To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of Sorrento:

I herewith present my fifth annual report of the condition, progress and needs of the Sorrento school.

The year just passed has been one of steady and satisfactory progress. During the fall term a second teacher was placed in the school to assist the regular teacher. With eight grades to teach, a teacher is not able to give to each class, grade or pupil the best that she knows how and wishes to give. With thirty-odd classes a day, a teacher can give about ten minutes to any one class, and when she has to get through a class every ten minutes, she can give very little individual help to the pupils.

It would also be practically impossible for a teacher to make proper preparation each night for thirty classes, and with the short recitation periods there must be careful preparation on the part of the teacher to make the work effective.

This second teacher was added partly as an experiment until town meeting, when the people should have a chance to say, through the amount of money they would raise, whether or not two teachers should be continued. The experiment has proved entirely satis-

factory and the additional results attained show that an assistant teacher is well worth the additional expense.

As to whether or not, if two teachers are continued, a separate room should be fixed up and two separate schools maintained, it would seem feasible and satisfactory to continue for a time at least as it is now, with one teacher acting as assistant to the other. It will require that special attention be given to employing teachers who will work well together. It will be interesting to see if in this way we may not get better co-ordination than might exist between two separate schools. Doubtless, too, an assistant teacher can be obtained at less expense than a regular teacher to have full charge of a separate school.

If, after a period of trial, it should seem better to maintain two separate schools, it might be possible to build over the present room to make two rooms with standard lighting.

#### *Secondary School Students*

At present there are eight tuition students as follows: Sophomores, 5; Juniors, 2, and Seniors, 1. Seven—Raymond Fenton, Uriel Jellison, Edgar, Elwin and Kathleen Perry, Valora Sinclair and Albert Williams—are attending Sullivan high school, and Luella Andrews is at Ellsworth high.

In closing this report, I wish to express to the school board, teachers, pupils and parents, my appreciation for their cooperation in the efforts to promote the educational welfare of the young folks of Sorrento.

## NURSE'S REPORT.

---

To the Citizens of the Town of Sorrento :

I hereby submit the annual report of the Flanders Bay Nursing Service from January 1, 1929 to January 1, 1930. The Flanders Bay Service, comprising Winter Harbor, Gouldsboro, Sorrento and East Sullivan, is affiliated with the Maine Public Health Nursing Association and under direct supervision of the nurse director, Mrs. Theresa Anderson.

The work has gone on with very little variation from the preceding three years. The first four months it was carried on by Miss Bella Davis, who substituted while the local nurse was taking a public health nursing course in Simmons College, Boston. With the exception of the resignation of Mrs. Alice Bassett, the Hancock county nurse, who was supervisor of the local nurse, there is no change in the personnel. Mr. Fletcher Wood is chairman, Mr. Charles Small is treasurer and Mrs. Rubie Tracy remains as secretary.

The major part of the services is made possible by the efforts of the summer residents, the rest of the support depending on town appropriations, 80 per cent. of the Christmas Seal sale and on fees collected by the nurse and turned in to the treasury. Needless to say that nursing care is given freely, regardless of the ability of the patient to pay. The statistical report follows :

206 visits of instruction in infant welfare, pre-school, pre-natal, tuberculosis, and post-partum cases. 401 bedside visits to babies, obstetrical, surgical and medical diseases and tuberculosis. 112 visits of investigation in reference to tuberculosis, pre-natal, and contagious diseases. 140 miscellaneous visits in reference

to social service, conferences, clinics and in behalf of patients.

Four well-baby and pre-school conferences and clinics were held, assisted by Dr. Taylor, a baby specialist from Philadelphia who is a summer resident in Winter Harbor, and by Dr. Ella Kilgas of New York, also a specialist, who is a summer resident in Sullivan; also by the local physicians in Winter Harbor and Sullivan. Demonstrations were given in technique in baby care, habit training, etc., by the nurse.

48 Vaccinations were done by the local physicians at these clinics. 88 children attended. A very successful dental clinic was held in October; 79 children registered at this clinic, 47 receiving care and instruction. This was not a free clinic, all patients but a few paying for work done. The few were taken care of by a small fund left for that purpose.

A pre-natal program was carried out, the nurse visiting these patients regularly, making analysis, giving advice and instruction. This year a Mothers' Club is being formed and held in the nurse's home once a month, where this instruction is given collectively instead of individually.

School reports show that nineteen schools were visited several times, 644 children given full inspection; 37 were examined and excluded by physicians for exposure to measles, skin diseases and pink eye; 162 had free vaccinations; 38 health talks were given; 50 sanitary inspections made; 349 notices were sent out to parents in reference to defects found on inspections made; 106 home calls were made; four children were taken to a physician; 34 taken to a dentist, 3 to a oculist; 39 vision defects were found with 35 corrections; 366 with defective teeth, 176 corrections; 63 with symptoms of throat defects, 91 corrections; 195 with poor posture; 37 were 10 per cent. under weight; 33



were 20 per cent. overweight; 7 were T. B. contacts; 73 were referred to physician; 190 were referred to dentist, and 39 to oculist.

Mothers' Clubs, 2. Conferences with dentists, physicians, supervisor, and social service worker 11, home demonstrations 10, taken to doctor (other than children) 11. Taken to hospital, 18; to sanatorium, 1; to oculist, 1.

In closing this report, the nurse and committee wish to extend their appreciation to the physicians who gave advice at clinics, to the teachers and parents for their willing co-operation in carrying out health programs in schools, and to all others who assisted the nurse by their encouragement and cooperation in carrying on her work.

  - 4 To elect three assessors.
  - 5 To elect three selectmen.
  - 6 To elect three overseers of the poor.
  - 7 To elect a town treasurer, and fix salary of same.
  - 8 To elect a collector of taxes, and fix salary of same.
  - 9 To elect a member of the school committee for a term of three years.
  - 10 To elect a town auditor.
  - 11 To elect two or more constables.
  - 12 To elect surveyors of lumber, wood and bark.
  - 13 To elect a road commissioner.
  - 14 To elect all other necessary town officers.
  - 15 To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising a sum of money necessary to entitle the town to State-aid, as provided in section 10 of chapter 25 of the revised statutes of 1916.

- 16 To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$533.00 for the improvement of the section of State-aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways, and bridges, the above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provision of section 18, chapter 25, of the revised statutes.
- 17 To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State-aid, as provided under section 21 of chapter 25, revised statutes, 1916.
- 18 To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$2,665.00 for improvement of the section of State-aid roads as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of chapter 25, section 21, revised statutes, 1916.
- 19 To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to hire money to defray expenses, if necessary, in anticipation of taxes.
- 20 To see if the town will raise a sum of money to buy a typewriter and adding-machine.
- 21 To see if the town will appoint a committee to act with the selectmen in regard to direction road signs, and raise a sum of money for the same.
- 22 To appropriate and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the following purposes, to wit: For repair of roads and bridges, note on snowplow, sidewalks, common schools, overdrafts, repair of school property, repair of town property, current and contingent expenses, board of health, high school tuition, text-books, superintendent of schools, V. I. A., insurance, public health nurse, electric lights, breakwater, poor account.
- 23 To act on any other business that may properly come before the meeting.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the town hall in Sorrento, at 9:30 a. m., March 3, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
