REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and citizens of
Bridgewater:

In accordance with custom and the Laws of the State of Maine, I am pleased to submit my annual report as Superintendent of the Bridgewater Schools. The elementary schools of the town opened September 30th, with an enrollment of 239 pupils which is a slight decrease from the number last year. The customary statistical chart following this report will show the teachers in their present grade placement. There were three changes in the teaching staff at the opening of the fall term. Roger Wheaton, a graduate of Aroostook State Normal School, replaced Roy Duff as principal of the Bridgewater Grammar School. Mr. Wheaton had two years of successful teaching before coming to Bridgewater. Miss Susan Getchell replaced Miss Frances Nye in the departmental work in grades 6, 7 and 8. Miss Getchell is a graduate of Aroostook State Normal

School and has had one year of teaching experience. Miss Reta Ewings of Bridgewater replaced Miss Emma Sargent as teacher in the second grade.

The Boundary Line School was closed the middle of last April and the pupils conveyed to the village school. When the school was closed, there was an enrollment of only 5 pupils. Therefore, it was both uneconomical and contrary to state law to maintain his school any longer.

The pupils of grades 6, 7 and 8 have not had an opportunity for the past year to do the type of work which should have been accomplished. However, I feel that they did very well under the existing conditions. I know that it is the desire of both teachers and pupils to make up some of the lost motion, now that they are housed in the new building.

You will notice that the textbook account shows an unexpended balance. If all textbook bills were paid, there would be an overdraft of approximately \$110.00. It will be possible, next year, to apply a large part of the textbook appropriation to books for the lower grades. At the present time there is a great need for new books in the primary department.

It was necessary to overdraw the repairs account in order to make repairs on our temporary quarters. As you recall from the report last year, I suggested that the Intermediate Building should be painted. Due to the uncertainty of what was to take place, there was no appropriation made for this purpose. The need for painting this building is even greater than last year and should be done if only to apply one coat of paint.

It was a great relief to be able to move from our temporary quarters into the new school building. Teachers, pupils and school officials had carried on under difficult

conditions. I feel that the citizens of the town of Bridgewater have every right to feel proud of this new building. It is modern in every respect; it is easy to administer; it has all the advantages that parents wish their children to enjoy. I believe that the building was built with the greatest economy possible and that the people have received real value for their money.

We are fortunate in having a fine spirit of cooperation between school and town officials. Our officials work together harmoniously to maintain and improve conditions pertaining to children, teachers, parents and taxpayers of the community. I wish to express my sincere appreciation for this cooperation, for the fine attitude of the people of the community towards the schools, and the conscientious service of all our teachers, janitors, conveyance drivers and civic organizations.

The question of our needs in the new building has been asked many times and they are many. To mention a few they are reference books, encyclopedias and dictionaries, basketball backboard and baskets, stage equipment and mimeograph.

In behalf of the teaching force and also the student body, I wish to congratulate the town upon its fine new Academy building. We all find it such a pleasant place in which to work.

In closing, I wish to express my appreciation for the cooperation of the citizens, students and friends of the school in the short time I have been here.

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Bridgewater, qualified by law to vote in the Town affairs, to assemble at the Town Hall in the Town of Bridgewater on Monday, March 24, 1941 at ten (10) o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To choose a moderator to act at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Town Reports as published by the Selectmen, March 12, 1941.

Art. 4. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Support of Schools.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Support of Poor and other necessary expenses of the Town for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Repairs of School Buildings for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purchase of Text Books for the ensuing year.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purchase of School Supplies.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Free High School for the ensuing year.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Repairs on Roads, Bridges, Sidewalks and Snow Removal from Roads for the ensuing year.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for School Superintendent for the ensuing year.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Lighting of Village Streets for the ensuing year.

Art. 14. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Road Construction (addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sec-

tion 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the Provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to rescind any amounts appropriated by the Town for State Aid Highway construction in excess of the amount required to meet State apportionments.

Art. 16. To see what sum, if any, the Town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid Roads, in excess of the requirements of Section 2, Chapter 132 P. L. 1935.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the maintenance of the State Highway during the ensuing year within the limits of the Town under the provisions of Section 9, Chapter 1930 of the Public Laws of 1913.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise towards the payment of the Town Debt and Interest.

Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to fix a date when taxes shall be due and payable and make a discount on said taxes at such time or times as may be determined and, if so at what percent of discount, also to fix a time and rate of interest on taxes remaining unpaid.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to pay its Firemen.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay its Firemen; how it shall be apportioned and to make any necessary regulations.

Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for purchase of new hose for Fire Dept. and if so what amount.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for snow removal from Village streets and potato houses during winter of 1941-1942.

Art. 24. To see what action the Town will take regarding Snow removal from roads during winter 1941-1942.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purchase of Snow Fence.

Art. 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$198.00 for the 1941 maintenance of improved sections of third class roads, or to be used in conjunction with the State apportionment for the construction of Third Class Roads.

Art. 27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer under the direction of the Selectmen for such sums as the Selectmen shall see fit to accept therefore, to sell and convey all right, title and interest in, and to such parcels of land which have been forfeited to the Town for non-payment of taxes.

Art. 28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to bring writs of entry for the recovery and possession of such lands (parcels) as have been conveyed to the Town for non-payment of taxes and time of redemption having expired.

Art. 29. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Superintending School Committee to make arrangements with the Trustees of B. C. A. for the tuition of High School students.

Art. 30. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the upkeep of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.

Art. 31. To see what sum of money the Town will

vote to raise for Aid of Dependent Children (Mother's Aid).

Art. 32. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to issue Pool Table Licenses for the ensuing year.

Art. 33. To see what action the Town will vote to take regarding closing of Collins street from Ray Parks line to Mrs. Georgie Randall buildings.

Art. 34. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of One Thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the Town's share of Old Age Assistance.

Art. 35. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make some arrangement for providing a public dump.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,000. for school furniture.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to close the Boundary school indefinitely.

Art. 38. To transact any other Town business that may come before the Town.

The Selectmen give notice that they have posted a corrected list of voters of the Town of Bridgewater as required by law.
