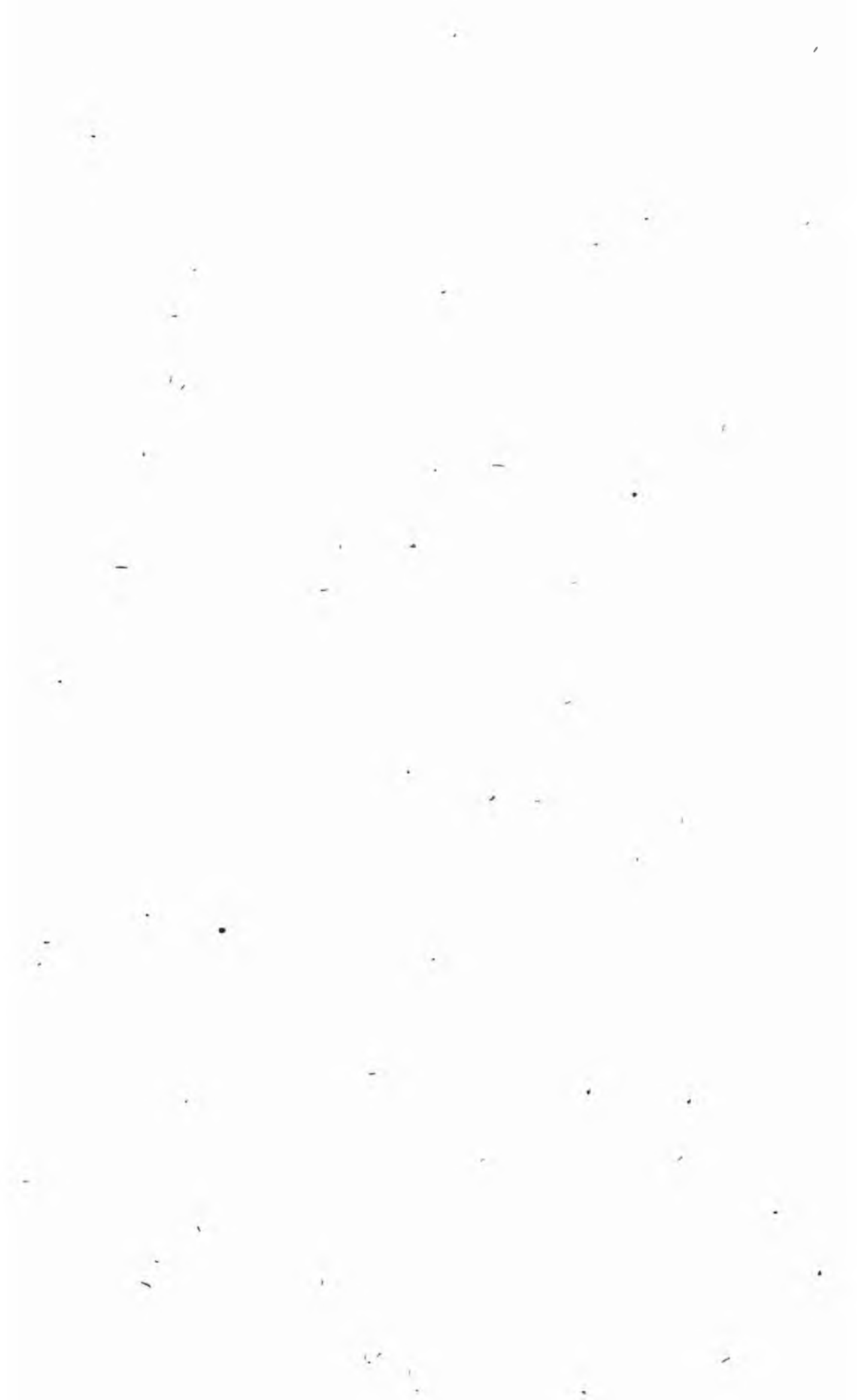

Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee of the Town of York:

Gentlemen;

I herewith present my second annual report of the financial and general condition of the schools of the Town of York, detailed accounts being shown under the usual subdivisions.

In making up this report for the printer it was originally planned to print the various accounts and bills in detail, but as it was found that the bulk would be prohibitive on account of the expense the accounts were finally summarized. All the bills are at my office and I shall be pleased at any time to give any detailed information desired.

