To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the Town of Sorrento:

I herewith submit my third annual report for the year ending February 7, 1922.

This has been a very successful school year. We have been fortunate in securing the services of efficient teachers who have worked faithfully for the interest of the pupils and the community, and I am pleased to speak words of praise in their behalf. The pupils have formed the habit of doing thorough work, and have to feel a certain responsibility of making the most of their time and books. The parents have cooperated in every way possible. The attitude they have shown toward the school work is a direct proof of which as the large gain in attendance shows.

In my last report, after long and serious study of school conditions, I recommended employing two teachers at High Head. At the beginning of the fall term, we divided the school into regular primary and grammar grades. This plan has been successfully carried out throughout the year. I recommend that sufficient funds be raised to continue the work.

#### REPAIRS.

In the past two years much has been done to improve the condition of the Cove schoolhouse. Practically both buildings are in good state of repair.

BOOKS AND SUPPLIES.

As the attendance has been somewhat larger this year, it has required an extra outlay for books and supplies. We are now well equipped, and I would suggest that the usual \$100 appropriation be made this year.

In conclusion, I wish to thank the teachers for their faithful work and co-operation, and to the school committee and citizens, for their loyalty and support, I am indeed grateful.

To L. U. Bragdon, a Constable of the Town of Sorrento, in said County.

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Sorrento qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town hall, in said town, on Monday, the sixth day of March, A. D. 1922, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To elect a moderator to preside at said meeting.

- 2 To elect a town clerk for the ensuing year, and fix salary for same.
- 3 To receive a report of all town officers and act on the same.
- 4 To elect three selectmen.
- 5 To elect three assessors.
- 6 To elect three overseers of the poor.
- 7 To elect a town treasurer, and fix salary of the same.
- 8 To elect a collector of taxes and fix his compensation.
- 9 To elect a member of the school committee for three years.
- 10 To elect a town auditor.
- 11 To elect constables.
- 12 To elect surveyors of lumber, wood and bark.
- 13 To elect a road commissioner.
- '14 'To elect all other town officers.
- 15 To see what action the town will take in regard to the digging of clams.
- 16 To see what action the town will take in regard to a vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of raising and appropriating money necessary to entitle to State aid, as provided in section 20 of chapter 130 of the public laws of 1913.
- 17 To see if the town will instruct the selectmen to hire money to defray expenses in anticipation of taxes.

- 18 To see what action the town will take in regard to repairing wharf, and raise a sum of money for the same.
- 18½ To see if the town will vote to buy a one-man road machine, and raise a sum for the same.
- 19 To see if the town will vote to repair Mt. Desert street, and raise a separate sum of money for the same.
- 20 To see how much money the town will vote for the following purposes, to wit: Overdrafts for 1922, Current and Contingent Expenses, Roads and Bridges, Sidewalks, State-aid Road, Common Schools, Text-books, Superintendent, Repair of School Property, Repair of Town Property, Insurance, Board of Health, Electric Light Plant, Village Improvement Society, Wharf, Poor, High School Tuition.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the Town hall, in Sorrento, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, on Monday, March 6th, A. D. 1922, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.


