SUMMARY.

The annual report of the school department of the town of Sorrento for the year ending February 20, 1904, is herewith respectfully submitted. A strenuous effort has been made that the money appropriated should be economically expended. The resources were sufficient for the required number of weeks. We have had 25 weeks school in each district, spring terms 11 weeks each, fall terms 14 weeks each. Female teachers were employed throughout the year in all the schools. The spring term of school at High Head was taught by Josie Urant of Sullivan. Whole number of scholars attending school, 16; average attendance 14 95-100. The fall term was taught by Clara Chilcott. Whole number of scholars enrolled 12; average attendance 10 23-28.

Parents should see to it that their children attend school every day that the school is in session, it means so much for the children's future welfare.

Cove school. Effie Baker was employed to teach the spring and fall terms of school. Spring term, whole number of scholars enrolled, 6; average attendance 5. Fall term, whole number of scholars 8, average attendance 6. Cove school having failed to maintain an average attendance of 8 pupils, is suspended, according to Section 3, school laws of Maine, and if this school is to be continued the coming year it will be necessary for the town to instruct the superintending school committee to maintain said school.

School Houses. Cove school house is in very good repair. I would recommend that a sum of money be raised to paint the outside of the building a more appropriate color. The little red school house should be a thing of the past.

It is not necessary to make any extended remarks in regard to High Head schoolhouse as there will be an article in the warrant to see if the town will provide a more suitable place to educate the youth.

STATE OF MAINE,

HANCOCK, SS.

To I. W. Nash, a constable of the Town of Sorrento,
Greeting :

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sorrento qualified by law to vote in town affairs to meet at High Head schoolhouse in said town on Monday the seventh day of March A. D., 1904, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit :

Article 1—To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2—To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3—To hear report of town officers and act thereon.

Art. 4—To choose selectmen and assessors for the ensuing year.

Art. 5—To choose overseers of poor.

Art. 6—To choose a road commissioner.

Art. 7—To choose a superintendent of schools.

Art. 8—To choose a town treasurer for the ensuing year.

Art. 9—To choose a collector of taxes.

Art. 10—To choose a member or members of superintending school committee.

Art. 11—To choose a town auditor.

Art. 12—To choose a harbor master.

Art. 13—To choose constables.

Art. 14—To choose truant officers.

Art. 15—To choose surveyors of lumber, wood and bark.

Art. 16—To choose all other necessary town officers.

Art. 17—To see if the town will vote when taxes shall be due and how and when the same shall be collected.

Art. 18—To raise money for common schools.

Art. 19—To raise money for insurance and repairs on school property.

Art. 20—To raise money for text books.

Art. 21—To raise money for the support of poor.

Art. 22—To raise money for repairing roads and bridges.

Art. 23—To raise money for Memorial Day.

Art. 24—To raise money for current and contingent expenses.

Art. 25—To see if the town will raise a sum of money to pay tuition for high school scholars who attend school in Sullivan.

Art. 26—To see what action the town will take in regard to building a town hall and schoolhouse combined and raising money for same on petition of P. L. Aiken and 11 others.

Art. 27—To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road across what was known as the Parker and Welch farms beginning at the main road to the south of the house of Lydia Littlefield and ending at the main road to the south of the house of J. L. Welch.

Art. 28—To see if the town will vote to maintain two schools.

Art. 29.—To see if the town will vote to accept the list of jurors as prepared by the municipal officers, treasurer and clerk.

Art. 30—To see if the town will vote to accept and maintain all sidewalks now built in limits of said town.

The selectmen will be in session at High Head schoolhouse on the Seventh day of March next, at nine in the forenoon for the purpose of correcting the list of voters. Given under our hands this 24th day of February A. D., 1904.