In general the work of the various schools has progressed along the same lines as in the past, slight changes being made where possible for the good of the school.

Thanks to the increased appropriation for the Common Schools, it was found possible to raise the salaries of many teachers so I am not compelled to report a long list of resignations and changes in the list of teachers as has been too often the case in the past, in fact I had but two resignations among

all the teachers of the common schools and this fact alone is a long step in advance of the previous conditions when teachers have changed almost every year and often every term. I wish to express my personal appreciation of the hard conscientious work done by all the teachers during the year and express my belief that their work has been approved by all the parents since complaints in regard to the teachers have been entirely lacking.

The past year has witnessed several great improvements, the greatest of course being the completion and occupying of the new building at York Village and the increasing of the number of rooms from four to seven with the consequent improvement in all ways for the school. The new Building has even exceeded our expectations in comfort and convenience and in promoting good health among pupils.

The school building at Brixham was thoroughly remodelled, the windows being rearranged to give light only at the left and rear of the scholars and a modern ventilating stove installed which has maintained an even temperature in all parts of the room and a sufficient supply of fresh air. I wish all parents could have a chance to visit this school and they would then insist on changes in the other buildings especially when the expense is so small in comparison with the benefits obtained.

Extensive repairs were made at Agamenticus and a chimney was rebuilt at Clay Hill.

On account of the large number of scholars at Cape Neddick and Beech Ridge these schools were divided into a Primary and Grammar room and an extra teacher installed in each district. This is a matter which has needed attention for a long time since both schools have been too large for one teacher to instruct alone, all grades being represented which means that about five minutes was the maximum time allowed to one recitation. Under the new conditions marked improvement has been made, in the quality of work done in both schools.

One improvement worthy of special notice was the raise in

salaries to teachers in the rural schools, several being raised to \$11 from the \$9 which has been the salary for so long and the cause of so many changes in the personel of the rural schools. It is my personal opinion that it requires more teaching ability to conduct a rural school successfully than one of the grades in the large buildings and the salaries of the teachers should be based on that theory.

The Palmer system of writing has been established in all the schools and while it is too early to expect results, the system seems to be working well and we hope to be able to report a great improvement in writing.

Manual training has been carried on in most of the schools with more elaborateness than last year, a regular room being equipped in the Village and Beach schools and most of the rural schools being supplied with a bench and a small set of tools. This course has proved very interesting to all the scholars and I believe has proven its right to reman an established course in our schools. I have taken special care to ascertain about the effect of the loss of the time from other school work and can find no reason to believe that the other work is at all impaired.

Music has had much more attention, a special teacher being employed. The course has proved very popular in all the schools.

The conditions in the High school are more fully reported in the principal's report transmitted herewith. I may add that the courses in Domestic science were introduced for two reasons: the first being that an extra teacher was absolutely necessary on account of the large number of students, and the second being that it was the only way that we could get any help from the state, the state paying two thirds of the salary of the teacher for the time spent in these courses, besides being a step towards answering the constant demand that we offer something more practical in our High school, since so few go to college. I wish to here state that our High school is on the approved list of

secondary schools and graduates taking the college course can enter any of the New England colleges in the association, which means all, practically, except Harvard and Yale, upon a certificate from our school. In regard to the courses in Domestic science I trust the public will not expect too much at first because, like all new courses, it takes time and experience to tell what is the best way to conduct them.

Three things have been accomplished looking towards the better sanitary conditions in the schools: the floors have all been oiled with a dust layer; the windows were screened during the worst months for flies. The common drinking cup abolished and individual paper cups furnished. A type of bubbler suitable for rural schools has been tried out at Cape Neddick with good results.

School work has been much hindered by epidemics of whooping cough at Lincoln, Clay Hill, Agamenticus and York Village schools.

There are many things I might call to your attention as pressing needs of the York schools, but I am going to state only a few:

All the rural buildings need a ventilating-heater similar to the one at Brixham school for reasons too obvious to mention. Permanent screens on both windows and doors of all school buildings. New text books for most of the common schools. In the matter of text books I can not say too much to impress the seriousness of the situation upon the voters. While the appropriation has been spent to the best advantage in the past the size of the schools has increased so much and the claim on the fund for High school text books and supplies is so great that really very little has been available for the common schools. The High school has steadily increased in size, requiring more books each year to supply all students with books, while in the common schools we did have old books to fall back on when we could not afford new ones. The expense of the commercial course has increased so that it alone takes a considerable amount

of the appropriation, not to mention the Chemistry laboratory expenses.

