STATE OF MAINE

To J. H. LURVEY, one of the Constables of the Town of Island Falls in said County and State:

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Island Falls, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs to assemble at Pettingill's Hall in said Island Falls on March 16th, 1925, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following articles to wit:

First: To elect a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Second: To elect a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Third: To see if the town will vote to elect a Road Commissioner, or leave his appointment with the Selectmen.

Fourth: To elect three Selectmen and other necessary Town Officers.

Fifth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of roads and bridges.

Sixth: To see if the Town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the Town to State Aid as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25 of the R. S. of 1916.

Seventh: To see if the Town will appropriate and

raise the sum of \$533.00 for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of the ways, highways and bridges; the above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Sec. 18, Chap. 25 of the R. S. of 1916.

Eighth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of poor.

Ninth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for payment upon Town Debt.

Tenth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for interest upon Town Debt.

Eleventh: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Town officers' salaries and incidental expenses of the Town.

Twelfth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of common schools.

Thirteenth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of High School.

Fourteenth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Industrial Education.

Fifteenth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Insurance, apparatus and supplies.

Sixteenth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Text Books.

Seventeenth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for repairs of school houses.

Eighteenth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Memorial Day and to appoint a committee to expend the same.

Nineteenth: To see if the Town will vote to fix a time when taxes shall be due and payable, and to see if the Town will vote to make any discount upon taxes paid on or before said date, and if so, what discount shall be allowed. Also to see if the Town will vote to charge interest after such date as it may vote, and fix the rate therefor.

Twentieth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for abatements and discounts.

Twenty-first: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Overseers of Poor to purchase a farm, and necessary furnishings and fixtures, to support the poor thereon. And to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for that purpose.

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Twenty-second: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen for the purpose of buying a Town Farm and the furnishings and fixtures thereof, to issue notes of the Town, for such sum as may be necessary to carry out said purpose, and to authorize the Selectmen to fix the form, date of maturity, interest, and to negotiate the same.

Twenty-third: To see what sum of money the Town will note to raise for Mothers' Aid, and to elect a lady member of the Board of Mothers' Aid, to aid in conjunction with the Overseers of Poor in administering said fund.

Twenty-fourth: To see if the Town will vote to accept the list of Jurors as vrepared by the Town Clerk, Selectmen and Town Treasurer.

Twenty-fifth: To see if the Town will vote to ratify and confirm two notes of \$3,000.00 each now held by the Katahdin Trust Company, the proceeds thereof being used for the payment of the debts of the town.

Twenty-sixth: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to hire money in anticipation of the collection of taxes for year 1925, for the purpose of payin'g the debts of the Town, and to issue notes therefor, signed by the Selectmen and Town Treasurer, and they are hereby authorized to fix the maturity, rate or interest, and form of said notes.

. Twenty-seventh: To see if the Town will vote to

ratify the doings of the Selectmen in abating certain taxes as appears in the Town report.

Twenty-eighth: To see if the Town will vote to accept the Town Report as printed.

Twenty-ninth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for hydrant rentals.

Thirtieth: To see what sum of money the Town will vote for Street Lighting.

Thirty-first: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for oil to use on the streets.

