REPORT OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

To the Citizens of the Town of Alfred:

I hereby submit my Annual Report for the year February 1, 1944 to February 1, 1945.

Considerable time was spent this year on tuberculosis work. In March one student who was a positive reactor in 1943 was taken to Biddeford for re-X-ray. In May 12 students were given tuberculosis tests, one positive reactor found and taken to Biddeford for X-ray by the State Health Department. In January, 1945, 41 students were Patch tested for tuberculosis, results were all negative. Several visits were made after testing was done and X-rays taken to check up on suspects and positive reactors.

Early in the spring term a dental clinic was organized and during April and May many school children were taken by the nurse to Sanford to Dr. A. C. Hanscom's office for dentistry, ten had work completed, others had work finished during the summer vacation. Finances furnished by the A. A. M. Club, Red Cross and the American Legion Auxiliary.

Many home calls were made to pre-school and school children because of skin troubles, pediculosis, illnesses and to assist parents in having defects corrected. Also follow-up visits after all surgery done.

Three children had tonsil and adenoid operations at the free clinic at Goodall Hospital, Sanford.

All cases of pediculosis cleared up at this date, February 1, 1945.

Many visits made to the school, other than those for the annual inspections, for the purpose of conducting various clinics, checking with the teachers on Health Progress Sheets, health talks, delivering pamphlets and booklets on Health Education and a check up on the general health of all pupils.

During the spring term (1944) immunization clinic was organized. Sixteen received smallpox vaccination and 19 were inoculated against diphtheria. Immunizations were given by Dr. Moulton.

I take this opportunity to say I shall be glad to assist all the students in having defects corrected, in order that they may qualify for the Nine-Point Health Certificate, issued by the Maine Public Health Association.

I wish to thank Maynard E. Wright, Superintendent of Schools, Mrs. Richards, interested citizens and or-

ganizations for their kind help and cooperation in conducting the health service.

Class and a book from Miss Dora Jordan, Mrs. David Wilson and the New Century Club. Mrs. Clark also gives us Parents Magazine, as in former years.

We are very grateful indeed for these gifts.

As the town raised our maintenance fund this year, some of the much needed repairs have been attended to and the stipend from the State automatically increased.

The walls in the reading room and the floors still need to be done over, the repairs this year having been confined to the outside of the building.

Art Week was observed during November, much interest being shown in the local exhibits.

The circulation, though small, especially during the summer, is due I feel not only to the absence of so many young people in war work and the armed forces, but also to the gas shortage.

This year, we have again started sending a box of books to a district outside, Miss Elsie Gile being in charge of these books.

We also contributed generously to the paper salvage drive.

In spite of a small library at school, I feel Parsons Memorial Library is proving of much help to the students, for much of their reference work and book reports.

Local students who attend school elsewhere, but come home week ends, also find help here and our local New Century Club has been helped by a bibliography, available at the library compiled by Dr. David H. Wilson and advice from May Lamberton Becker of the New York Herald Tribune.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of Alfred:

I herewith submit the annual report of school:

According to the census taken April, 1944, Alfred has 106 boys and 126 girls between the ages of five and twenty-one. Of this number 133 are registered in the elementary grades as follows: Sub-primary, 17; Grade 1, 15; Grade 2, 13; Grade 3, 19; Grade 4, 13; Grade 5, 6; Grade 6, 16; Grade 7, 17; Grade 8, 17. Enrollment in the high school at the present time is 22.

There have been two changes in the teaching personnel since last year. Mr. Charles P. Steward of Portland was engaged last September as principal of the high school. The vacancy in the sub-primary, caused by the resignation of Miss Lucile M. Jones, was filled by the election of Mrs. Dorothy W. DeBertram of Springvale.

Last summer a beginning was made in the matter of interior painting. The three lower grade rooms were redecorated and also two rooms in the basement. This is only a small part of what should be done to put the building in proper condition. Interior painting should be continued until the whole building has been done.

Repairs other than those mentioned should be done. It has been quite a few years since the outside of the building was painted. To do this very soon would be an economy. The lighting system is wholly inadequate. The building should be rewired and mod-

ern equipment installed.

A group of interested mothers have recently sponsored a hot lunch program for the children of the lower grades. It is hoped that this program will be expanded to include all children staying at the school during the noon hour. A room has been set off in one corner of the basement and is being used as a place in which to prepare the lunches. An extra appropriation is being requested for the purpose of equipping this room properly for carrying out the project. There is no doubt concerning the value of hot lunches for those children who are obliged to carry dinners to School authorities are being urged to give increasing attention to the health of the child. project is a definite step in that direction. A group of interested citizens are willing to help. May we have your favorable consideration of this matter?

A school year has been maintained without serious interruption. There has been no change in the teaching personnel since the beginning of the year. In this we have been very fortunate.

There is no lessening of the teacher shortage. It is to be feared that the situation another year will be even more acute. There are in Maine alone more than 250 teaching vacancies at the present time. Since the beginning of the war schools throughout the country have lost to military service or non-teaching employment more than 280,000 teachers. Since normal schools and colleges are enrolling 60 per cent less prosspective teachers than normally the outlook for some time to come is far from encouraging.

May I in closing express to the Citizens, School Board and Teachers my sincere appreciation for their cooperation during the year just ended.

The sub-primary grade, introduced this year, give the very young pupils some musical experience before meeting the study of fundamentals taken up in grades one and two. We are anxious to acquire some of the "World of Music" series into grades three and four. These books are a recent publication and have proven to be of much interest in grades five and eight where they are now in use. They present many new folk songs of various countries that are most attractive, developing the minor mode in some of their haunting melodies.

Grades five to eight are doing more or less a cappella work in part singing and sight reading. Grades seven and eight sang at the Christmas service of the Congregational Church most acceptably. Much credit is due Mrs. Clark for her work with them.

Mrs. Gould's accompaniments are an inspiration to any group and we greatly appreciate the time she devotes to the high school chorus in addition to her own grade work.