There are over 500 scholars in the Common schools and about 100 in the High, yet the High takes about a third of the total appropriation.

For lack of funds we are unable to establish uniform courses in all schools especially in reading. The language books in use are very old and much dilapidated. It has been impossible at any time since I have been in office to equip any grade with a change of readers or other books without hunting through the supplies in several schools to find a sufficient number of any certain kind of books needed.

Some change is required at Cape Neddick since the extra room leased this past year has not been satisfactory, and it seems that at least an addition to the present building is demanded as the school is too large for one room and the parents object to transporting the upper grades to York Beach.

Attention must be called to the crowded conditions at the High school, and it is a matter requiring some action in the near future. Already we are using the hall for recitation purposes, and we can seat no more in the big study hall.

The cost of transportation of students to the High is a matter worthy of careful study. This is now borne wholly by the parents, but is a heavy tax on those least able to bear it, and in many cases is keeping students from taking the High School Course. This matter I believe is to be in the warrant for this year's annual town meeting.

The extra room at York Beach should be finished as the school already is using the room.

A matter of some considerable importance to the superintendent is the development of some sort of a no school signal as the present method of using the telephone comes very near being a personal hardship to him, besides being most unsatisfac-

tory to all.

In closing I make the following recommendations for appropriations for the ensuing year.

To the Superintendent of Schools:

It is with great pleasure that I submit to you my third annual report as Principal of York High School.

Probably the most noticeable thing about our High school as it opened in the fall was its increased size. During my first year in York 68 pupils were registered; the second year the number was increased to 84 and last fall we had a total registration of 103.

It was discovered early in the summer that the size of the school would be beyond our seating capacity. By doing a little crowding, another row of seats was added in the main room, making a total of 96 seats. The remaining seven pupils had to be accommodated in one of the smaller rooms.

Miss Dodge and Miss Staples returned to take up their work for another year. Miss Perkins was engaged to fill the position made vacant by the resignation of Miss Leavitt and Miss Poore was engaged to take up the Chemistry, Physical and Commercial Geography and Domestic Science.

A few changes have been made in the course of study this year. English History has been given the Freshmen in the place of Ancient History; the length of the periods in Type-Writing has been increased to seventy minutes a day; in response to a demand for more practical studies a course in Domestic Science

was introduced. We were somewhat delayed in getting this course started and consequently have not yet given it sufficient trial to say definitely regarding its results. The work seems to be very popular and I see no reason why it should not be one of our best courses.

The scholarship for the past year has been fairly good. On the whole our marks have been higher than during the two previous years. The highest rank for this year has been held by Miss Mildred Moulton of the Junior class.

The record which our pupils have made for staying in school is one of which we may well be proud. During the past three years 91 pupils have entered the school. Of that number 81 are still with us and five are attending school elsewhere. This leaves only five out of 91 who have left school entirely and of that number at least one is out on account of poor health and will return next year. Of course not all have kept up with their classes, yet the fact that pupils have not dropped out, as in many other towns, shows that the parents and pupils of York appreciate our High School.

In closing I wish to express my appreciation and thanks to the other teachers, superintendent, members of the School Board, pupils and parents for the part which they have taken in making this year a success

