REPORT OF

SCHOOL DEPARTMENT

The educational problems which concern the boys and girls of Sorrento seem to be of long range import rather than of an immediate nature. The elementary preparation, altho not ideal, at least is comparable to that received in other fine, similar communities with every prospect of continued improvement. Almost all of the grammar school graduates continue on to high school, altho they do not all finish the course. With only an occasional exception, no one goes on to college or to other schools of advanced training. The same situation prevails in the surrounding towns of the area. What is the significance?

It is clearly apparent that in the years ahead some effort should be directed toward extending the preparation for the responsibilities of adult citizenship which every one of our boys and girls must face sooner or later. Right now, they may be getting an adequate grounding in the basic 3 R's but in tomorrow's world this will not be enough for those who have to earn a living and who would participate in the duties required of men and women in a well ordered community.

The answer seems to lie in the direction of a regional community school, perhaps even on a junior college level, which provides terminal courses for those who would receive no further preparation beyond local offerings. Obviously this is a cooperative undertaking with the several towns participating. It so happens, however, that some of the towns must first attend to improving their own elementary programs before

entering into this joint effort. Once each town has for itself a modern consolidated lower grade system, such as in the case of Sorrento, this more ambitious and equally important project will get underway. Just how soon no one can tell. We do know, however, that each town is appropriating more money than ever before for current school expenses with every prospect of additional increases to come.

In the meantime, we can and will keep pace with up to date educational trends in your own village school. Next year a new 16 mm sound projector will make school instruction more meaningful through graded films received from the University of Maine Film Lending Library. Music and good literature is beginning to take on new meaning under expert leadership and good teaching will continue to be an accepted fact.

In closing, it is only fitting that thanks and appreciation be extended on behalf of grateful boys and girls to Mr. and Mrs. Charles Berwind, summer residents of Sullivan, for their financing the expense of a very competent music supervisor, Mrs. Dwight Havey, who visits the school each week; and to Mrs. Leslie Hotson for her encouragement and assistance in setting up the music program; to Mrs. Meyer Davis for her continued efforts to build up a suitable school library and for the many good books she has already donated; to Mrs. Margaret Ridgely, the librarian for the Village Improvement Association, for the lending library available to the school during the winter months;

to Mrs. Albert Durand of Hancock, a nationally known author and story teller, whose pen name is Ruth Sawyer, for her stories at the school and her valuable advice on future book selections; to the Reverend Margaret Henrichsen for her periodic inspirational talks and religious instruction; and to Miss Clye Ricker, R. N., for her most sincere interest in the health of each boy and girl and her frequent visitations to see "that all is well."

NURSE'S REPORT

To the Citizens of the Town of Sorrento:

I hereby submit a brief report of the service rendered the Town by the Flanders Bay Nursing Service for a period beginning January 1, 1947 to December 31, 1947.

The Winter weighing of 33 pupils was completed in January. Conferences with teachers and pupils were held regarding corrections. The Nurse offered help with transportation to secure corrections where needed. 10 pupils received the new Health promotion certificate, 7 received the complete 10 credits, and 3 received 5 year certificates.

The patch test for tuberculosis was offered the entering class and new pupils moving into town. 8 were tested—all negative. All school personnel have received a chest x-ray. Mothers were invited to preschool clinic at Sullivan—5 attended; 2 vaccinated; 3 diphtheria inoculations. Routine vaccination against small pox- and immunization for diphtheria—B; and 3 received the Schick test. Routine classroom visits have been made and help with health problems given teachers whenever needed.

School inspection was completed in October. Notices of defects were sent to parents or a home visit made. A complete report was left with both teachers. The hearing of pupils above the 4th grade will be tested in May with the audiometer loaned us by the Maine Public Health Association.

During the year a total of 131 visits of instruction and investigation have been made to prenatal patients, babies, preschool, school children, and adults to give nursing care or treatments as ordered by doctors. One school child was taken to Ellsworth for vision correction.

In closing, I extend thanks to all who have in any way helped with the success of the nursing service and for the fine cooperation of Selectmen, Members of the School Board, Superintendent of Schools, Teachers and Parents.

COMMENTS

Re: Audit of Town of Sorrento February 15, 1947 to February 13, 1948

CASH:

The cash balance at the close of the year was on deposit at the First National Bank, Bar Harbor, Maine. The check book balance was reconciled with the bank statement as of January 29, 1948 and found to be in agreement. Cash on hand was verified by physical count.

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE:

The accounts receivable are accounts due from the State as reimbursement for snow removal and various road accounts.

TAXES RECEIVABLE:

The records of the Tax Collector were examined and the warrant for commitment was found in agreement with the Assessors' records. The commitment was accounted for by cash receipts of \$16,875.47; abatements of \$40.13 and uncollected taxes of \$303.99 according to the records of the Collector. Uncollected taxes for prior years amount to \$38.00.

TAX LIENS:

The tax liens on record at the beginning of the year were transferred to the Tax Acquired Property account. There are no liens outstanding at the present time.

NOTES PAYABLE:

During the year, \$1,000.00 was paid on notes by appropriation, leaving a balance of \$2,000.00.

DEFERRED REVENUE:

Prepaid 1948 excise taxes were collected prior to the closing of the books, February 13, 1948, and credit is carried forward to the 1948 municipal year for proper application.

SURPLUS:

At the close of the municipal year, the Town had a net surplus of \$1,939.78. This consists of the Departmental Balances Forward which is appropriated for specific purpose and an unappropriated surplus of \$1,764.81. A detailed account of the change in unappropriated surplus may be found in Exhibit E of this report.

TRUST FUNDS:

The trust fund investments were examined and found to be in order. No income was expended during the year.

GENERAL:

The fidelity bonds of the various town officials were examined and found to be in order and properly recorded.

Revenue obtained from 1947 excise taxes was checked and found to be properly accounted for. All revenue derived from this source was carried to the surplus account.

Vouchers and payrolls were examined in part and those examined appeared to be proper charges against the accounts involved.

All unexpended balances required by law to be carried forward and all projects having unexpended balances were carried to 1948.
