REPORT OF SELECTMEN AND TOWN MANAGER

To the Citizens of Carmel:

Only one Town Meeting was held during 1995, which was the annual meeting held on March 4th, when voting for the municipal officers was held on Saturday, at the Golden Harvest Grange Hall, and then the balance of the articles were voted on at the Carmel Elementary School, on the following Monday evening. A total of \$236,432.88 was approved to be assessed from Real Estate Taxes, \$159,921.25 was approved to be spent from Surplus, and \$171,680.80 was approved to be spent from Excise Tax. This year, if the budget is approved, as recommended by the Selectmen, the assessment from Real Estate Taxes will be \$251,683.68, \$166,040.00 will be appropriated from Surplus, and \$176,180.80 will be appropriated from Excise Taxes. Although the amount to be assessed from real estate taxes is \$15,250.80 greater than last year, bear in mind that new buildings and mobile homes will result in an increase in local valuation, which will help to offset this increase. The S.A.D. #23 Budget, (unknown at this time), but as projected, would result in approximately a \$72,000.00 increase over last year's amount. The County Tax will also show increase. In spite of these increases, the Assessors will strive to keep the tax rate as low as possible.

Last year the annual town reports were mailed to each household rather than being hand delivered. If there were problems and you did not receive yours, please call the town office so that we may get your correct address. We will be mailing them again this year.

Amounts lapsed to Surplus from the Municipal Agent and Town Clerk were as follows: Automobiles \$3,642.00; Boat Excise Taxes and Agent Fees \$2,625.60; ATV agent fees \$56.00; Snowmobile Agent fees \$292.00; and Town Clerk fees \$2,001.75.

Soil Preparation, of Hermon and Plymouth, still has the contract for Septic Sludge. The annual cost is \$2,100.00.

Raymond Smith still has the contract for rubbish removal and is still doing an excellent job. During 1995, the contract price was \$34,148.76. The tipping fees to PERC, in Orrington, were \$42,487.53.

Kimball & Sons, of Palmyra, has the contract for roadside pickup of recyclables. The annual contract price is \$6,264.00.

The six-week summer recreation program was planned and supervised by Teresa Bolstridge. The cost was \$2,000.00. Many children take advantage and look forward to this program which has daily activities, as well as bused field trips. For information, you may call the town office and we will refer you to a recreation committee member.

Troy Richardson, of Hermon, did the mowing, trimming, and roto-tilling of the Recreation Fields. The cost was \$4,300.00.

The Town Equipment Fund had a balance of \$45,559.93 in it at the close of the books on December 31, 1995. The Fire Department is hoping to purchase some new equipment this year using funds from this account, if approval is given at town meeting.

The Annual Carmel Field Day, held on the first Saturday in August, was a huge success. All participants enjoyed the good weather and the selling of their wares. It proves to be a good fund raiser for each individual group. Home Town Express provided music for Friday night, under the Pavilion, and for the Free Street Dance held at the Municipal Building, on Saturday evening.

The Water Quality Committee was able to have three more septic systems installed through the Small Community Grant program. They are working to find a location for one other applicant, who does not have sufficient suitable soil for a system on his own land. The funds approved at town meeting were used to purchase a parcel of land (\$8,900.00), on the Five Road, to locate a septic receptor site for three or four more individual homes. They need to have a survey and soil suitability analysis done before going too much further with their proposed plans.

Ronald Fowle, of Stockton Springs, has been code enforcement officer and plumbing inspector throughout the year, but he has given the selectmen notice that he will be resigning, effective March 4th to accept the job of CEO in Winterport, which is much closer for him to commute. We thank him for his work with Carmel, and wish him well in his new job location.

With money appropriated for Cemetery Enhancement last year, we were able to hire John Wedin, of Orrington, to clean and straighten the stones in the Ruggles Cemetery, on Hampden Road. He will be back in the spring to inspect and finish any work needed in the Village Cemetery or the Ruggles Cemetery. We hope to be able to hire him to do the North Carmel Cemetery this year, if money is appropriated for that purpose.

We extend our thanks to the Fire Department, Ambulance, Recreation Committee, Planning Board, Board of Appeals, Water Quality Committee, and any other Board or Committee, who has worked for the betterment of our town throughout the year.

The Town Office is open daily form 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and on Monday evenings from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., unless it is a holiday. The Selectmen meet each Monday evening at 7:30 p.m.. If you plan to come in to discuss a particular subject, please call the Town Office by Friday afternoon so that you may be put on the agenda.