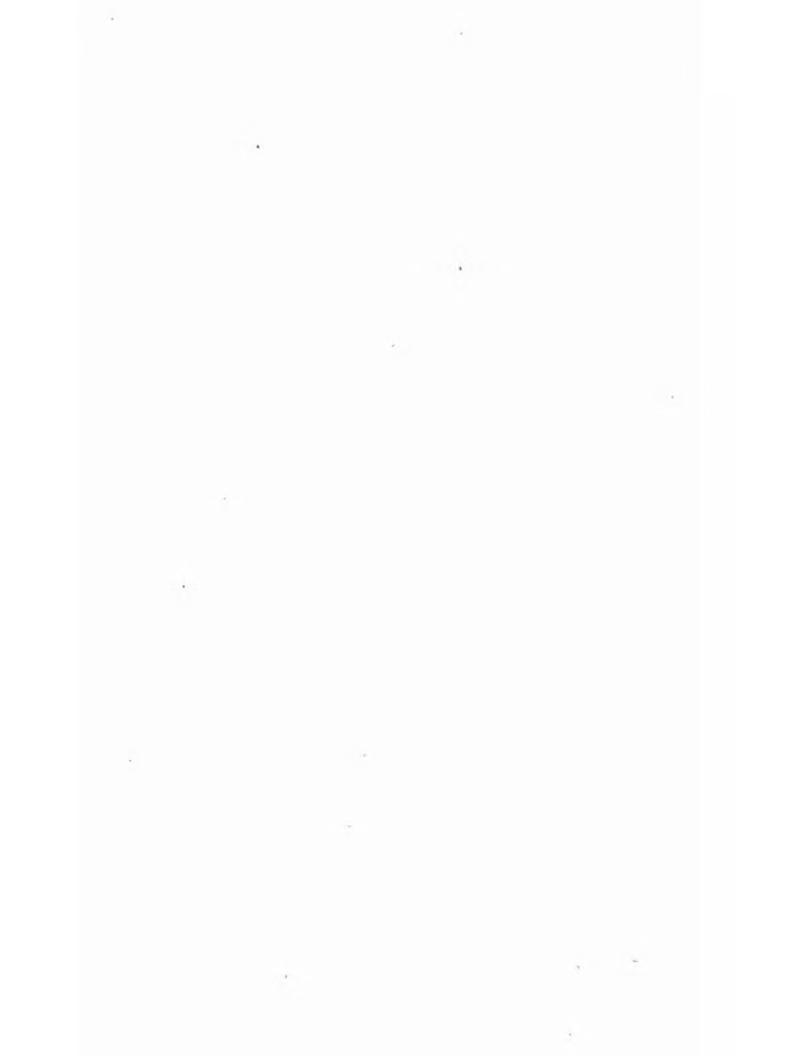
Thirty-second: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for School Physician.

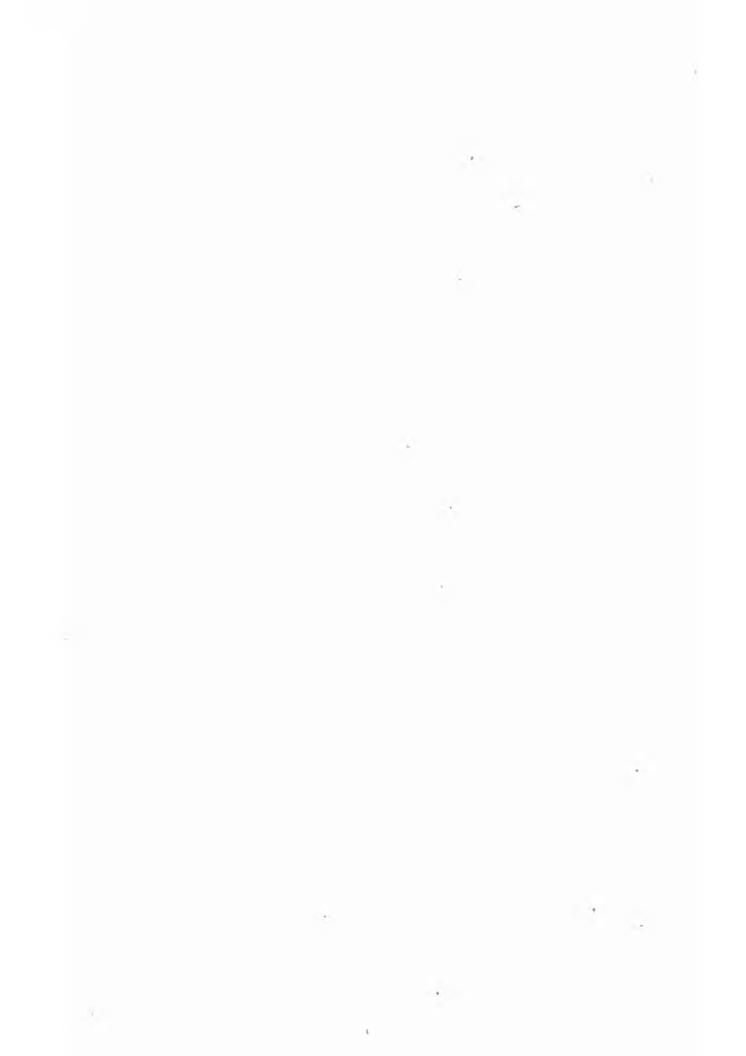
Thirty-three: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for care of cemeteries.
