GOULDSBORO CHARTER (GOLDSBORO)

Adopted: February 16, 1789

1788. — Chapter 71.

AN ACT FOR INCORPORATING THE PLANTATION OF *GOLDSBORO'* SO CALLED, IN THE COUNTY OF *LINCOLN*, INTO A TOWN, BY THE NAME OF *GOLDSBORO'*.

Boundaries.

Be it enacted by the Senate & House of Representatives in General Court assembled & by the authority of the same, that the plantation of *Goldsboro'*, included within the boundaries hereafter described, beginning at *Frenchman's bay*, at the bound mark, between *Goldsboro'* and township number two, thence running easterly by the south lines of townships number two & number seven to *Goldsboro' harbour*, then easterly, southerly and westerly by the bay to the bounds begun at, including *Stave Island*, *Jordan's Island*, *Ironbound Island*, the *Porcupine Island*, (so called) *Horn Island*, *Turtle Island*, and *Scooduk Island*, together with the inhabitants thereof, be & hereby are incorporated into a town by the name of *Goldsboro'*. And the said town is hereby vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities which other towns in this Commonwealth by Law do, or may enjoy.

And be it further Enacted, that *Alexander Campbell*, esquire be and he hereby is empowered to issue his warrant directed to some principal inhabitant of the said town of *Goldsboro'*, requiring him to notify the inhabitants thereof, to meet at such time & place as he shall therein appoint, to choose all such Officers as towns are by Law required to choose at their meeting in the month of *March* or *April* annually.

AN ACT FOR INCORPORATING THE PLANTATION NUMBER TWO ON THE EAST SIDE OF *UNION RIVER* IN THE COUNTY OF *LINCOLN* INTO A TOWN BY THE NAME OF *SULLIVAN*.

Boundaries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, that the plantation number two, on the east side of *Union River* and included within the boundaries hereafter described, beginning on *Frenchman's Bay* at the

southeast corner the west by said townships number two and township number two and *Frenchman's Island A*, *B*, *Braydon Island*, *Frenchman's Island*, together with the inhabitants thereof, hereby are incorporated into a town by the name of *Sullivan*. And the said town is hereby vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities which other towns in this Commonwealth by Law do, or may enjoy.

And be it further Enacted, that *Alexander Campbell*, esquire be and he hereby is empowered to issue his warrant directed to some principal inhabitant of the said town of *Sullivan*, requiring him to notify the inhabitants thereof, to meet at such time & place as he shall therein appoint, to choose all such Officers as towns are by Law required to choose at their meeting in the month of *March* or *April* annually.

AN ACT TO PREVENT THE CATCHING OF SALMON WIVES IN THE COUNTY OF *CUMBERLAND* HERETOFORE.

Whereas the catching of salmon wives is of great value and the law made for that purpose is intended to prevent the catching of salmon wives in the county of *Cumberland* heretofore.

Be it therefore Enacted by the Representatives of the State of *New Hampshire* in General Court assembled, that the authority of the said law be and the same be prevented the catching of salmon wives in any of the rivers or creeks mentioned in the said law, notwithstanding that all such law or laws be and the same be depending, and that the same be and the same be in execution as they
