### NURSING REPORT

To the Citizens and Town Officers of Sorrento I submit my report from January 1, 1938, to December 31, 1938:

In January the usual winter weighing was completed for the health charts, and the children qualifying for Seven-Point awards were discussed with the teachers. In March and April, during the Cancer Prevention and Early Diagnosis Campaign, many pamphlets on these subjects were placed in public places and homes. Posters were also exhibited.

The Sorrento school children joined with the other towns in the Flanders Bay territory for the annual school field day. Eleven Seven-Point children took part in the exercises, and one of the rooms was able to qualify as a winner of the 50 per cent. dental award.

In May, vaccination against smallpox was offered in the school, and seventeen children took advantage of it. Diphtheria immunization was also offered this year, and fifteen children were immunized. All mothers were invited to the baby and pre-school clinic at Winter Harbor in September. Dr. Miller, summer doctor at the Point, was the examining physician.

Annual school inspection was completed in September, and notices of defects found were sent to parents, and full report of the findings left with both teachers. Routine school room visits have been made for the purpose of helping the teachers with all their health problems.

Report of school nursing:Pupils inspected, 25; with defective teeth, 11; with defective throats, 5; with nasal defect, 1; with gland defect, 1; with vision defect, 1; 100 per cent. or

more underweight, 3; with orthopedic defect, 1. Corrections secured: Vision, 2; teeth, 5; throats, 2; nasal, 1; weight, 4; orthopedic, 1 being treated.

During the year, 107 instructive and investigative visits were made to babies, pre-school, school children, pre-natal patients and tuberculosis contacts. One school child was taken by the nurse to the crippled children's clinic in Bangor for an examination.

Thanks is extended to all who have helped in any way to the success of the nursing service.

### WARRANT

STATE OF MAINE.

To Russell W. Bickford, a Constable of the Town of Sorrento, in the County of Hancock, GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Sorrento, in said County, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Sorrento Town Hall, in said town, on Monday, the sixth day of March, A. D. 1939, at 10 o'closk in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, namely:

Article 1 To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

- 2 To hear and act on the report of the selectmen, Assessors, overseers of the poor, treasurer, collector, superintendent of schools, road commissioner, clerk and other town officers.
- 3 To choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year, namely, town clerk, three selectmen, three overseers of the poor, three assessors, treasurer, tax collector, member of the school committee for a term of three years, two constables, road commissioner, surveyor of lumber and wood.
- 4 To see what sum of money the town will vote to pay the treasurer.
- 5 To see what sum of money the town will vote to pay the collector.
- 6 To see what sum of money the town will vote to pay the town clerk.
- 7 To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes, namely: Current and contingent, elementary schools, textbooks and supplies, secondary school tuition, superintendence of schools, repair of school property, maintenance of roads and bridges, repair of town property, upkeep of the town pier and floats, sidewalks, electric lights, health and sanitation, public health nurse, Village Improvement Association, fire department, support of poor, overdrafts.

- 8 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State-aid road construction (in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of section 19, chapter 28, of the revised statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of section 3, chapter 29, Public Laws of 1937.
- 9 To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State-aid account, for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State-aid roads, in excess of requirements of section 2, chapter 132, Public Laws of 1935.
- 10 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$141.00 for maintenance of improved sections of third-class roads, or to be used in conjunction with the State apportionment for the construction of third-class roads.
- 11 To see if the town will vote to charge interest on all unpaid taxes after December 1st, of the current year, and fix the rate of interest.
- 12 To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to sell and dispose of all tax titles, and other deeds, held by the town on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute deeds for such property.
- 13 To see if the town will authorize the tax collector to sell all property at sheriff's sale, or place a mortgage lein on the property, according to the judgment of the selectmen, on all property where taxes are in default after February 1, and before one year has expired from the date of commitment.
- 14 To see if the town will authorize by vote, the selectmen to make temporary loan, or loans, not to exceed in the aggregate, the sum of \$3,000.00, in anticipation of, and to be paid out of current taxes for the municipal year of 1939.
- 15 To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00, more or less, for the purpose of erecting a fence around the Doan Point cemetery so called.

- 16 To see if the town will vote to pay the sum of 50 cents per hour for labor, sanding roads.
- 17 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00, more or less, for excavation in the basement of the town hall.
- 18 To see what action the town will take in regard to disposing of the town hall wood shed.
- 19 To see if the town will vote to let out by contract, to the lowest responsible bidder, town work amounting to \$50.00 or more, excepting all road work, or work which is otherwise taken care of.
- 20 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions, under the provisions of chapter 5, section 82, of the Revised Statutes of 1930, said sum to be expended under the direction of the State of Maine Publicity Bureau.
- 21 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to take out such sums of money as may be due for taxes past due, from any resident employed by the town, before any payment is made to them.
- 22 To see if the town will vote for the selectmen to request W. P. A. fund, for the building of the Doan Point road.
- 23 To act on any other business that may properly come before this meeting.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the Town Hall, in Sorrento, at 9 o'clock A. M., on Monday, March 6, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.