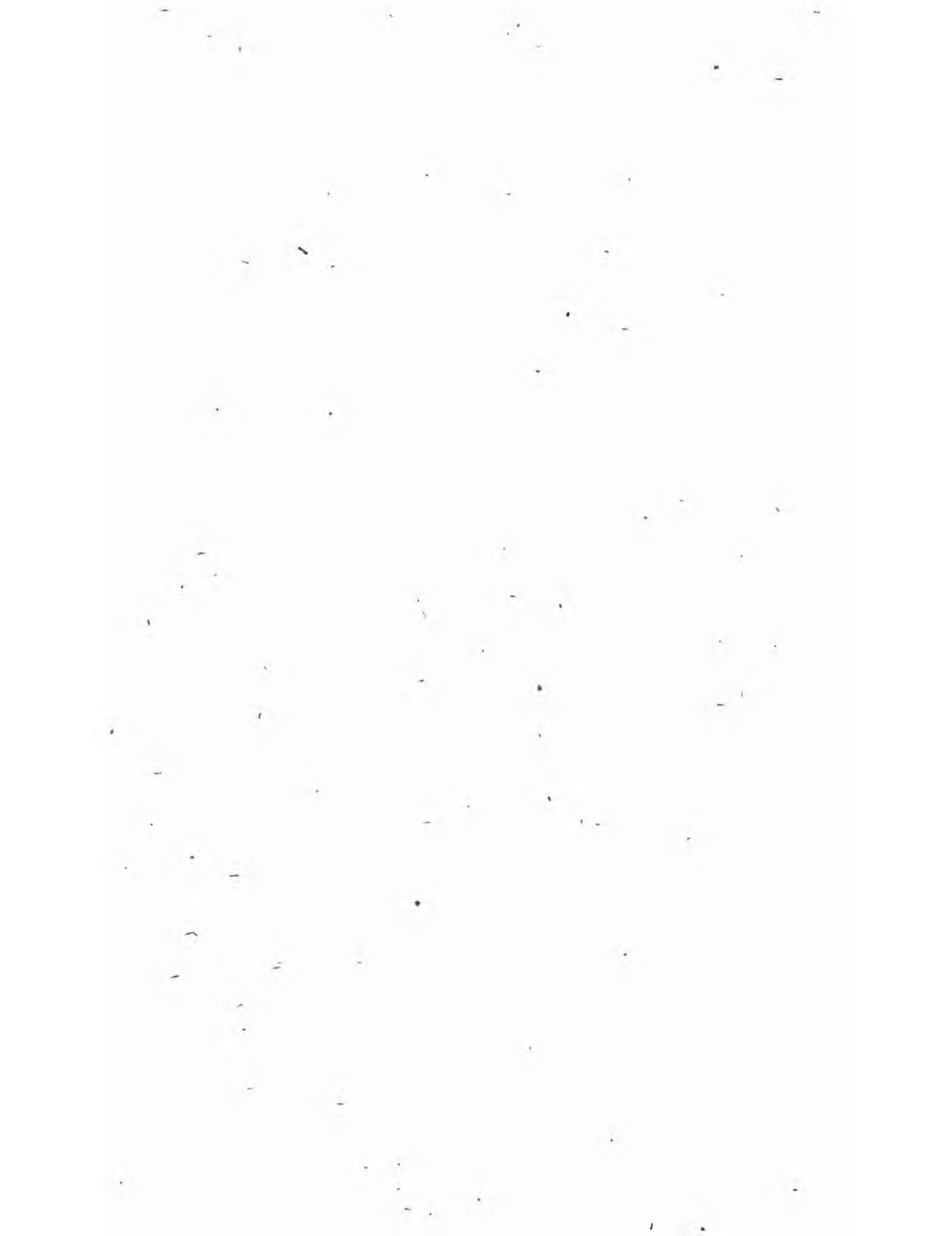

Warrant for Town Meeting

MARCH 8, 1915

To Bradford S. Woodward, Constable of the Town of York.

In the name of the State of Maine you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of York qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble in the Town House, in said town, on Monday the eighth day of March, A. D., 1915, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles to wit:

FIRST—To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

SECOND—To choose a Town Clerk, three Selectmen, Assessors of Taxes, and Overseers of Poor, Town Treasurer, Collector of Taxes and Constable, Town Agent, one School Committeeman, one Fire Ward, one Auditor of accounts and all other officers necessary for the ensuing year.

THIRD—To see what sum of money the town will vote to defray the incidental expenses of the town for the ensuing year.

FOURTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote for repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

FIFTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote for the support of poor the ensuing year.

SIXTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote for the support of common schools for the ensuing year.

SEVENTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote for the support of a Free High School for the ensuing year.

EIGHTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote for the purchase of text books and school supplies for the ensuing year.

NINTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote for the repairs of School Houses for the ensuing year.

TENTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote for janitor services and fuel for the High School for the ensuing

year.

ELEVENTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote for instruction in manual training and music in the schools for the ensuing year.

TWELFTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote for water supply for the ensuing year.

THIRTEENTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote for Memorial Day.

FOURTEENTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote for care of grounds, walks and shrubbery around the Town House.