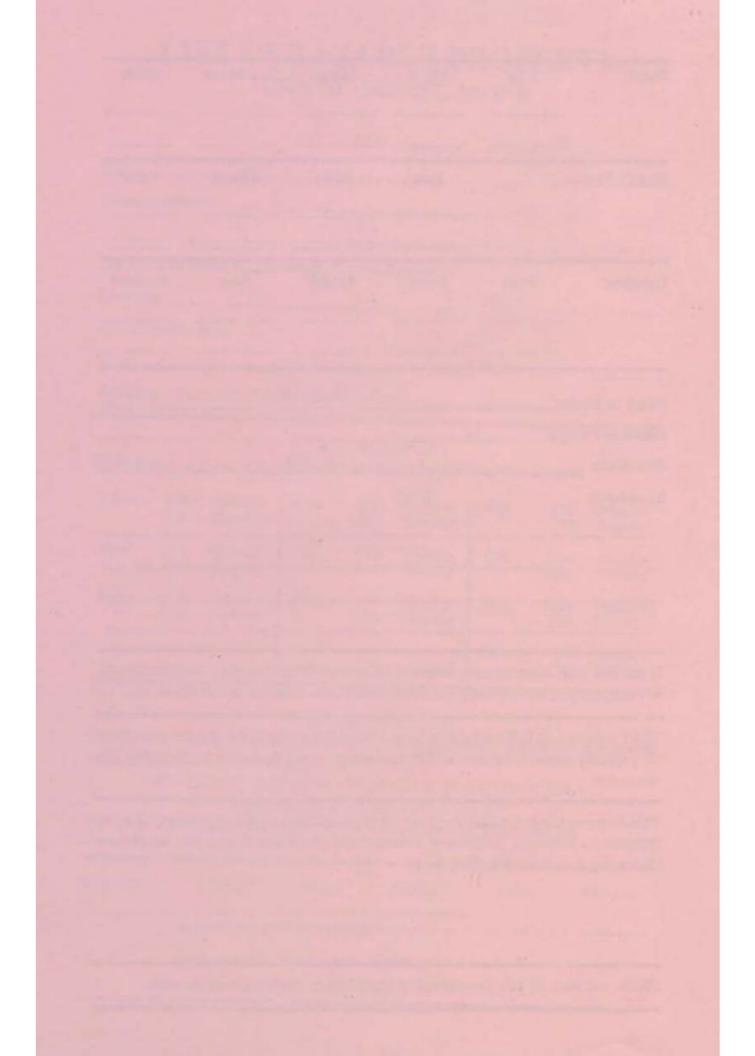

To the Citizens of Carmel:

1995 has been an eventful year at the library. If you haven't been to the library recently, you will be pleasantly surprised at the interior and exterior improvements accomplished this year. The long anticipated handicapped accessibility ramp was attached in the fall and with minor adjustments should be usable in the spring. We appreciate the efforts of all who volunteered their time to help install the ramp. You may have noticed that the outside of the library has a fresh coat of paint as well.

Fall also saw changes in the interior of the building, resulting in a lighter, more open atmosphere. Again, we wish to thank those who helped paint, move books and shelves, install new carpeting, and all those other tasks that contribute to the library's wonderful new look.

The summer and fall story hours were conducted by volunteers who deserve thanks for reading stories and doing crafts with the children. These same volunteers also lent a hand with the summer reading program, which was a great success with over 40 children participating at different levels. The library depends on volunteer support from the community. I urge you to take an interest in this important community asset.

Eighty library cards were issued in 1995, 365 new books added, and 2,228 people used the library this past year. The library was open 18 hours a week in 1995, totaling 936 hours of operation for the year.

ARTICLE ONE

The following budget requests have been discussed and approved by all members of the present Carmel Recreation Committee. We feel that with this budget request of \$12,500 will provide the committee with adequate funds to maintain the recreational facility and all recreational programs.

MAINTENANCE CONTRACT\$4,600.00
This covers the cost for all mowing, trimming, bush-hogging, and tilling done to

maintain the Recreational Facility.

SUMMER RECREATION PROGRAM DIRECTOR\$2,000.00 The town of Carmel hires a summer recreational director to run a six-week program for children ages 5-15. The director puts in over 230 hours during the program including the planning, set up/cleanup, Carmel Days, camping trip for the older children, TCD training and planning for assistants, and field trips.

SUMMER RECREATION PROGRAM EXPENSES\$1,000.00 This money covers the expenses necessary to run the summer program. It will purchase supplies, equipment, provide a bus and driver for field trips, and a gymnastics program.

All recreational programs in Carmel are now under the Recreational Committee umbrella. We provide them with some problem solving, we help to organize schedules, and act on their behalf with the school department. We also assume liability for the coaches under the town's insurance policy. We also like to help them with small donations for equipment, uniforms, or other necessary items. This money will provide approximately \$300 for each program: baseball and softball, basketball, soccer, martial arts instruction and adult volleyball.

FIELD REPAIRS\$3,600.00
This account will pay for all repairs necessary on the bleachers, dugouts, fences, and

fields as needed. As this facility ages there are many necessary repairs that need to be done to keep it looking as neat and clean as possible.

ELECTRICITY\$100.00 This is the estimated yearly electrical expense.

