At the first meeting of the committee, it was decided to maintain but one school, and the Long Cove schoolhouse was selected for that purpose. The spring term was taught by Mr. Clarence Havey, of Sullivan. Mr. Havey is a faithful and conscientious teacher. System and order were well maintained in his school, and his pupils made rapid progress. During his term the pupils employed Arbor Day in arranging and planting some flower beds in front of the schoolhouse. These proved

an attractive feature of the grounds through the entire summer and fall. Miss Josephine Hawkins, also of Sullivan, was the teacher employed to teach the two fall terms. These were very profitable terms. Miss Hawkins is a teacher whose interest in her school does not cease with the close of the school day, but she is unwearied in her efforts to interest and encourage her scholars. The work commenced in the spring was continued by her by encouraging her pupils to adorn the walls of the school room with pictures and mottos. I think this work should be encouraged. When the mind of a child has once been awakened to the beauties of art and of Nature, one step has been gained towards developing that beauty of character which should be one of the principal objects of all true education. In regard to our school houses it may well be said that they are not strictly up to date. The school building at High Head is chiefly valuable as a relic of a former generation. It will, however, serve a purpose as a place in which to keep a summer school, until the voters and tax payers of Sorrento see fit to build a house more in accordance with modern ideas. While the school house at Long Cove has been greatly improved by the repairs which it has undergone, yet much remains to be done before it will be up with the times. The practice of storing the wood in the ante room is a bad one, as it destroys the plastering, and the room is needed for other purposes. I would recommend that a sum of money be raised for the purpose of building a suitable wood shed. There are no facilities for ventilation, the only resource being to open the door and windows, a practice dangerous to the health of both teacher and pupils. The seats of plank and desks of boards are very much the same as our grandfathers used in the old pion-

neer days. I would suggest that some modern furniture would add greatly to the comfort and convenience of the schoolroom. I was authorized by the committee to take any action which I might think proper in regard to changing text books. As the amount appropriated for this purpose was very small, I could do but little; but believing that a child as well as an adult soon wearies of reading the same story over and over again, I changed the reading books, substituting Stepping Stones to Literature, for those formerly in use. As the books entitled the Mother Tongue seemed to have a more attractive way of presenting the dry subject of grammar, I introduced these, also. These were all the changes made, for lack of funds, but as the spelling books are mostly well worn I think it would be well to change them; and as a new census has just been completed, and great changes have been made in the map of the world it would seem to be well to change our geographies. In closing I would ask our townspeople to deal generously with our schools in order that our young people may be well fitted to engage in the great game of life where most of the prizes are won by men and women of trained hands and educated brains.
