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**TOWN OF NEW GLOUCESTER
MINUTES OF ANNUAL TOWN MEETING
May 1, 2006**

The Town Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Town Clerk, Rosemary E. Kulow.

*The Clerk asked those in attendance to turn off **cell phone** ringers and to refrain from using cell phones indoors during the meeting.*

*The Clerk led the town meeting attendees in the **Pledge of Allegiance**.*

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Nomination of: Donald Libby

Nomination by: Beverly Cadigan

Seconded by: Nancy Wilcox

No other nominations were made.

Those in favor of closing nominations: all

Opposed: none

Nomination of Donald Libby carried.

3 votes were cast for Donald Libby. Donald Libby was elected Moderator.

The Clerk administered the Oath of Office to the Moderator.

Article 30. (Taken out of order) To see if the Town will vote to participate in the Cumberland County housing and community development programs of the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development, including but not limited to the Community Development Block Grant program (CDBG) and the HOME program; to designate its population to be included in the calculation of Cumberland County's funds by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to execute an agreement with Cumberland County to formalize the same, provided however, that if the sum total of any or all of the programs require the Town to spend in excess of \$1,000, such expenditure requires Town approval.

Motion: Mr. Libby moved to take this article out of order. The motion was seconded and it passed unanimously.

Motion: Mr. Libby moved and Ms. Wilcox seconded a motion to allow Nancy Forrester representing Cumberland County to speak. The motion passed unanimously.