TOTAL RECREATIONAL BUDGET FOR 1996\$12,500

ARTICLE TWO

The present Recreation Committee would like to make the recommendation that the Town of Carmel hire a part-time Recreational Director to oversee all recreation programs, the necessary work and scheduling of the recreation facility, and to work closely with program directors, and to keep the selectmen informed of all recreational activities. Past experience proves that it is getting very difficult to rely on volunteerism to get every job done. Volunteers still are a very vital part of the recreation programs but we see a need for one person to coordinate and direct all activities. This person would still maintain a committee, but would be responsible for getting everything done and reporting regularly to the selectmen. Our present programs and responsibilities have grown to the point where it is difficult for us to keep up with the necessary work to be done. Many small towns in our area have hired rec directors and have had positive results. Our present programs are among the best in this area and involve a large part of our community. We would like to see them run as efficiently as possible including scheduling, training, equipment maintenance and inventory, availability of new programs, and also financially.

REPORT OF THE ROAD COMMISSIONER

To the Citizens of Carmel:

In March, when we had rain and a spring thaw, Vaughn Thibodeau, of Winterport, and Robert Noyes, of Carmel, were hired to haul gravel and do work to repair the Marcho Road and Ash Hill Road to keep them passable.

Later in the year, bids were requested to rebuild a section of the Marcho Road. Dale Leavitt was the successful bidder at \$31,570.00. Frank Prescott, of Newburg, and former State DOT employee, was hired to supervise the job. With all of the new homes now located on this road, further construction will need to continue in order for the school bus to pick up new students located there. Plans are to widen the bridge and do another portion of the road this year.

The bid for stockpiling 2500 yards of winter sand was awarded to Dale Leavitt for \$5.42 per yard. The Selectmen also approved the purchase of 60 tons of raw salt in

December, to help reduce the buildup of ice on the highways.

Donald Hewes crew and Earle McSorley's crew were hired to patch the hot top roads at different times throughout the year.

Edward Neddeau has been the handyman to replace stolen or bent road signs, put up frost heave and road posted signs, and take of tree limbs, etc., that have posed a problem along the roadsides. He has also done several other jobs for the town, such, as keeping the walkways shoveled, and picking up and putting the rubbish out to roadside at the Recreation Field. Thank you, Bud!!

Robert Shaw is the contractor for Snow Removal. He and his crew are out and about real early when we have a storm.

J & M Contracting, from Lee, was the successful bidder to mow the roadsides twice—once in June and again in September. Their total bid, for the two mowings, was \$1,080.00

Sunrise Materials (Lane Construction) was the lowest bidder to do the chip seal on our blacktop roads this year. Other years, Commercial Paving was lower and received the bids. A total of \$133,911.00 was paid to Sunrise Materials.

State Local Road Assistance funds anticipated for this year (\$40,800.00) are proposed to be spent on Town Road Tar.

Plans for construction this coming summer would include further work on the Marcho Road, Ash Hill Road, and the Hayward Road. Paving would include the dirt section of Dyer Road, the upper portion of Five Road, the upper portion of Irish or Pomeroy Road, and a section of Cook Road where the pavement is breaking up. The Fuller Road from Horseback Road to the Hermon Town Line also needs to be re-paved. The Selectmen proposed to spend \$134,000,00 for hot top this year. Choices will probably have to be made as to which roads will be done.

I would like to personally thank the Fire Department for assisting with broken trees, limbs, and downed wires, during the recent wind and rain storms. In the middle of the night, when it is pouring, it isn't easy to find anyone who wants to get out and do these things, but the Fire Department was right there. THANKS

My thanks to all who have worked on the town roads throughout the year.

CARMEL VOLUNTEER AMBULANCE SERVICE

To the Citizens of Carmel:

In 1995, the Ambulance responded to 147 calls. Of these 115 were Emergency calls, 17 No transport, 15 Assisting the Fire Department, and one emergency backup for Hermon.

One of our emergency patients became two, with delivery of our fourth baby,

which was a boy. This leaves the score 4 boys and 0 girls.

We are continually attending classes to upgrade the level of emergency training required by our licensing level. We are still looking for new members to be First Responders, Emergency Medical Technicians, driver or just help with ambulance business matters.

Carmel Volunteer Ambulance Service members want to continue to service the citizens of Carmel free of billing charges and inform the public that Advanced Life Support Service (Capital Ambulance) is contacted by the Emergency Alert System when a life-threatening emergency call is received and is canceled if the level of care can be done by the crew dispatched from Carmel and transporting to area hospitals.

We are always in need of new faces to support and share this very much needed community organization. We are a volunteer service and it cannot continue without your help. If you want to help, day or night; one day a week or three days, we can use you. We welcome anyone interested in working with us. Your support is always needed. You may contact any member, the Town Office or come to a meeting or drill on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of the month, at 7:00 p.m.

Again to the citizens of Carmel, we appreciate your continued support!

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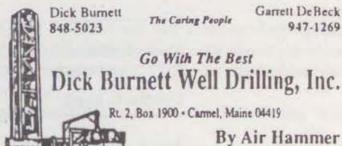

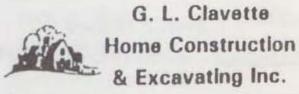