FIFTEENTH—To see what action the town will take in regard to renewing the contract with the York County Power Co., for street lighting.

SIXTEENTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote for street lighting the ensuing year.

SEVENTEENTH—To see what sum of money the town

will vote to appropriate for the destruction of brown tail moths.

EIGHTEENTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote to pay interest on and for the reduction of the debt of the town for the ensuing year.

NINETEENTH—To see if the town will vote to instruct and authorize the Treasurer to hire money on the credit of the town to meet pressing Liabilities when so directed by the selectmen.

TWENTIETH—To see if the town will vote “yes” or “no” on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to state aid, as provided in section 20 chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

TWENTY-FIRST—To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$1,333.00 for the improvement of the section of state aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges: the above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provision of section 19, Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

TWENTY-SECOND—To see whether the town will vote to raise money and what sum for the maintenance of state highways during the ensuing year within the limits of the town, under the provisions of section 9 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

TWENTY-THIRD—To see what sum of money the town will vote for the purpose of removing snow from the highways.

TWENTY-FOURTH—To fix the remuneration of the town officers for services the ensuing year, also price of labor on the highways.

TWENTY-FIFTH—To see if the town will vote to paint the Town House and the Town Farm Buildings and raise a sum of money therefor.

TWENTY-SIXTH—To see if the town will vote to rebuild the sidewalk from the Norton Inn to the Post Office at York Village and raise a sum of money therefor.

TWENTY-SEVENTH—To see if the town will vote to enlarge the School House lot at Brixham and raise a sum of money therefor.

TWENTY-EIGHTH—To see whether the town will authorize the assessors to make an abatement of taxes assessed on Sayward Pines, so called, now held by York Forestry Company, said property having been by the terms of the deed conveying the same dedicated to the Town of York for a Public Park subject only to the mortgage given to secure payment of the purchase price of the same.

TWENTY-NINTH—To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to dispose of the tax deeds on file in the treasurers office, the same being deeds of property sold for taxes.

THIRTIETH—To see if the town will vote to authorize the superintending school committee to join with Kittery for the purpose of employing a superintendent of schools in accordance with the provisions of section 40 to 45, inclusive, of Chapter 15, of the Revised Statues. To see what the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary of superintendent of schools for the ensuing year, on petition of Fred W. Marshall and nineteen others.

THIRTY-FIRST—To see if the town will vote to install and maintain four electric street lights, one opposite the residence of Fred Moore, one at the junction of Allen road and the

road leading to Seabury Station, one on the hill east of the residence of Fred Langille, one at the end of Seabury Bridge and vote a sum of money therefor on petition of Fred Moore and eleven others.

THIRTY-SECOND—To see if the town will vote to install electric lights along the highway from Seabury Station to a point on the Raynes Neck Road, near the William Hill Place; so called, and appropriate a sum of money therefor, on petition of Emuel L. Gifford and nine others.

THIRTY-THIRD—To hear the report of the Committee appointed to examine the Grammar School building and to see if the town will vote to carry out the recommendation therein, and appropriate a sum of money therefor.

THIRTY-FOURTH—To see if the town will grant to the York Brotherhood club the privilege of using the two upper rooms of the old Grammar School building for athletic and gymnasium purposes on petition of Frank H. Ellis and thirty others.

THIRTY-FIFTH—To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the purpose of building a sidewalk with a concrete curb along Long Beach, from the front of the Coast

View Hotel to the road leading up to the Iduna Hotel, on petition of E. E. Blood and nineteen others.

THIRTY-SIXTH—To see if the town will vote to erect a substantial iron guard railing on the southerly side of the road from a point near the easterly side of the cemetery opposite the Cape Neddick Baptist church and at intervals where needed to and across the bridge over the Cape Neddick river and thence returning to a place near what is called "Landing Hill" opposite the house owned by Mr. John Currier and appropriate a sum of money therefor, on petition of Geo. W. Currier and twenty-four others.

THIRTY-SEVENTH—To see if the town will vote to purchase additional land for school purposes at Cape Neddick and to raise a sum of money therefor.

THIRTY-EIGHTH—To see if the town will vote to build a new school house at Cape Neddick to replace the present building and raise a sum of money therefor.

THIRTY-NINTH—To see if the town will vote to choose a building committee to erect and furnish a suitable school building at Cape Neddick.

