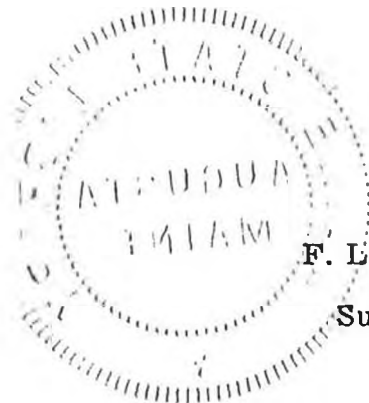

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens
of the Town of Sorrento:

I herewith submit my fifth annual report, for the
year ending February 3, 1924.

In reviewing the work done in our schools during the
past year, I find the standard has been very high. Our
present teachers are normal trained, faithful and hon-
est workers. The welcoming attitude on the part of the
parents has been very helpful to the teachers. Their
co-operation and support have enabled the teachers to
serve hot lunches.

..... *Repairs.*

Fifty dollars was raised for repairs. With this we
purchased slate blackboards for the Cove school, and
other general repair work was done. The outbuildings
at the Cove are in good repair, but the toilets are very
unsanitary and should be changed this year. There
seems to be only one solution of the toilet problem for
our rural schools, that is the installation of approved
antiseptic or chemical toilets. They are very easily in-

stalled and cared for. I therefore recommend that the town raise \$200 for this purpose.

Books.

These are the indispensable "working tools" in the efficient school. They must be "Modern and in good condition, in quantity to supply the needs of every pupil," or the work suffers every day. We are well supplied at present. As the subject matter changes from year to year it is necessary to make changes. The usual amount should be raised this year.

Following are the amounts recommended for consideration of the voters in annual session.
