This year the town received \$2188.00, from the State, as its share of the equalization fund. This allotment of funds is in addition to the regular state school fund and may be used to defray the regular expense of the elementary and high schools. As a result of this generous allotment the elementary schools have been maintained 36 weeks, the increases in teachers salaries have been continued and additional text books and supplies have been purchased.

The 1940-41 apportionment of the equalization fund has been reduced to \$1600.00. As a result of this reduction it will be necessary to curtail in expenditures for the next year in order to avoid an increase in the town's appropriation.

The cost of installing the toilets in the Longfellow building was \$665.38. Of this amount \$401.50 was for the cost of plumbing supplies and installation, and \$99.50 for an oil burning heater. The balance was for carpenter work and material incidental thereto. To assist in defraying the cost of this much needed improvement the State allotted the town \$350.00 from the equalization fund for special purposes. From funds remaining it is planned to paint the rooms. An estimate placed the cost of heating the rooms at approximately \$40.00 per year.

The writer feels that only a minimum of difficulties have been experienced, during the time these toilets have been in use, in their care and operation.

Due to the increase in the enrollment of high school pupils it was necessary to purchase 15 new seats and desks at a cost of \$122.10.

No changes have been made in the teaching staff since the last report. The maximum of efficiency in classroom work is generally obtained in a school system where there are few changes in teachers each year. It is generally recognized that the progress made in any school system is dependent upon the personnel of its teaching force. I believe the teachers have all displayed unusual interest in their work and have labored untiringly for the improvement of the schools. This might be further emphasized by stating the

fact that seven of the eight teachers employed attended the summer school.

Enrollment in the schools is as follows: Hamlin Primary 25; Hamlin Intermediate 23; Grammar 21; Central 31; Tibbetts Town 9; High School 60; Total 169.

In the Tibbetts Town School the average attendance has been below eight during the past school year. It will therefore be necessary to have a vote of the town authorizing the committee to maintain the school.

The local Farm Bureau Organization, through its lady members have financed the wiring and installation of lights in the Primary and Intermediate schools in the village. This is an improvement which will be appreciated during the short days of fall and winter.

In concluding this brief report, it being my eighteenth in a series of similar accounts, I acknowledge, with sincere appreciation, the interest displayed by teachers and the continued cooperation and support accorded by the committee and citizens.