FORTIETH—To see if the town will vote to sell the present school building at Cape Neddick. The above four articles on petition of Frank H. Gardner and thirty others.

FORTY-FIRST—To see if the town will vote to build a suitable sidewalk from the York Harbor Railroad station to the Long Beach road, and appropriate a sum of money therefor, on petition of Frank E. Johnson and twenty-two others.

FORTY-SECOND—To see if the town will vote to discontinue that portion of the old town highway leading from York Beach to Cape Neddick, as runs parallel to and is supplanted by the new state highway or trunk line leading from said York Beach to Cape Neddick on petition of Chas. A. Nason and twelve others.

FORTY-THIRD—To see if the town will vote to pay all or any part of the expenses in transporting scholars to and from the York Free High School and to raise and appropriate a sum of money therefor on petition of Frank H. Ellis and forty-one others.

FORTY-FOURTH—To see what action the town will take to continue the building of the sidewalk from Meeting House Creek on the Lindsay road to Sewall's bridge and have tarvia

put on road bed, on Lindsay road from York Village to Sewall's bridge, on petition of J. E. Staples and eleven others.

FORTY-FIFTH—To see if the town will vote the sum of \$150.00 to complete the sidewalk as far as the Lord House so called. Job to be given to the lowest responsible bidder, on petition of A. G. McCollum and twelve others.

FORTY-SIXTH—To see if the town will instruct the Road Commissioner of the Center District to keep the sidewalk clear of snow from the High School to York Corner and Norton Inn and the Lord House and G. A. Marshall's store, on petition of John F. Sanford and ten others.

FORTY-SEVENTH—To see if the town will vote to enclose by a suitable fence the plot of ground on which is located the Soldiers monument, and appropriate a sum of money therefor, on petition of Edw. C. Moody and ten others.

FORTY-EIGHTH—To see if the town will vote to build a sewer at York Beach according to the survey of Roland Libby from a point near the York Beach School House to Cape Neddick River. And also build a sewer from Freeman Street to run along Atlantic Avenue, and meet the sewer as set forth on the above survey and to appropriate a sum of money therefor, on

petition of Joseph LaBonte and thirty-four others.

FORTY-NINTH—To see if the town will vote the extension of electric lights for street lighting from the residence of Dwight Bardwell to Long Beach Boulevard, and vote a sum of money therefor on petition of Frank H. Ingalls and eighteen others.

FIFTIETH—To see if the town will vote to install an electric light on Main Street between the lights in front of the residences of I. B. Camp and George Chase at York Beach, Me., and appropriate a sum of money therefor, on petition of G. E. Morrill and ten others.

FIFTY-FIRST—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$75.00 for electric lights to be located as follows, two between the Long Sands road and the York Harbor Railroad station, one near the watering fountain at York Village, and one near the residence of Wm. Wilson on the Long Sands road, on petition of H. E. Johnson and seventeen others.

FIFTY-SECOND—To see if the town will vote to install electric lights from a point on the Long Beach and Webber road near the Oakes Cottage, so called, to the junction of the York Beach and Webber Road and thence by said York Beach road

to the Lord House, so called, on petition of J. A. Briley and twenty others.

FIFTY-THIRD—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of the York Hospital for the ensuing year.

FIFTY-FOURTH—To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be expended in repairing the highway from the top of Tenny Hill to the junction of the Webber road with the State road at Long Beach being part of the highway leading from York Village to York Beach, on petition of A. L. Sträub and eighteen others.

FIFTY-FIFTH—To see if the town will vote to build a crushed stone road from the Junction of the State road in front of the store occupied by R. F. Farwell to the junction of Railroad avenue at York Beach, a distance of approximately three hundred yards, and appropriate a sum of money therefor, on petition of J. B. Paul and ten others.

FIFTY-SIXTH—To see if the town will vote to pay Albert H. Kimball the sum of \$26.00, it being the amount due him for board of John L. Hatch, during the Spring and Summer of 1914, and to raise a sum of money therefor, on petition of

Albert H. Kimball and eleven others.

FIFTY-SEVENTH—To see what sum of money the town will vote in aid of the York Public Library on petition of Ralph W. Hawkes and twenty-nine others.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters on Friday and Saturday, March 5th and 6th from one to four o'clock P. M.
