## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Committee and Citizens of Island Falls:

Herewith is submitted my third annual report of the state of the public schools of Island Falls, together with details concerning our enrollment and the personnel that makes up our teaching force.

### Finances

School costs have risen during the past year, very largely due to the NRA codes greatly increasing the cost of text books and supplies. In the total expenditure for Common Schools, High Schools and Text and Supplies there is an increase of \$794.97 over last year. In 1934, however, we spent \$1194.65 for texts and supplies, while this year we spent \$1818.66. This increase in the cost of supplies and text books amounts to \$724.01 which gives as an increase in the other school accounts but \$70.96 above last year's total and we are now paying an additional teacher.

### Common Schools

A great improvement was made in the common schools this year by the addition of a new teacher to handle the extra pupils of grade five. Mary Jane Schurman has taken this surplus group and as a result this group of 21 fifth grade children are now making definite progress. Heretofore this group had been mixed in an enrollment of 58 under one teacher and was not making satisfactory progress.

Attendance this year has been poor. First we were handicapped by a serious outbreak of measles. Almost without exception, all children who had not previously had the measles were taken ill with the disease. Following this

outbreak the weather began to get in its work and three full days time was lost through blocked roads. This passed and we are, as this is written, in the hands of a spell of grip which seems to affect the children. Much of this lost time will be made up, but the routine and plans of the teachers have been badly disrupted by the combination of these conditions.

### High School

The final step in the Social Science course of study was taken this year and Island Falls High now offers a four year course of study in the methods and history of self government among the American people. This course embraces government, living with others, personal finances and is one of the finest of courses for those pupils who will not have a chance to study these things in more advanced schools.

Athletics in the high school during the past year have been unusually successful from the viewpoint of games won and interest shown. The basketball team is a fine one and won all but two of the twenty games played. The playoff with Limestone at Houlton for the chance to represent the smaller schools at the Aroostook tournament at Caribou was the most thrilling game seen for years. Limestone finally won the game by a single point during the final seconds of play.

### Health Program

The annual inspection of the school children by Dr. Swett was given during the early Spring and the inspection cards were brought up to date. During the summer the tonsil clinic was held at which time nine cases were corrected by the doctor. During the measles epidemic and the influx of colds and grip, Dr. Swett visited the schools

three times and carefully checked up on those children who were reported as absent. During the height of the illness, each pupil who was out of school for more than one-half day, was required to present a health certificate from the school physician before re-admission to school. The present ruling is that absences of more than two days, shall present the health certificate before re-admission. This is accomplishing much good in the matter of protecting the well children in the schools.

The ERA and citizens of the town have donated foodstuffs for the hot noonday lunches for the dinner pupils and the teachers have willingly assumed the care for the preparation of these hot dishes during the Winter Term.

The teachers have kept up the practice of monthly weighing of all pupils and any serious variations from normal are referred to Dr. Swett.

### The Teaching Personel

Questions asked during the past year suggest the following outline of the experience, training and salaries of our teaching force. Listed below will be found all details of the faculties in Island Falls:

Grade II. Mrs. Gladness B. Webber of Island Falls. Five summer sessions at ASNS, Castine, and Gorham; Seventeenth year of teaching all but part of one of which have been in Island Falls. Annual salary \$544.00.

Grade III. Miss Gemma M. Maynard of Island Falls. Graduate of ASNS at Presque Isle. Tenth year of teaching the last five of which have been in Island Falls. Annual Salary \$544.00.

Grade IV. Miss Marion V. MacKenzie of Island Falls. Graduate of Castine Normal. Eighth year of experience all of which have been at Island Falls. Annual salary \$544.00.

Grade V. Mrs. Elsie P. Appleby of Island Falls. One year at Machias Normal. Two summer sessions at Gorham and Presque Isle. Seventeenth year of experience the last 13 of which have been in Island Falls. Grade Principal.

GradeVB. Miss Mary Jane Schurman. Graduate of ASNS at Presque Isle. First year's experience. Annual salary \$360.00.

Grade VI. Ferne C. Webb of Patten. Graduate of Castine. Twenty-first year's teaching the last five of which have been in Island Falls. Annual Salary \$544.00.

#### Junior-Senior High School

Amelia Bliss of Island Falls. Acadia University B. A. degree; Colby College 2 years. Third year of experience all at Island Falls. Subjects: Social Sciences. Annual Salary \$630.00.

Isabelle D. Fairbanks of Houlton. Graduate of Colby, A. B. Degree. Second year of experience at Island Falls. Subjects: Junior High Mathematics and French. Annual salary \$630.00.

Lyndell E. Smith of Brewer. ASNS at Presque Isle; University of Maine, B. A. Degree. Fifth year of experience, the last four of which have been in Island Falls. Subject: English. Annual salary \$860.00.

F. Reginald Cough of Bar Harbor. Holy Cross College, B. A. Degree. Fifth year of experience at Island Falls. Subjects: Latin and History. Annual salary \$1150.00.

John W. Abbott of Presque Isle. Graduate of Bates, B. A. Degree. Eighth year of experience the last four of which have been in Island Falls. Subjects: Mathematics and Sciences and Principalship. Annual Salary \$1800.

Harry E. Lewin of Island Falls. Graduate of Colby, A. B. Degree, Harvard University summer school; Fourteen years of experience the last three of which have been in Island Falls school union as Superintendent. Annual salary from Island Falls \$500.46. Total Annual Salary \$1900.00 and \$500 for travel allowance.

### The Student Body

There is considerable interest as to the numbers of the pupils in the various grades in Island Falls and these figures are herewith presented in tabular form.

### Costs Per Pupil

There are 316 pupils in the common schools. We paid out for common school support, including text books

and supplies the sum of \$7,321.34 so that the cost per pupil is \$23.10 per pupil per year.

There are 134 pupils in the upper four years of high school and we paid out for the high school and high school text and supplies the sum of \$5947.60 so that each pupil enrolled in the high school cost the town \$44.38 for the school year.

The averages over the state on the basis of enrollment and costs, the figures used above, are as follows: Common school cost is \$39.99 per pupil; while the high school state wide cost per pupil is \$66.72.

A detailed statement of all expenditures follows so in conclusion I wish to express my thanks for the loyal support the town has given the schools and all the people connected with school work.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for payment of principal of Town debt.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for interest on Town debt.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money for and in behalf of the Town to pay the debts of the Town in anticipation of taxes, and to renew notes given for money borrowed heretofore, not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$18,000.00; Also to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to sign notes or any other necessary evidence of said indebtedness, and deliver the same for and in behalf of the Town for the purpose aforesaid.
