future town purposes less the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed, income from general fund investments and gain on sale of tax acquired property.

TRUST AND RESERVE FUNDS Trust fund principals totaled \$12,697.71 and unexpended income was \$1,457.57 at year end.

Capital reserve funds of \$587.53 and \$10,629.09 were for future fire department and general building projets respectively.

A credit reserve fund of \$5,642.20 was established for emergency tax relief.

All trust and reserve funds are on deposit in the Bangor Savings Bank, Bangor, Maine.

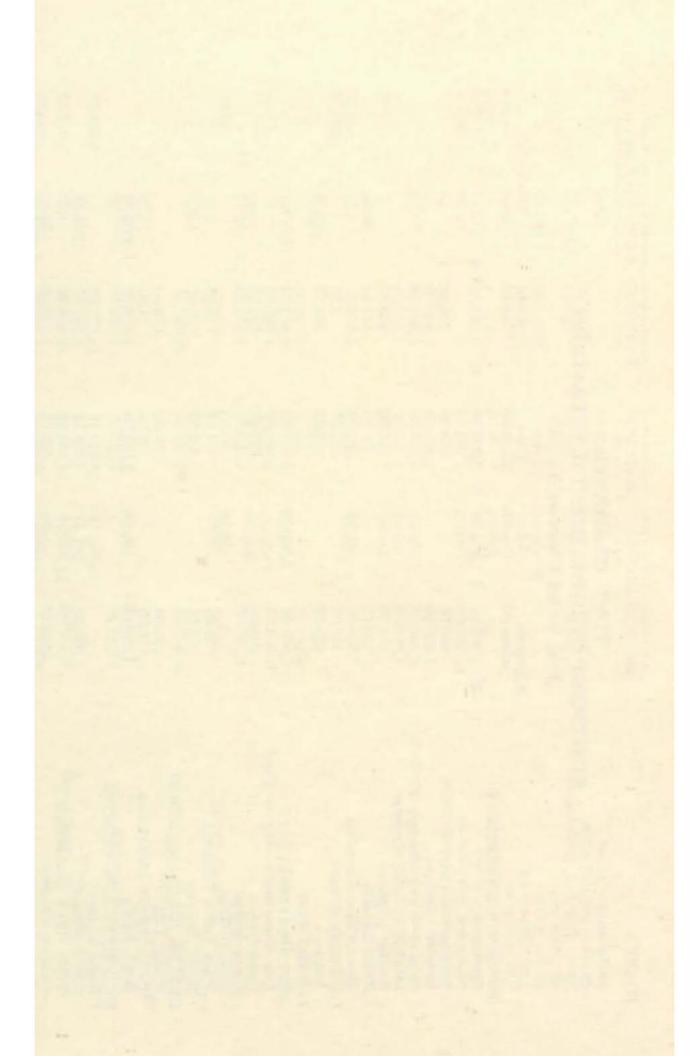

Article 8. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise or appropriate for Highways.

Budget Committee \$5,800.00

Article 9. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise or appropriate for Health and Sanitation.

Budget Committee \$1,600.00

Article 10. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise or appropriate for Charity Accounts.

Budget Committee \$3,000.00

Article 11. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise or appropriate for the following accounts:

Tax Discounts \$1,500.00

Municipal Development 500.00

Tax Maps 100.00

Budget Committee \$2,100.00

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the excise tax receipts toward the following accounts:

Snow Removal \$6,000.00
Town Roads & Bridges 6,000.00
Town Road Tar 6,000.00

Budget Committee "yes"

Article 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise or appropriate for State road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Title 23, MRSA, Sections 1101, 1103, or 1104.

Budget Committee \$1,800.00

- Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to pay State Wages for labor and trucks working on Town Roads.
- Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to fix a date when taxes shall be due and payable, and to set a rate of interest to be paid after that date.

Recommend October 30 and 3/4 of one percent, a month.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote an abatement (discount) on taxes paid in full before a certain date, and to establish such rate of discount.

Recommend 3 percent discount on taxes paid in full within 30 days from date of billing.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the Town to sell and dispose of real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quit-claim deeds for such property.

Article 18. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise or appropriate for construction of the Spratt Road from the corner of the Dyer Road to the power line.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise or appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the General Building Fund.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$300.00 from the Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund to be used for advertising and audit expenses pertaining to said Trust Fund.

Article 21. Shall Article VII of the Carmel Zoning Ordinance be amended to read as follows?

ARTICLE VII

MINIMUM AREA AND SET BACK REGULATIONS

1. Dimensions. In the residential-farming, commercial and indusdustrial zones, no single family dwelling or individual mobile home outside a mobile home park shall occupy a lot measuring less than one (1) acre in area and 150 feet along the front. No two-family dwelling shall occupy a lot measuring less than one and one-half (1½) acres and 200 feet along the front and for each additional dwelling unit above two, there shall be provided an additional one-half (½) acre of area on the lot and an additional 20 feet of frontage. Frontage shall mean frontage along an accepted public way or an approved private way.

This amendment does not apply to individual lots in existence before the acceptance of this amendment. In the residentialfarming zone, no lot shall be occupied by more than one dwelling unit.

- 2. Set Back Regulations.—no change.
- 3. Living Space. No dwelling, including mobile homes, (exclusive of additions thereto) shall be constructed upon a lot or moved onto another lot unless said dwelling shall contain at least 500 square feet of living space, with a minimum of 500 square feet of ground floor space.
- 4. Limitation—Lot Size, No lot shall be reduced in size to less than one (1) acre in area and 150 feet frontage on a public way or approved private way by transfer, title, lease, or otherwise. All lots shall be staked with permanent markers.
- 5. Existing Lots. The present provisions of the Zoning Ordinance relating to non-conforming uses shall continue to apply to existing lots.

Article 22. Small Article IX, sub-section c. of the Carmel Zoning Ordinance be amended to read as follows?

ARTICLE IX

Sub-section c. Foundations for dwelling and light structures may be of plain concrete, reinforced concrete, or masonry. Except, where mat or floating foundations are used, all foundations shall extend below the frost line. For heavy structures, conventional systems of spread footings, caissons, or piles may be used. All structures or dwellings shall be enclosed at the base with suitable building materials.
